

BOX OPENED BY RECEIVER

One of the Mysteries of the Beddow Trial Cleared Up Yesterday, When Judge Denison Ordered Contents of Safety Deposit Receptacle Disclosed.

Ex-Assistant Cashier Under Grilling Cross-Examination All Day in Course of Which Many More Discrepancies in Bank Books Are Brought to Light.

On the witness stand undergoing a rapid-fire cross-examination at the hands of Assistant District Attorney Clute, yesterday was a strenuous day for George H. Beddow, the defendant in the embezzlement case on trial in United States court.

The box was opened yesterday on the order of Judge Denison by Receiver Tillinghast, after Beddow, on the advice of counsel, had refused to open it, when asked to do so by Mr. Clute.

Contents of the Box. In the box were found a half dozen or more drafts, drawn by E. G. Brady on Beddow, which are not marked paid and which the government's attorney believes represent sums of money abstracted from the bank.

was for \$1,475 and was never credited to Brady on his individual ledger account in the bank. The box also contained pencil memoranda relative to the Stanlake and Ed. Johnson accounts and many other annotations, the importance of which the government experts are as yet unable to determine.

Bank Examiner Logan last night declared that several of the papers found in the box strengthened the government's case, and that what was unquestionably the property of the bank had been found therein, in spite of Beddow's claim to the contrary.

More Discrepancies in Books. Mr. Clute directed most of his cross-examination to discrepancies found on the bank's books, which previously had not been brought into the trial.

In one instance, for example, the footing of the day's business on the general ledger was \$8,500 more than it should have been, adding up the various items, Beddow admitted making the footing and stated that the difference was due to an item to which Mr. Larson had called his attention having been added in to make the total, the intention being to put it in the column later.

In another instance the witness admitted having carried \$20,000 on the cash balance sheet for over two weeks, while the government claims was simply put there to conceal a shortage in the cash. Beddow stated that \$11,000 of this amount had been credited to the Harqua Hala Mining company and \$9,000 to Larson's personal account.

Cash Usually Out of Balance. Numerous other entries, which Beddow admitted to have made, were shown to have been made as methods to abstract money from the bank or to plug up holes made by shortages already existing.

Throughout this long grilling at the hands of District Attorney Clute, Beddow apparently kept his head clear and gave a ready explanation without hesitation or becoming confused.

The Sidnaw factory was built less than two years ago and this summer has been furnishing employment to thirty-five people. It was the only manufacturing plant in Sidnaw and the largest factory, exclusive of breweries, in the western part of the peninsula.

SIDNAW FACTORY TOTALLY DESTROYED

Beitner Butter Dish Plant Was Burned to the Ground Yesterday Afternoon.

The butter dish factory at Sidnaw, owned and operated by Wm. Beitner & Son, was totally destroyed by fire about noon yesterday, the loss being estimated at from \$25,000 to \$35,000.

Mr. Beitner and his whole family were out of town, having gone to Traverse City, their former home, to bury a daughter who died a few days ago and whose funeral was held at Sidnaw Sunday.

Some months ago the Beitners were in Marquette considering plans for removing the plant to this city, but nothing definite ever resulted from the negotiations.
