AIR PIPE LINE TO NORTH LAKE MINE

POWER FOR OPERATION OF DRILLS AT CLEVELAND-CLIFFS IRON COMPANY'S NEW PROPERTY WILL BE TRANSMITTED FROM THE CLIFFS SHAFTS HERE.

The Cleveland-Cliffs Iron company is extending an air pipe line from the Cliffs Shaft engine house to the North Lake property, west of the city. The pipe is being laid on an absolutely straight line a distance of 18,000 feet. Six-inch iron pipe is being laid in a trench averaging between eighteen inches and two feet in depth. The pipe will pass through the Carp river valley and cross the river at a point nearly a half mile from the Cliffs Shafts property. Where trees or stumps are encountered they will be removed. A good sized crew is employed on the job and it is expected that the last of the independent plant will be installed at the property. The compressor at the Cliffs Shafts, which was put in about two years ago, has a capacity to furnish power for the operation of fifty drills. Lately more than forty drills have been working in the Cliffs Shafts mine. Only about two drills will be operated at the North Lake property while the shaft is being sunk.

The Cleveland-Cliffs Iron company has an air line similar to the one now being put in between the Cleveland Lake engine house and the More Land Ore mine. The pipe extends over the hill, and the greater part of it is above surface.

The work preliminary to the opening of the North Lake property is progressing satisfactorily. The New York Foundation company, which put in the concrete shaft, will soon begin removing its equipment, as its work is practically finished. J. Wahlman & Son are making good headway with the combination warehouse and office. Bids were received some time ago on the superintendent's dwelling. L. E. Chausse presented the lowest figure, but the contract has not yet been signed. The location originally selected for the new dwelling will not be used, as ore was found at a point not far distant. Another site is now being considered.

OLD TIMERS MEET.

Foreign Born Citizens Will Hold a Picnic, Preceded by a Parade.

Thirty or more of the foreign born residents of Ishpeming, who located here prior to 1874, met Thursday evening in the Scandinavian society's hall, and plans for the proposed celebration were discussed. It was decided to conduct the picnic at Cleveland Park for families of the old timers. It will be held some time next month. Each of the participants will be assessed \$1 to defray the expenses. A feature of the celebration will be a parade, headed by one of the Ishpeming bands. For those who will not be able to make the picnic, a picnic will be provided. These will head the procession. The names of James Clancy and Henry Routhier were added to the arrangement committee at Thursday night's meeting.

From the reports being received from the committees, it seems that there are over 200 men living in the city and at the outlying locations who located here prior to 1874. The Swedish committee reported sixty-three names and the Norwegian committee has thirty-nine names. It is expected that the names of between fifty and sixty Fruchsen will be secured and there will be in the neighborhood of forty Irishmen. There will be from forty to sixty Englishmen, several Germans, perhaps from ten to fifteen Danes, also a few Scotch. Nine Winthrop and Saginaw men will be eligible.

William Carson, a Winthrop man, is said to be the oldest man on the list, he having recently celebrated his eighty-eighth birthday. Mr. Carson enjoys good health and he has advised the committee that he expects to walk in from the Winthrop and back again on the day of the celebration. Frank Zoberline has lived here longer than any of the other old timers. He is nearly seventy-seven years of age.
