James Leary, of Hancock, died yesterday afternoon. He had been ailing for an extended period. He is survived by wife and five children.

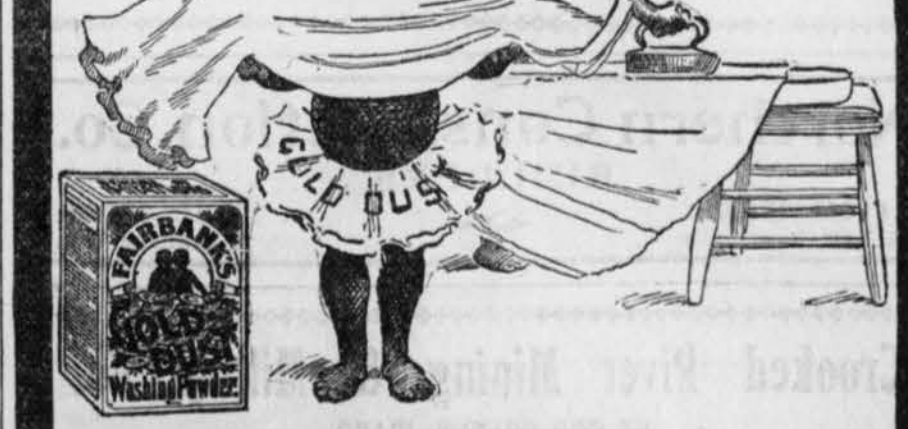

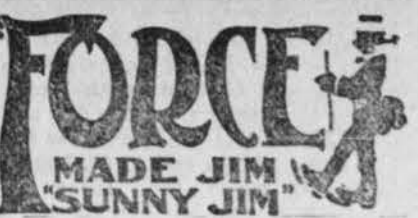

TO SUBPOENA THEM

LAND OFFICERS CAN NOW MAKE WITNESSES TOE THE MARK.

NEW LAW IS A VAST IMPROVEMENT

PUNISHMENT PROVIDED FOR THOSE WHO IGNORE SUMMONS.

Previous to This Time Parties Whose Testimony Was Wanted Had to Be Coaxed to Attend the Hearings.

The register and receiver of the Marquette land office have just received official notice of the passage by the last congress of an act entitled "An act providing for the compulsory attendance of witnesses before registers and receivers." This act, which is now operative, will greatly simplify and facilitate land office administration throughout the country by giving to the officers the right to subpoena any witnesses of whom they are in need to get testimony in cases they may have under advisement. Heretofore there has been no way of compelling the attendance of such witnesses, and the ability of the parties to the contests, or the land office officers, to wheedle or coax them into attending to give testimony has had to be relied on to get any results. The new law provides that the fees and mileage for subpoenaed witnesses shall be the same as those provided by law in the district courts of the United States in the district in which the land officers are situated. In this district the allowance will be for each witness \$1.50 a day and ten cents a mile. The witness shall receive his mileage and one day's fee in advance, and if detained over one day shall receive each additional day's fee in advance.

Neglect or refusal to appear as a witness when properly subpoenaed is to be punished by indictment in the district court of the United States or in the district courts of the territories, the punishment for such offense, upon conviction, to be a fine of not more than \$200 or imprisonment to exceed not more than ninety days, or both, at the discretion of the court.

In the case of witnesses residing outside of the county in which the hearing occurs any party to the proceeding may take the testimony of such witness in the county of the witness' residence in the form of a deposition by giving ten days' notice of the time and place of taking such depositions to the opposite party or parties. Failure to obey the subpoenas in the matter of these depositions shall be punishable in the same manner and in the same degree as failure to obey a subpoena for personal appearance for testimony before the land office officers. Provision is made for securing this right of taking depositions for both parties to any contest. In the matter of depositions the person or persons making them are entitled to the same mileage and fees that are allowed the witnesses who make their testimony in person.

The names of all persons failing to properly reply to subpoenas are to be turned over to the United States district attorney, by him to be vigorously prosecuted.

Relative to the new procedure the commissioner, W. A. Richards, says: "The object and purpose of this act is to afford litigants the means of enforcing the attendance of witnesses when hearings are ordered. It is not

exclusive in its operation to the extent of abolishing the existing method, under the rules, by which the attendance of witnesses may be secured or their testimony taken by deposition; and parties may elect to use either method of procedure. But should they think proper to proceed under the existing rules of practice and fail to secure the attendance of their witnesses, they will not be entitled to a continuance, as heretofore."

James Clancy, and son, Charles Kruse of Ishpeming and Mark Elliott of Palmer were Marquette visitors yesterday.

A force of masons are engaged on brick work at the site of the new court house. Other work is about to be taken up.

Miss Anna M. Chandler of Escanaba has been in the city the past two days, spending part of her Easter vacation here.

There was no observance of Good Friday here yesterday by the suspension of business. Everything went on as usual.

Rev. E. A. Elliott will deliver an address on "Thomas Jefferson, the Apostle of Democracy," at the Methodist church Sunday evening.

The council will next meet Monday evening, the 20th. The third Monday in April is the appointed date for the assembling of the new council.

The Easter sale at the Baptist church today will open at 10 o'clock this morning in the Sunday school room. All articles are to be handed in by nine.

The funeral of Andrew Johnson was held yesterday afternoon from the Swedish Lutheran church. It was largely attended, the A. O. U. W. and the Swedish Crown societies being present in a body.

Street Commissioner French has worked a small force of men about the streets the past few days. They have been gathering the mud that was removed from the catchbasins at an earlier date.

There was a row in the Finnish saloon on Third street, just below Washington, yesterday afternoon. One fellow was cut somewhat. His assailant will not likely be held for trial in justice court.

John W. Burrows has sold to Elizabeth Cooke lot No. 13 of Adams addition, the consideration being \$2,200. This is the property Mr. Burrows occupied before leaving for Duluth. It is situated on North Front street.

The steamer Maruba cleared from Escanaba Wednesday with a cargo of ore for Buffalo. Other craft are in that port and are now being loaded, the season there being in full swing. It is said that an ore carrier will arrive here today.

Walter Prickett, of Sidnaw, has obtained an option on 33,000 acres of out-crover land in Iron and Baraga counties from the Menominee Lumber company. It is said Mr. Prickett paid \$10,000 down for the option, and if this is true the deal is likely to go through.

Captain H. H. Parsons of the ore carrier Choelaw, which wintered here, is in Marquette, ready to take his command out whenever he receives orders. It is not probable that the first sailing of any of the boats that have wintered here will occur before a week from Monday. The firemen's strike is still on.

Special fish car No. 2, of the United States fish commission, is here in charge of Captain Johnson, of the commission. It carries half a million lake trout

which will be planted in this vicinity. This is a large and important planting and it will be made with great care. From the hatchery at the Soo are to be distributed this year in Lakes Superior, Michigan, Huron and in St. Mary's river 35,000,000 white fish. Later 4,500,000 lake trout will be distributed around Lake Huron and Lake Superior.

Yesterday was another genuine spring day. The streets were drying up quickly and some impression was made on the remaining snow on the outskirts of the city. Driving out towards Presque Isle is now good, but it is still impossible to get around that resort with any degree of comfort. The roads are covered with snow, water and mud.

Despite the fact that it was Good Friday, a good house was present at the theater last evening to see S. Kent Miller's production of "The Cowboy and the Lady." It gave good satisfaction. The company was up to the standard of that which presented the play last season. Mr. Miller's reception in the leading role was warm, his work being generally commended.

The bill for another state normal school, to be located somewhere in western Michigan, has been favorably reported by the senate committee on education. It calls for an appropriation of \$40,000. Grand Rapids, Muskegon, Kalamazoo, Three Rivers, Holland and Allegan are bidding for it. The state board of education will make the selection.

Contractor Sinclair is looking after the work of replacing the floor in the chapel at the branch of state prison. The joists were so badly rotted out that it was unsafe to allow the men to congregate in the chapel until they had been entirely replaced. The legislature made a special appropriation for the work, which is now in progress. It will be a couple of weeks in completion, and will cost over \$1,000.

County Clerk Ross has been busy the past three days tabulating all the contagious disease accounts that the county has paid during the past five years. There are hundreds of them. They will be turned over to the prosecuting attorney, who has been instructed by the supervisors to proceed with the collection of as many of the number as there is any chance of getting settlements for.

For the accommodation of the Marquette people who desire to attend the Easter Monday ball at Ishpeming, given under the auspices of the Light Guard, a special train will be run over the South Shore road, leaving at 8 o'clock. The return trip will be made on the early morning train leaving Ishpeming at 4 o'clock. The railroad tickets will be fifty cents each. Among those from Marquette who will attend the ball will be a large delegation of Light Infantry members.
