THREAT MADE BY GERMANY TO PUBLISH CORRESPONDENCE.

Details of Settlement With Venezuela Not Yet All Arranged, but It Is Likely Belgium Will Administer the Customs.

Washington, Jan. 28 .- From the highest authority it is learned tonight that the publication by the London foreign office of the fact that Great Britain, and not Germany, sought an alliaboutance against Venezuela, was brought about by representations from the German foreign office. It is said that Germany had threatened to publish the diplomatic exchanges between the German and British foreign offices unless Great Britain immediately should bear the responsibility for the alliance. This threat was induced by the anti-German feeling aroused in the United States by the events in Venezuelan waters.
