The copper share market continues to follow the usual mid-summer course. If anything there is perhaps more activity than might be expected for this season of the year and if the market is to be termed dull and uninteresting, it is none the less strong and stubborn in refusing to recede from its advanced position.

During the week two annual reports came to hand. One is the Wolverine and the other the Calumet & Hecla. Both of them are surprisingly strong in a great many particulars.

The Superior company ran a test of one thousand tons of rock at the Calumet & Hecla mill at Lake Linden, the exact figures are not given out but the statement can be made that the showing in net copper is better than that obtained from the Amnec.
