AMERICAN PEOPLE ROBBERING THE COW

IS THE REASON GIVEN BY F. H. VANDENBOOM FOR HIGH PRICE OF DAIRY PRODUCTS.

HOW SUPPLY IS REGULATED

Development of Cold Storage Industry Results in More Uniform Prices Than in Times Past.

"The American people are robbing the cow," was the remarkable statement made by F. H. Vandebloom in answer to a question as to the reason for the continued high price of butter and other dairy products.

"The price of dairy products has not advanced in as great proportion as the price of feed for cattle," continued Mr. Vandebloom. "Then years ago cream could be bought for from \$10 to \$12 per ton, while today the price is from \$25 to \$30 per ton."

People Eating Cow Feed. "The high price of dairy products is due almost entirely to the increased cost of feed for cattle, and the increased cost of cattle feed is due to the fact that the American people are robbing the cow."

"While monopoly does to some extent affect the price of dairy products, its influence is much overrated. It is true that the price of butter is to some extent regulated by a few men on the Chicago and New York boards of trade, but this regulation is more in the line of keeping the price nearly uniform, both in summer and winter, than anything else."

How Price Is Kept Uniform. "The drop of two cents in the price of butter a few days ago was not due to an increase in the supply of fresh stock, but to some of the packers becoming frightened because of the quantity of packing stock they had on hand."

Same True of Poultry and Eggs. "The same conditions, as far as storage is concerned, control the poultry and egg market. Both fowls and eggs are stored away in refrigerators when the market is dull and brought out in limited quantities when it is active."

MASTERLY ADDRESS DELIVERED BY REV. BATES G. BURT AT THE NORMAL YESTERDAY.

"It is the most natural thing in the world for human beings to celebrate anniversaries. That is because man is a creature with a heart. Anniversaries are heart-links between the future and the past."

"When a man of religious convictions studies history, he always comes to realize the fact that in the providence of God great heroes are born from time to time raised up to serve a divine purpose. They are not always engaged in a strictly religious work, or at least not in what seems at the time to be a distinctly religious work."

Lincoln a Providential Hero. "Such a man was Abraham Lincoln. Like the prophets of old he came on a divine errand. We do not think of the great conflict of 1861 as a movement of merely political significance. We believe that the union of these states was preserved for some high and holy end."
