Is Now Well Abreast of Britain and Germany—Oil Burning Ships Important.

Washington, Oct. 16.—Rear Admiral Robley D. Evans, now retired, at the Plaza Hotel at New York, showed that he is physically the Fighting Bob of old.

"Aside from the results of that round the world cruise that were apparent at the time or soon afterward," said the admiral, "there has been an important result in regard to the personnel of the enlisted men in the navy."

"Do I think Secretary Meyer's reorganization plan has worked out well? Admirably! Its principal recommendation is that it has given the fighting element in the navy a voice in determining what the ships it may have to fight in shall be like."

Seligman & Co. and the Central Trust Co. of New York.
