Passing Upon the Charges Preferred by Land Agent L. R Glavis, Mr. Taft Pronounces the Allegations Unsupported by Evidence; He Exonerates Secretary of the Interior, and He Grants His Request That His Accuser Be Dismissed from Office.

Albany, N. Y., Sept. 15.—A letter from President Taft to Secretary Ballinger written before the president left Beverly was given out here tonight. In it Mr Taft announces his findings upon the charges against the conduct of the interior department by L. R. Glavis, chie of the field division of the general land office, in connection with the Cunning ham coal land claim in Alaska. #### WONDERS OF WIRELESS.

#### rvelous Growth and Availabilty of the System of Telegraphic Communication-Incidents of ts Advantage in Commerce.

ew York, Sept. 15.—Probably few ple have any adequate conception of extent to which wireless telegraphy been developed here in the United tes, or of the rapid strides that the nce and the business have made in ent years and months. The governst of the United States alone mains about sixty wireless telegraph land ions, several more on lightships and ny others still on battleships and er warcraft the land stations are ited in more than twenty different tes, the line stretching all the way m Maine to Puget Sound, and includalso Cuba, Porto Rico, Hawaii, um, Alaska and the Philippines; the ernment vessels equipped with wireplants number more than one hunl. Much of the departmental busi-could not be conducted effectively hout the aid of this apparatus, and use it in this direction is increasing h marked rapidity.

Vhen it comes to the commercial exsion of the wireless system the recis nothing short of marvellous. It become practically indispensable for amships in the cross seas, coastwise Great Lakes trades, and hundreds them flying the flags of most of the ritime nations now employ it regular-The development of it has been

te as rapid and satisfactory on the rific as among ships plying along the antic and the Gulf coasts; while the I stations of the system are multiing in numbers daily and increasing efficiency constantly as well as in uses to which their equipment may put. It was only in May last that first wireless despatches were ever nsmitted between New York and cago. Many newspapers have infled wireless plants. Unquestionably record made by the wireless at the e of the collision between the ste ps Republic and Flordia gave an anticipated impetus to the developnt of the system in this country-but achievement then was merely signalsuccessfully for aid by a disabled sel, the prompt securing of the aid I the consequent saving of hundreds lives. 


