Ecston, Feb. 26.—The long drawn-out centest between certain Lake Superio. copper mining companies in Michigan was settled today with the acquisition Misrepresented by Certain Publiby the Calimet & Heela company of a controlling interest in the Osceola Tamarack, Ahmeek, Seneca, Isle Royale and Laurian companies, formerly controlled by Albert S. Bigelow of this city Mr. Bigelow retires from the copper mining field, with which he has been identifled for many years.

The Calumet corepany secures about 125,000 shares of stock in the Bigelow companies, for which it pays \$8,000,000. This payment is to be made partly from the proceeds of the sale of about \$2, 000,000 of three and ten-year notes and partly from the surplus already in the company's treasury Some of the notes carry 4 and some 5 per cent. A block of them has been sold to a banking house and will later be offered for sale. The balance has been taken by the Bige-

"The constitution contemplates putting in the hands of the electors the power of choosing who shall make a harter for them and at the same time imposes on the legislature the duty f providing the necessary machinery chereby they may express their intention in the matter. That is the whole substance of home rule, and the anxiety of the council of Detroit to go ahead, framing up a charter would indicate that they are not such firm advocates of home rule as to trust the people en-

tirely in the matter. "The constitution intends that the people of the several cities of the state shall say whether they are satisfied with their present charters, whether they want them amended, or want new ones altogether. It comes with ill grace, then, for the aldermen of the principal ity of the state to say 'Our charter is ill right. Such amendments as we believe it needs we will submit to the

"As a matter of fact, until the necessary legislation is enacted by the legislature neither the council of Detroit nor of any other city can amend its charter by the simple expedient of submitting an amendment to the people. There is at present no law which provides for this; it is such a law which the legislature must pass, "It is our intention to take our time

with this proposition. I, for one, do not intend to be forced by Detroit or any other city hurriedly to pass a bill which would be a reflection on the legislature and later lead to criticism. The cities of the state have been crying for home rule for years; now they are going to have it. Personally I have never favored a wide measure of home rule, but the constitution provides for it and I propose that, so far as I am concerned, the cities shall have the widest scope we can give them."


