There is nothing doubtful about Stanley W. Turner's claims relative to the senatorial canvass. He declares in good set terms, in good round terms, that Mr. Ferry will be elected the next United States senator from Michigan.

The latest news from Vermont, where the gubernatorial election did not fill the executive office, owing to the failure of either Republican candidate to receive a majority of the votes, is that Mr. Clement, the independent Republican candidate, concedes the election in the state legislature of the regular nominee, General McCullough.

The action of the state convention at Grand Rapids Thursday in endorsing General Alger's candidacy for the senate, in face of the utmost efforts of the Ferry men to prevent the convention's taking cognizance of the matter at all will serve to convince people skeptical of the general's strength that he is a likely factor in the contest.

Rapid convention was rather anticipated and occasioned little real surprise. The closeness of the vote on the question of whether the senatorial canvass should receive any consideration serves unmistakably to indicate that both prominent candidates are strongly supported.

The diversification of industries in the south goes bravely on, to the benefit of that region and of the country at large. The Chattanooga Tradesman has issued bulletins covering the states of Alabama, Arkansas, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia and West Virginia.
