WARSHIP SHELLS CITY OF PANAMA CONSUL EHRMAN REPORTS A BOMBARDMENT IN WHICH ELEVEN PERSONS ARE KILLED.

IS INSTRUCTED TO PROTEST IF NOT SUFFICIENT THE BOSTON WILL TAKE A HAND. Is Great Activity in Naval Department at Washington, and at Colon Blue-jackets Are Landed to Give Protection to Foreigners.

Washington, Nov. 4.—Consul Ehrman, at Panama, cables the state department today that the Colombian government warship Bogota is shelling the city. Eleven Chinamen have been killed.

Revolts Long Pending. Colon, Nov. 4.—Without firing a shot and amid scenes of great enthusiasm, the independence of the isthmus and the department of Panama was declared last evening.

Blowjackets Are Landed. Colon, Nov. 4.—General Cuadros, prefect of Colon, and the senior officer commanding the troops which arrived yesterday on the gunboat Cartagena from Savannah are maintaining their position of refusing to acknowledge the authority of the provisional government of Panama.

Tokio, Nov. 4.—Reports from Peking say that Russia now threatens to assume sole charge of the government of Manchuria unless China promptly dismisses Yuen, the taotai of Mukden, and decapitates another mandarin who recently punished disorderly Chinese bandits in Russian employ.

DODGE THE BLAME. Big Four Officials Say Crew of the Special Caused the Wreck, but This the Employes Deny.

Indianapolis, Ind., Nov. 4.—"I do not intend that anyone shall be made a scapegoat to bear the responsibility for the frightful wreck on the Big Four Saturday," said Coroner Tutewiler tonight.

Officials and Employes Differ. The sworn statements of the men in charge of the special and of the coal cars show a condition of affairs diametrically opposite to that indicated by General Superintendent J. O. Van Winkle and Superintendent Charles A. Paquette of the Chicago division of the Big Four, who placed the blame on the crew of the special train.

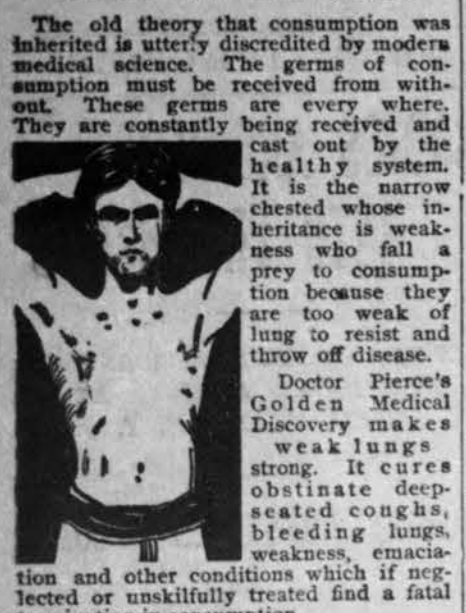
EARTHQUAKE TO THE SOUTH. Memphis, St. Louis and Surrounding Territory Feel a Series of Shocks.

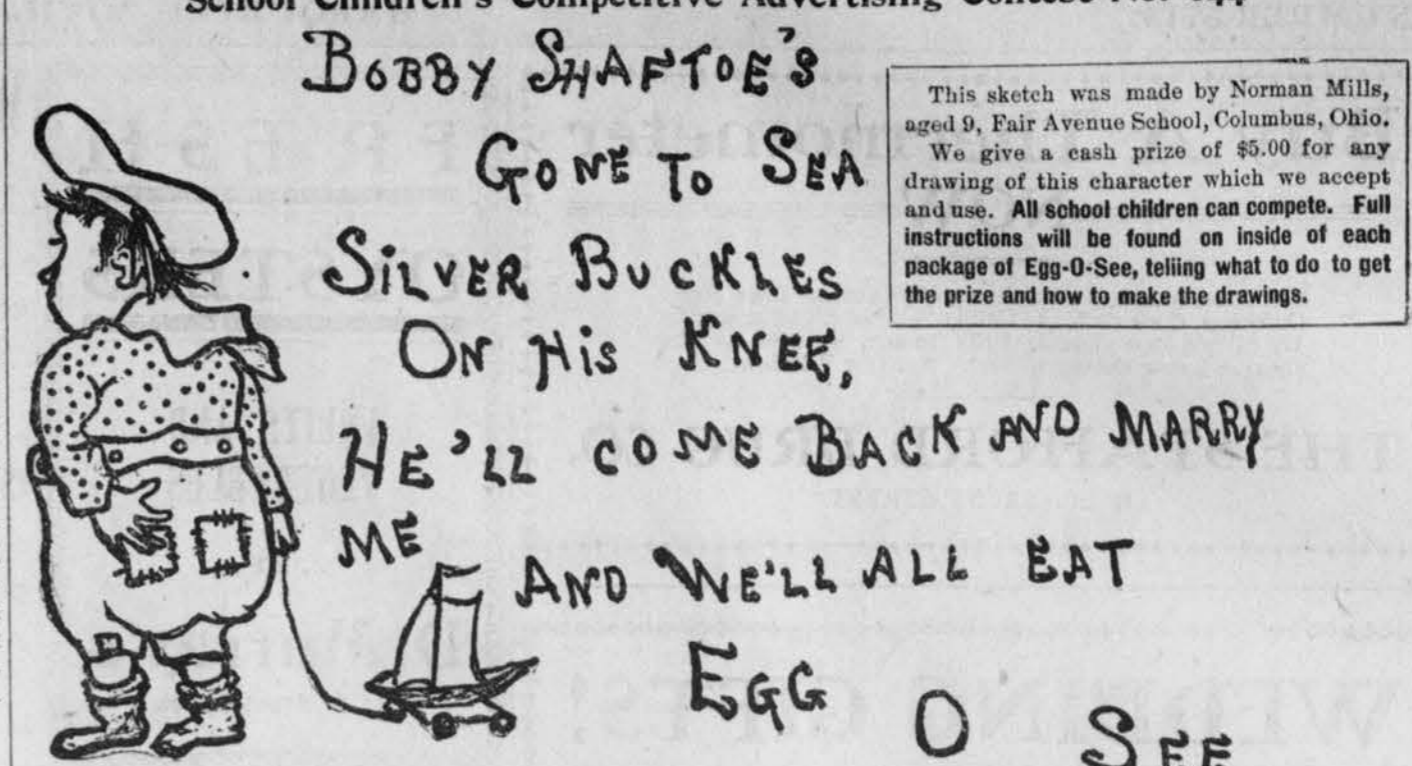
