### CHOCOLAY FURNACE SOON TO START

IT IS AUTHORITATIVELY PREDICTED THAT IT WILL BE IN BLAST BY JAN. 1, 1910.

### WORK IS TO BE RUSHED

George H. Brazeo of Manistique in Charge and Has Been Instructed to Turn Out Iron as Soon as is Possible.

A most welcome piece of news that comes from an authoritative source is the statement that the Chocolay furnace will be put into operation as soon as it can be gotten ready, possibly by Dec. 1 and probably not later than the first of the year. The work of getting the furnace ready for turning out iron is in charge of George H. Brazeo of Manistique, who, in company with a Detroit officer of the Lake Superior Iron & Chemical company was in Marquette a few days ago and thoroughly inspected the plant. It is understood that the officers and directors of the company are very anxious to get both the Chocolay and Newberry furnaces into operation at the earliest possible moment, and that Mr. Brazeo has been instructed to rush the work as fast as possible. The Chocolay furnace was purchased by the Lake Superior Iron & Chemical company two years ago last spring, but two years ago this fall, just as the furnace had been made ready to go into blast, the country was hit by the industrial panic and nothing has been done from that time until a few weeks ago. The plant, however, has not been allowed to deteriorate or get out of repair and with a very little work it can be gotten in shape for turning out iron. There was some talk last spring that the furnace would be put into blast, but up to this time the demand for pig iron has not been sufficiently active to warrant starting the plant. With the great improvement of the iron and steel market within the last few weeks the officers of the furnace have decided to get it into operation at once.

#### Chocolay Before Newberry.

It has been expected almost every week all summer that the company's furnace at Newberry would go into blast, but now repairs have been started there, which makes it likely that the Chocolay plant will be the first to turn out iron, though the Newberry furnace will not be idle much longer.

The starting up of the furnace will mean a great deal to the business and industrial life of Marquette, as a large number of men will be employed and most of the payroll will find its way into this city. Nothing definite as to the actual number of men that are to be employed or what the output will be at the start was to be obtained here yesterday, but it is reasonable to suppose that the operations will be actively

conducted and on a large scale. For some time the company has been taking on men to get out furnace wood and it is understood that there has been difficulty in getting men for that part of the work. It is rumored that the company is negotiating for charcoal and that the date of starting up the Chocolay furnace will to some extent depend upon the length of time needed to provide an adequate fuel supply. The actual work of getting the furnace in readiness for business has not yet begun, but it is expected that a crew of men will be put to work within a very few days.

The Lake Superior Iron & Chemical company is a Detroit corporation, in which the Berry estate is heavily interested. The company has furnaces at Ashland, Manistique, Boyne City, Gladstone, Newberry and Chocolay. The Ashland furnace is one of the largest charcoal furnaces in the country and several of the others have been doing a large business.
