Mining News. (Continued from Page Two.) monthly, in official statistical statements which are made public. A careful investigation of stocks in Germany repudiates the claim of accumulation there, and according to best advice no copper is carried at German seaports which is the only place where copper could be accumulated without being generally known. AMYGDALOID VS CONGLOMERATES. The claim has been advanced that an amygdaloid copper belt yielding twenty pounds refined copper to the ton of rock will return as much net earnings as a conglomerate formation yielding thirty pounds. There is much to support this contention. The conglomerate workings require extensive timbering, as evidenced from the fact that the Calumet & Hecla mine is a veritable forest. The difference in costs is also reflected in the drill operations. The Calumet & Hecla operates about 225 drills and stamps approximately 5,800 tons daily, while the Wolverine has a total of twenty-seven drills in commission and supplies daily rock shipments aggregating 1,850 tons. The Wolverine stamps, two in number, treat the above output, while it is probable that 400 tons per stamp would be their maximum capacity if treating conglomerate rock. The life of a stamp shoe engaged in crushing Franklin conglomerate rock is less than three days, whereas some of the shoes at the amygdaloid mills render service for the greater portion of a month. From the standpoint of operating costs, the amygdaloid producers possess a decided advantage both in the matter of mining and milling. Some mining companies estimate the cost of each drill in commission at \$1,000 per month, this including all charges, including taxes and insurance. ATLANTIC. Around 15 Atlantic is selling at a higher price than it has touched during the last two years and at more than double its low price of this year, which was 7, made last February. The Atlantic produced five and a half million pounds of copper in 1903 and this year's production will run ahead of these figures. Atlantic produces its copper at a low cost per pound and on the present price of the metal is declared to be earning dividends for its stockholders of at least \$2 a share. Atlantic has been off the dividend list since 1900, but should resume such payments next year. The present buying of the stock is based on the fact that whatever Isle Royale finds on the sections it is now exploring will be found as well on the Atlantic and that the discovery will prove even more valuable to the Atlantic because it has fewer shares and because its market value today is \$1,500,000, while Isle Royale is valued at \$3,000,000. LAKE SUPERIOR & PITTSBURG. The home office of the Lake Superior & Pittsburg at Calumet has been notified that the work of enlarging No. 2 shaft to prepare it for a large and steady production has been stopped. The shaft, which has now only one and one-half compartments, operating with one skip, will be enlarged to a three and one-half compartment to operate with two skips. The work will take five or six months to complete. OSCEOLA. It is authoritatively stated that the Osceola mill will be re-equipped though not with steep compound stamps, as quickly as the change can be brought about. One of these stamps has already been installed, and has shown a capacity of 700 tons daily. Six more are required to equip the mill throughout. The cost one of these stamps is about \$8,500.
