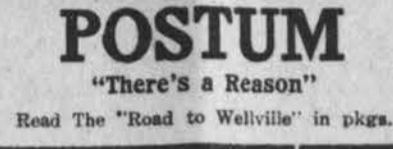

RIGHT OF WAY READY. For Link of Road Connecting Munising & M. & L. S. Rys.

The M. & L. S.—better known as the 'Haywire Line'—connecting Shingleton and Manistique, has finished cutting out two and one half miles of right of way between its road and the 'Doty branch' on the east branch the Munising railway, says The Manistique Pioneer-Tribune. It is expected to have this connecting line ready for traffic before winter sets in.

When the completion of this connecting link makes it possible to bring in freight from southern points via the ferry to Manistique and the M. & L. S., without hauling it from Shingleton to Munising over the South Shore, local shippers will save \$1 per thousand by the new arrangement.

The laying of rails on this two and one-half miles of railroad right of way will enable Marquette, Negaunee and Ishpeming shippers as well as those in Munising to get freight from other points on a line that can and doubtless will compete successfully with the South Shore and save them considerable money.

FALL TERM OF NORMAL SCHOOL

Teachers' College at Marquette Begins Another Year's Work Today, With Prospects for an Enrollment of at Least 300 Students, and Perhaps More.

Three New Instructors Will Be Numbered in the Faculty, Taking the Places Left Vacant by the Resignation of Miss Hadley, Miss Libby and Dr. Faught.

The Northern State Normal school opens its fall term today. The advance guard of students arrived yesterday but the real influx will be noticed today. No regular class work will be given today, but the executive office will be busy enrolling the students and assigning them to their proper classes. Tomorrow the real work of the term will begin.

For the last three years each succeeding fall term has witnessed an increase of about forty in the enrollment, and continuing at that ratio of increase there should be 300 or more students enrolled this term.

There will be several changes in the faculty this term. Miss Hadley, head of the department of geography, has resigned to live with her mother in Indianapolis.

Dr. Faught, who has been at the head of the mathematics department, has accepted a similar position at the Kalamazoo Normal school, and he left for that city a few days ago.

Miss Abbie Day, of Minneapolis, has been engaged as first and second grade critic in the training school, taking the position left vacant by the resignation of Miss Kathryn B. Libby.

COUPLERS OUT OF REPAIR.

Northwestern and St. Paul Railroads Haled into U. S. Court.

On the complaint of the interstate commerce commission, the United States has begun action in federal court in Marquette against the Chicago & Northwestern and Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul railroad companies.

These cases will probably be taken up at the coming term of United States court, which opens here Tuesday, Oct. 4. Compared with the last two terms, the business of the term promises to be light, there being no important criminal cases to be tried unless unexpected indictments are returned by the grand jury.
