TO RELIEVE NEED

NEW BENEVOLENT SOCIETY WILL DOUBTLESS BE ORGANIZED.

MEETING HELD THURSDAY NIGHT

COMMITTEE WILL PLAN DETAILS OF PROPOSED ASSOCIATION.

Mrs. Northrup Presented Report on Activities of Ladies' Society—It Supports the Latest Movement.

The project of organizing a new association for the direction of benevolent work in Marquette was discussed at a meeting held at the Presbyterian church Thursday evening.

Beyond discussing the matter in its general aspects and deciding to go ahead with the proposed organization, little of a definite nature was accomplished.

The task of planning the association and outlining its objects and aims was left to a committee to be named by the Rev. J. M. Rogers, who was designated chairman.

Those who are interested in the formation of a new benevolent association have the hearty support of the Ladies' Benevolent society, which has done such excellent work in the alleviation of need here during the past dozen years.

Mrs. Northrup's Report. The suggestion of an association for charitable work was made at a Sunday school meeting in Dr. Bonar's parlor, Jan. 3 1891.

Jan. 12 a meeting was held at the Baptist church, at which it was decided to organize such a society, and a week following a constitution was adopted, the organization being named "The Ladies' Benevolent Society."

The largest membership was that of the first year, it consisting of forty-four active and eight honorary members.

During these twelve years we have received in money \$3,393.37, \$250 of which was derived from sales of articles made by women who were paid in clothing.

Since 1897 the policy of the society has been to require payment of some description for articles disposed of, and a considerable industry in rag carpets and kitchen aprons was built up.

Varied Activities. For three years the accounts were kept with the women individually, but they made such bulky mass of papers that, at the last meeting, it was decided

to make a bonfire of the books, no one having time or inclination to add up the items. During the last three years we have advertised rummage sales and the money derived from these has paid our various bills.

"We have paid for nurses, hospital care, have bought fuel, provisions, paid house rent, and never to return, and have purchased flannels and innumerable shoes.

"It was decided at the initial meeting to organize a sewing school. This, for the first three years, was supported by the society, but since that time it has been taken care of itself, and its cost does not appear in this statement.

"The directors wish to state that they desire that this meeting result in the promotion of a new society, to which they will give their most cordial support.

"The old organization will administer the small amount of money on hand, the most of it being already pledged.
