BOER DEMANDS REFUSED.

Address from Burgers Criticized by Secretary Chamberlain.

Pretoria, Transvaal, Jan. 8.—Secretary Chamberlain, replying today to the address of the burghers, said the terms already granted were decidedly generous and that there was no prospect of general amnesty. He declared that the government purposed abiding by the terms of the Vereeniging agreement. The cases of the burghers now in Europe would be considered individually on their merits, said he, and these burghers should prove their loyalty by accounting for the gold taken to Europe. The secretary also said that the annexation of the Vryheid and Utrecht districts to Natal was irrevocable and the natives would be compelled to observe their obligations. He declared he would have been better pleased had the address of the burghers, instead of consisting merely of demands, contained some recognition of what his majesty's government had already done for the Boers.

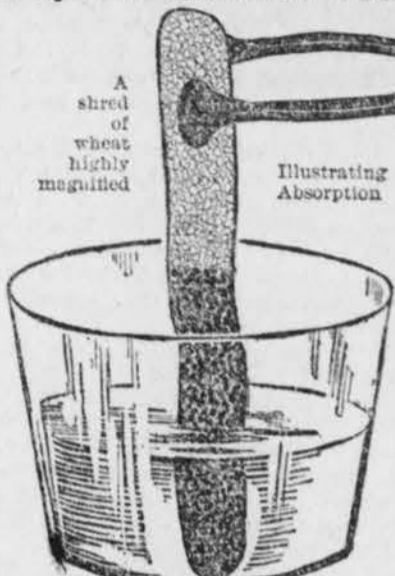

MARQUETTE PRISON WILL HAVE \$14,430 BEYOND MAINTENANCE.

NEW BARN TO BE BUILT FOR \$7,000

INSTITUTION WAS FORTUNATE IN NOT BEING SCALED DOWN.

Board of Corrections and Charities Approved \$1,698,250.39 of These Appropriations, Cutting Off \$405,609.50.

Officers of the Marquette branch of state prison are greatly pleased with the information that the state board of corrections and charities has approved their request for a special appropriation of \$14,430 for the years 1903-4.

About \$7,000 of the special appropriation is desired for the erection of a barn to replace the present structure, which has done service since the prison was first built and which is now inadequate for the proper handling of stock, conveyances and farm equipment.

The approval of the special appropriation by the board of corrections and charities practically assures favorable action by the legislature and there is no doubt that it will be voted in due time.

About \$3,000 of the \$14,430 is needed for repairs to the present prison plant.

The remainder of the money will be used in supplying minor needs and making small, but important, improvements.

Specials total \$1,698,250.39.

The report of the board of correction and charities shows that requests for a total of \$1,698,250.39 of special appropriations have been approved.

The Marquette Normal asks no special appropriation for the ensuing two years. The appropriation for its maintenance will be \$75,790.

The good fortune of the local prison in being allowed the total of its requested special appropriation appears when

the fact is noted that it is one of the six institutions whose appropriations were not scaled down by the board of corrections and charities. The other institutions that received what they asked for were: The Michigan asylum for the insane, Kalamazoo, \$68,875.79; State Asylum for the insane, Ionia, \$12,250.50; the State Public School, Colfax, \$89,312.39; School for the Blind, Lansing, \$80,392; and the Michigan Soldiers' Home at Grand Rapids, \$280,250, this last being far the largest of the special appropriations.

The Jackson state prison asked for \$318,935 and was scaled down to \$171,415. The amounts of the requested appropriations and the amounts allowed, for other state institutions, are as follows:

Eastern Michigan Asylum for the insane, Pontiac, \$47,150-\$27,150; Northern Michigan Asylum for the insane, Traverse City, \$31,910-\$59,000; U. P. Hospital for the insane, Newberry, \$187,500-\$79,075; Michigan Reformatory, Ionia, \$12,325-\$9,900; Industrial school, Lansing, \$13,800-\$13,600; Industrial school for girls, Adrian, total, maintenance and special, \$14,500, \$154,478.50-\$138,800; School for the Deaf, Flint, \$35,500-\$17,200 and Home for Feeble Minded and Epileptic, Lapeer, \$199,900-\$85,411.
