### EX-MAYOR ROBERTS TO VISIT CRYSTAL FALLS

ANNUAL MEETING TONIGHT.

Finance Committee and Board of Public Works Will Submit Reports to Council.

Alfred D. J. Slone, C. T. Kruse and Will Locher, members of the finance committee of the council, are checking up the accounts of the various city departments. They started in yesterday morning, checking up the books of the treasurer, and yesterday afternoon work was started on the books in the office of the board of public works. All of the payrolls in the several departments and vouchers for all bills during the past year are being footed up and examined. The accounts of the municipal court, the cemetery board and the trustees of the public library are prepared for the meeting of the council tomorrow. The members of the committee worked the greater part of last night and they will do well if they finish their report prior to the meeting of the council at 7:30.

The finance committee's report will show in detail the receipts and expenditures in all departments during the twelve months' period. The report of the board of public works will also be complete in every respect. This report has been ready for submission to the committee for some days. The cemetery trustees examined their books and prepared their report last Saturday. The annual report of the municipal court will not be submitted to the council until the May meeting as the court's fiscal year ends the first of that month.

### CONGRESSMAN YOUNG PUTTING UP FIGHT

REPRESENTATIVE FROM TWELFTH DISTRICT OF MICHIGAN, WHO OPPOSES PLACING IRON ORE ON THE FREE LIST, ASSAILS CARNegie AND GARY.

It is reported from Washington that Congressman H. O. Young is making a strong fight before the ways and means committee in an effort to have iron ore taken off the free list, where it is placed by the Payne bill. Tuesday Mr. Young attacked the testimony of Chairman Gary, of the board of directors of the United States Steel corporation, before the committee. He declared that Judge Gary's statements that royalty of ten cents per ton was paid on iron ore about 1897 is misleading. He said that leases were frequently made at the rate of seventy-five cents a ton and that he knew of only one case where ten cents a ton royalty was paid. That was low grade ore that was difficult and expensive to mine.

### FIERCE FIGHT WAGES IN THE BADGER STATE

Prohibition Forces and Liquor Interests Have Locked Horns.

In More Than Two Hundred Wisconsin Communities, Among Them a Number of the Leading Cities, Elections Will Be Held on the Question of No License, and the Prediction Is Made That Many Saloons Will Be Voted Out of Business.

Madison, Wis., March 24.—By far overshadowing the campaign for a state superintendent of public instruction to succeed C. F. Cary is the campaign that is being waged by the anti-saloon element throughout Wisconsin. In more than two hundred communities elections on the question of no license will be held, and the probabilities are strong that in a majority of these places the "drys" will win out.

We are told that a line of North Butte which has been hanging over the market for several weeks has been thoroughly liquidated, and the stock should be good for from five to ten points from the present level. Eighty is talked for Copper Range, Superior & Pittsburg shows more strength, with sales as high as 14. Greene-Canaan was unchanged. On the curb, Davis-Daly was very active, and sold as high as 5 1/2 on the report that the vein was cut in the crosscut yesterday. They are now in fifteen feet, and have not yet reached the hanging wall. Bronx broke 8, but closes 8 bid. Catus is being steadily accumulated. It sold today at 1 1/2, and some of the more enthusiastic holders are predicting 85 for it. Sales of copper metal since Friday aggregate between thirty-five and forty-five million pounds, of which domestic consumers took about ten million pounds, and the balance, which is figured as mostly of a speculative character, was for foreign shipment."

FREE TEXT BOOKS IN LOWER GRADES

BILL OF GREAT IMPORTANCE TO THE SCHOOLS OF THE STATE TO BE INTRODUCED THIS WEEK.

The text book bill, which the special investigating committee proposes to introduce this week in both houses, will stir up a furor among the legislators, according to the Lansing Republican.

In the matter of prices of school books, the bill fixes a schedule of maximum above which the publishers cannot go. It establishes what is to be known as the state school book commission.

It is to be the duty of this commission to select from the school books that are on the market those that are of proper standard to be used in the schools. From this list of eligibles the county school authorities are to choose the books they desire to use and notify the commission of the number needed.

Prices Much Lower.

The scale of prices fixed in the bill are on an average of 100 per cent lower than the prices the publishing companies have been charging in Michigan.

Spelling book, 10 cents, formerly 25 cents; third reader, 23 cents, formerly 50 cents; fourth reader, 30 cents, formerly 60 cents; United States history, 50 cents, formerly \$1; complete geography, 75 cents, formerly \$1.25.

The committee has found on investigation that Kansas, Indiana, California, Ontario have been enjoying such prices as are fixed in the bill for some years, all because they have a law which they can hold as a club over the heads of the publishers.

If it is found necessary for the commission to have special books published the bill provides that the contract can be let to one publisher for all the books or for one or more books separately.

Representative Ogg has introduced in the house another text book bill which gives to the superintendent of public instruction supervision over all school books used in the state.

Catholics Will Oppose. The Catholics in general will oppose any measure providing free text books, as it would place an additional burden of taxation on them, from which they would receive no benefit.
