Error in Information Let Him Off on Serious Charge—Motion to Quash in Murray Case Overruled.

In circuit court yesterday afternoon a start was made with the trial of Dominick Papa, accused of the murder of Mike Savant, at Ishpeming Nov. 1. The drawing of the jury was the first thing taken up by the court after dinner.

Papa has been confined at the county jail since the killing. He is not a bad looking man. W. T. Potter will be assisted in his defense by M. H. Crocker.

Dr. Hercules N. Meloche has escaped, for the time being at least, the most serious charge on which he was held to the present term of circuit court.

D. H. Ball, attorney for Fred Murray in the case arising from his alleged negligent killing of David Pickett, moved to have the proceedings quashed, on the ground that the statute under which they have been brought is unconstitutional.
