FORMER SECRETARY OF THE NAVY EXPIRES AFTER BUT A FEW DAYS' ILLNESS.

Alarming Change for Worse Led to Hasty Preparations for Second Operation for Appendicitis, but Death Quickly Followed.

New York, Feb. 2.-William Collins Whitney, former secretary of the navy, One Hundred Settlers Butchered in Gerdied a few minutes after four this afternoon while under the influence of ether administered preparatory to a second operation for appendicitis. By his bedside were his son, Harry Vane Whitney, and his daughter, Dorothy Whitney, as well as Dr. Wm. T. Bull, chief surgeon in attendance. The deceased was in his sixty-fourth year.

Mr. Whitney was taken ill Friday night while at the Metropolitan Opera House and had to leave before the opera was ended. Dr. James, the family physician, was summoned and found the condition of the patient such that after a consultation an operation was decided upon and was performed by Dr. Bull. The patient rallied so well that it was fully believed he would recover. Mr. Whitney's condition was very grave, however, on Sunday and Monday, and at a consultation this afternoon a operation was decided upon.

A bulletin issued this morning stated that there had been a slight improvement in the patient's condition, but placed under the influence of ether, but to sea at a moment's notice. patient, but to no avail.




