TAXES TO BE HIGHER THAN LAST YEAR

Rate on Each \$100 Valuation to Be \$3.38, Compared With \$3.27 in 1909.

Henry Routhier, the city assessor, is now working on the tax roll, which will be turned over to the Miners' National bank on or before Dec. 1, for collection of the annual taxes. The taxes will be a little higher than they were last year. The rate on each \$100 valuation in 1909 was \$3.27; this year it will be \$3.38. The increase is due to the increase in the amount of money that will be raised for county purposes, also to the increase in the valuation of some of the mining properties in the city. When the council met as a board of review in June, the Pittsburg & Lake Angeline company was allowed a reduction on the valuation of its Lake Angeline mine, and some of the other companies were allowed reductions because of there being less ore in stock than there was at the corresponding date in 1909. There were no increases to speak of in the valuations.

The amount levied in the several cities and townships in the county for state taxes will be about \$21,000 less than a year ago. The state taxes levied against Marquette county this year amount to \$83,175.42, as compared with \$104,294.13 in 1909. The combined state and county taxes will be about \$9,000 more than they were in 1909.

Ishpeming's assessed valuation is \$7,500,000, the same as last year. There has been no changes in the valuations of the three cities of the county, compared with 1909. The assessed valuation of all taxable property in the county is \$27,373,000, compared with \$26,828,000 last year.
