SUBSTITUTE FOR ORIGINAL BILL New Postal Savings Bank Measure Is Introduced by Senator Carter.

Washington, Feb. 22.-Senator Carter today presented a substitute for the original postal savings bank bill. The ubstitute creates a board of five rustees which is to exercise entire supervision of the postal saving bank sysem. This board is to consist of the postmaster general, attorney general, ecretary of the treasury and two civilians to be appointed by the president and confirmed by the senate, the civilians to receive \$10,000 a year each.
