ROOM FOR EXPANSION. That there is lots of room for expansion of Uncle Sam's much discussed trade with the east was shown by O. P. Austin, chief of the bureau of statistics.

The principal articles entering into this great volume of imports are all produced in the United States, and there's no reason, except lack of aggression and proper methods, why this country should not do its fair share of the business.

The explanation for this contradictory state of affairs, Mr. Austin says, is that the American manufacturer does not make, and is apparently unwilling to make, his cotton clothes of the weight, texture, color and patterns required by the Oriental trade.

The thing that has stood between the American cotton mills and their fair share of the business of the Orient is the thing that has stood between the American manufacturers in nearly every line and the largest possible exploitation of the foreign markets.
