Motor boats of Classes II and III must carry a bright white light in the fore part of the vessel, a white light aft to show all around the horizon. on the starboard side a green light, and on the port side a red light. Larger lights are required for Class III boats than for Class II.

Motor boats must also carry a whistle or other sound-making device capable of producing a blast two seconds or more i duration, and boats of Classes II and III must carry an efficient fog horn and bell. soats are also required to have on board two copies of the pilot rules, pamphlet form.




