NEW TRAIN PUT ON. C., M. & St. P. Now Has Three Running Into the Upper Peninsula.

Coincident with the adoption of the new three-cent fare law in the upper peninsula, in accordance with recently enacted legislation, the Chicago, Milwaukee & St. Paul railway has put in operation a new train into the copper country. This train enters over the Copper Range tracks and will arrive in Houghton daily at noon, leaving again at 4:05 p. m.
