FOREST FIRES NUMEROUS.

Cleveland-Cliffs Iron Company Has Many Men Fighting Flames.

Much damage is threatened to the woods of this vicinity from the forest fires, which have been smoldering for more than a week past.

The foresters in the employ of the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron company are now devoting all of their time to fire fighting.

Each forester has a crew working under him and they are scattered in various parts of the peninsula, where the company has land holdings.

As soon as a fire is reported men are immediately sent out to fight it and in this way the officials of the company hope to hold the flames pretty well in check.

If necessary they will increase the force in all places where fires are burning in the hope of curtailing the damage to shrubbery and timber.

Sensational reports regarding the danger of forest fires have been sent out from Hibbing and other places on the Mesaba range during the past few days.

It is said that the fires are not nearly as bad as the newspaper stories indicate. However, it is said that Chisholm, which was practically wiped out two years ago, is again in danger.

Heavy clouds of smoke are overhanging most of the range towns and it is feared that the burning embers being carried through the air will be the means of starting new fires.

The largest fires up to this time have been burning in the vicinity of Mitchell some two miles or more from Hibbing.

There is no good timber to burn in that vicinity as it was destroyed in the big fire there two years ago.

The same is true of the Chisholm district, so that in all probability the land owners will not suffer heavily.

The gravest danger is that the fires may wipe out some of the settlers in the timbered sections of the range.

A few of the settlers have already been obliged to leave their places, but no heavy losses have been reported.
