

BATTLESHIP FLEET WELCOMED HOME

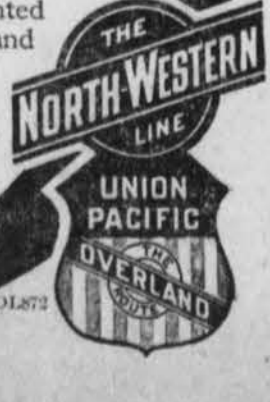
