#### THE CANAL SKEPTICS.

Colonel Goethals, in charge of the work at Panama, has long had high repute a eputation as a controversialist. No satisfied with defending the lock plan he attacks the sea-level project, and shows that practically every objection urged against the one applies with ever greater force against the other. The as ertion that a sea-level canal would l better and safer than one of the lock type he declares is based on pure as

Much has been said of the possible demerits of the lock-level, particularly of the possibility of an earthquake toppling down its works. It is taken for granted that a channel from sea to ser would be practically safe. The truth is as Colonel Goethals points out, a bigger and higher dam to confine or divert the water of the Chagres river would be necessary for a sea-level projec than is necessary under the lock plan The bottom of the river bed would b ninety feet above the canal bottom, and a dam of this height and approximately a mile long would be needed. An earthquake that would wreck the locks would wreck this dam and bring down into the canal prism a flood greater than that of Johnstown. So far as the risk of earthquake is concerned one project is on a parity with the other,

But there are other special weaknesse of the sea-level plan which have been ignored. For example, practically no attention is paid to the fact that for a considerable distance the sea-level route where piles 100 feet long have failed to itself and contented over the outlook for reach bottom, and into which 500 feet of the Panama railroad suddenly sank in 1907. 





A BAN ON WINTER FISHING.

Conserve Superior Fish.

W. D. Tomlin of Duluth, secretary of the Duluth Fisheries association, has been in communication recently with the United States commission on fisheries interest. Mr. Tomlin says

"The commission in a letter states that in order to properly protect the trout and whitefish of Lake Superior fishing should be prohibited between Nov. 5 and March 1. There should be no winter fishing. Also that no nets should be allowed with a mesh smaller than 41/2 inches, and no pound nets should be used. The commission feels that under such circumstances, and with fair attention to the planting of fry every season, the fish supply of Lake Superior may be sustained indefinitely

and perhaps be increased." Mr. Tomlin has for years been an en thusiast on the subject of protecting and increasing the fish supply of Lake Superior. He says that during the past twenty-five years a billion fish fry have been planted in this lake, from all sources. He says that in his opinion the planting of fish in Lake Superior should be increased. He would like to see special attention given also to in creasing the supply of the original and genuine Lake Superior whitefish.
