Hon. Board of Supervisors Marquette, County, Michigan Gentlemen:

As you know, Mr. E. R. Nelson, who has served as Director of the Marquette County Social Welfare Board since it was organized in 1939, has retired as of December 31, 1946.

At a regular meeting of the Social Welfare Board, Mr. James Scanlon, who has been employed by the Board as Accountant since '39, was appointed Director to succeed Mr. Nelson. The Board feels that no additional personnel needs to be added to the staff at this time, and with this in mind have named Mrs. Bernice M. Anderson as Secretary, and Mrs. Mayme P. Schjonberg as Bookkeeper. Mrs. Anderson's duties previously have been Secretary to the Director and Casework Supervisor, and Mrs. Schjonberg has been employed on the books and records with the Accountant.

The Social Welfare Board therefore recommends the Director's salary be fixed at \$285.00 per month; the Secretary's salary at \$205.00 per month; and the Bookkeeper's salary at \$165.00 per month.

We request the approval of your Board of Supervisors in the above recommendation of the Social Welfare Board.

Gentlemen:

Your Prosecuting Attorney respectfully requests that the Board of Supervisors provide funds to pay the salary of an assistant prosecutor for the balance of this two-year period. Considering the present sharply increased work of the office, and the general rise in prices and wages, I think the salary of an assistant prosecutor should be at least \$100.00 per month, plus a reasonable allowance for expenses. It is my opinion that the Board may take this action this time if it so desires.

In view of the above request, and the further fact that this Board just voted to abolish the office at its annual meeting in October, perhaps a little background on

the office of assistant prosecutor would not be amiss at this time. During the month of September, 1945, I asked the Board to provide funds for an assistant prosecutor. My request was referred to the Budget and Executive Committee and I was asked to appear before that Committee. There I reviewed the situation and pointed out the following facts:

That Marquette County is not only the largest county in the state in area - which presents a constant and very physical problem to our scattered people who have business with the prosecutor's office - but that in volume of criminal cases and office complaints handled it is by far the busiest county in the Upper Peninsula. That no other county in the Peninsula has three active Municipal Courts which transact such a large volume of criminal business. That in addition we have the district post of the Michigan State Police, a Conservation Department office, not to mention that perpetual powderkeg, the Branch Prison. I reminded the committee that it is a rare term of court when we do not get at least one criminal case from the latter institution, often more.

I then told the committee that virtually all of the leading law enforcement officers of the county, including Judge Bell, felt that there should be an assistant prosecutor; and that they further felt that he should be located in Marquette if the prosecutor were from the West end of the county, and that he should be located in the West end of the county if the prosecutor were from Marquette. I then told the committee that one of the biggest problems the prosecutor has to face is that of sifting and culling the scores of complaints that constantly come before him; that this is a job for experts; an important, tedious and time-consuming job; and one without which many abortive and ex-

pensive criminal prosecutions might otherwise be started.

Acting unanimously, the committee reported favorably on my request and, at the October 1945, meeting of the Board, provision was made to pay the assistant prosecutor \$60.00 per month, plus a reasonable expense allowance, Things went along on this basis and those courts, law officers and other people who had business with the prosecutor's office accordingly found that they received much better and faster service from the office.

Then at the last annual meeting of this Board, held on October 14, 1946, the Board was presented with a report of the Finance and Taxation Committee containing the new salary schedule. That report contained the following brief recommendation of the Committee:

"That the office of Assistant Prosecuting Attorney be abolished as of December 31st, 1946."

Since the entire report was adopted, without question or debate, this meant that Marquette County was again to find itself without the services of an assistant prosecutor. Some of you may be surprised to learn that your prosecutor had no hint that your committee contemplated any move abolishing the office of assistant prosecutor. I was not called to appear before the committee, and have since been unable to learn of any other law enforcement officer who was called before the committee. I cannot believe that either the committee or this Board would have taken this action if they had had the facts before them. At any rate, the need for an assistant prosecutor is so urgent and so real, that whatever you may decide to do, I feel it my duty to lay the facts before you.

It seems to me that if public funds could be authorized by the Board and spent for an assistant prosecutor in 1945, on the fact of it there must be a much greater need for an assistant now, what with literally thousands of service people and workers returned from the War and the factories. It is inevitable, and no reflections on these groups, that the more people you have in a community the more problems of law enforcement have

to be met.

Here are some further facts:

1. 5,912 men and women of this county who were in the armed forces have now received their discharges, most of them since the end of the War. To this sharp population increase must be added the unknown hundreds who were away working in the shops and factories and who have since returned. It is safe to say that our population must have been swollen by between seven and eight thousand since the assistant prosecutor was first appointed back in 1945.

2. The Marquette Municipal Court, our busiest lower court, handled 45 criminal cases in November, 1943; 55 in November, 1944; 48 in November, 1945; and 110 criminal cases in November, 1946! That is more than a 100% increase during the past year. That is nearly four criminal cases for each calendar day in one court alone. And I am not

counting the gardenrun traffic violations in these figures.

There were 36 individual criminal prosecutions filed in 1945. In 1946 there were 50 - averaging almost one a week. Each of these cases took a lot of preparation and preliminary investigation. Many other cases were weeded out before they ever got to Circuit Court. A careful prosecutor must assume that every case he commences may go to the Supreme Court. In that way he is less liable to ever have to go to the Supreme Court. Consider, gentlemen, that it costs the county approximately \$300.00 per day to conduct a criminal jury trial in Circuit Court. Then consider further the fortunate record of the prosecutor's office of this county in disposing of most of its more serious cases by convictions on a plea of guilty, without the expense of a trial. This is largely the result of careful initial investigation and preparation by the prosecutor and the police. Should not these circumstances plainly indicate that the prosecutor should be given all the help he needs, so that he can be encouraged and enabled to keep up the good work?

4. Judge Bell gave as his unqualified opinion in 1945 that Marquette County needed an assistant prosecutor. Today Judge Bell feels the same way about the need for an assistant except that he feels that the need has now grown definitely more acute. I cannot make myslef believe that if this fact had been known by a majority of the members of the committee or by the Board that either would have voted to abolish the office of

assistant prosecutor when they did.

Back in 1945 I was trying to anticipate and prepare for the contingency of increased criminal business which I have just outlined. I was somehow able to obtain for the county the full-time services of a trained lawyer as my assistant at the modest salary of \$2.00 per day! (Ironically enough, just bemfore the last October meeting I had told my

Gentlemen, the prosecutor's office is one of the most important offices in the county. Adequate law enforcement is one of the keystones of good government. Any step that makes for better law enforcement accordingly makes for better government itself. Furthermore, the people who endlessly tramp to the prosecutor to tell him their tales of woe are, generally speaking, a helpless, troubled and inarticulate lot. They are often poor and bewildered and they are not adept in the art of petitioning public bodies or lobbying for their needs. Someone must do it for them. The sober fact is that the need is here. The sober fact is that one man can no longer adequately handle the increasing

We, your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom was referred the question of alimony expenses to the County, wish to submit the following:

WHEREAS, we feel that the cost of handling alimony and child-support accounts should be borne by the litigants and not by the taxpayers,

AND WHEREAS, the handling of alimony accounts is a matter of interest to comparative ly few people and of little concern to the general tax-paying public; and believing that the cost of servicing these alimony accounts should be borne by those directly affected and not by the taxpayers at large,

Therefore, Be It Resolved that the Marquette County Board of Supervisors urge the enactment of a law by the State Legislature directing the Circuit Courts of Michigan to incorporate in every Decree of Divorce involving payments for alimony or for support for minor children, the provision that a certain amount not to exceed a certain maximum, shall be paid to the Clerk of the Court, as costs, at the Court's discretion, having in mind the circumstances of each case; such amount to be transferred to the County's General Fund to reimburse the County for the servicing of such accounts.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT copies of this resolution be sent to the Board of Supervisors of all counties of Michigan, to the Representative of the Marquette District in the Legislature, to the State Senator from the 31st District, to the President and to the Secretary of the State Association of Circuit Judges, and to the President and to the Chairman of the Legislative Committee of the State Association of County Clerks.

The Chairman called upon Supervisor Larson, Chairman of the Finance and Taxation Committee to give a report on the financial condition of the County. read the following report:

Board of Supervisors, Marquette County,

Marquette, Michigan.

Gentlemen: County Controller, Frank L. Denny, in preparation for the annual budget for Marquette County, assembled some data based on tentative estimates. The resulting figures were startling in that they disclosed a very serious financial problem, not only for the year 1947 but for 1948 as well.

It appears that several of the departments have already incurred sizeable deficits, with prospect of increase before the end of the calendar year. The situation confronting the County officials both as to 1947 and 1948, was so disturbing that a conference was held recently, at which were present the Chairman of the Board, Chairmen of the Finance and Taxation, Budget and Executive, and Auditing Committees, the members of the County Road Commission, Social Welfare representatives, and the Trustees of the Morgan Heights Sanatorium.

A careful survey was made as to the possibility of reducing the deficit which exists at the present time and which, in the several County funds, aggregates even now, approximately \$60,500.00. It was very apparent that the situation is one beyond the control of the respective departments and is due to conditions which have arisen since the budgets were prepared a year ago by these departments. In the case of the County Road Commission, salary and wage increases have been in large measure responsible for the tight situation in the department and have made necessary deferring of much important work previously planned. Furthermore, this department experienced reversals in 1947 due to the fact that revenues formerly obtained in the amount of \$75,000 from State liquor tax moneys are not now available.

The same situation prevails with Morgan Heights Sanatorium, which also has been confronted with substantial salary and food cost increases. The situation with respect to Morgan Hieghts Sanatorium was aggravated by the fact that it was necessary to maintain the regular staff and overhead with considerable decrease in the patient list. It will be recalled that the County received a per diem from the State for tubercular patients and, consequently, there is an advantage in having the Sanatorium operated as efficiently as possible with a patient enrollment, even encouraging pay-patients from other counties, in keeping with the overhead required in the plant. Morgan Heights Sanatorium has a capacity of approximately ninety patients and the enrollment recently has been as low as sixty.

In the General Funds, too, salaries have been increased during the year, Through all the departments the termination of the war made possible replacement of much needed supplies and equipment, which of course had to be paid for when received. This is conspiciously noted in the case of the County Road Commission, which purchased considerable needed equipment which became available this year and, incidentally, at the prevailing high prices.

It seemed to be the consensus at the conferences held that there is no alternative but to utilize all the funds available in the various accounts and the further necessity of using the proceeds of \$150,000 United States Government Bonds which have been held for a number of year. Through such process it would appear possible to close the year 1947

in the blake but by a scant margin within \$1,000 or \$2,000.

With such provision for meeting the deficit we still face an unbalanced budget based on tentative requests for 1948 as made by the various departments. If such requests as were submitted tentatively are allowed, and it is very evident that they have been pared to the bone, the net result would be a total of $12\frac{1}{8}$ mills, not including that required for school purposes. Even with a minimum allowance for the schools, the required millage would substantially exceed the fifteen mills now permitted by statute and would present insurmountable problems to the County Tax Allocation Committees.

A number of conferences have been held by this same group and it is very apparent that a two-phase course of action will have to be followed. First, further curtailment on the parts of the respective County departments, to keep within a limit which would be considered reasonable in view of high costs of labor and materials at present prevailing. Second, with the resulting required appropriations there would still have to be an increase in the tax millage. Considering all factors involved, it has been determined that such a course would require an increase of an additional three mills, and further, that

such increase should be authorized for a five year period. From estimates which have been prepared it would seem that such an increase would permit the County to operate on a conservative basis for the next four or five years and to include some of the projects which are so urgently needed, among which would be the K. I. Sawyer airport. This latter, we are informed by members of the County Road Commission, could be made possible through an appropriation of \$21,500 per year for a five year period, augmented by an appropriation of \$21,500 per year from the State and \$43,000 per year from the Federal Government. This is only one of the important items which the public generally has come to recognize as a necessity in these times.

To make the change in millage requires action by the Board of Supervisors, first, to suspend the present fifteen mills ceiling, and, second, to adopt an eighteen mill limit for the five year period. It is the recommendation of all who have attended these conferences that such action be taken. In order to benefit the financial picture for 1948 it is necessary to take immediate action and to call for an election, which will require a thirty-day notice. If favorably acted upon at such election the Board of Supervisors would then be enabled to spread the increased millage on the next tax levy. It should then be possible to carry on the activities of the County departments along

efficient lines.

I am presenting this matter knowing that it is on rather short notice, but I am convinced that if you will study the situation as we have, you will be thoroughly satisfied that immediate action is necessary to keep the County on a satisfactory financial keel.

Hon. Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Marquette Co., Michigan. Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Highways and Bridges and the Board of County Road Commissioners met on Setpember 11th, 1947, and considered several petitions referred by your Board for joint consideration.

In the matter of the petition from Lincoln J. Lindstrom and others relative to the extension of the improved portion of Road 484 in Chocolay Township, we find that the work and services requested would be involved. We recommend that the work requested be deferred until 1948 and that it be done at that time if funds are available.

In the matter of the petition relative to determining and stabilizing the level of Lake Independence, we find that considerable repair work on the existing dam would be necessary, as well as hauling and placing a large yardage of earth fill. We do not feel that this is the responsibility of Marquette County, and we recommend that the matter be referred to the Superintendent of the County Road Commission, and that he be

instructed to confer with the Prosecuting Attorney as to the legal status of the project, and that he contact the Conservation Department and the Ford Motor Company relative to their undertaking the work requested in the petition.

In the matter of the petition relative to relocating and rebuilding a portion of Road PA in Tilden Township, we find that this road has a reasonable good surface and alignment, adequate for the traffic using the road, and that to do the work requested would involve an expenditure of several thousands of dollars. We therefore recommend that the petition be denied.

In the matter of the petition from Mr. John Ruona, requesting the widening of, and furnishing plowing service on the Road leading from Road 581 to his property, we find that this is a private road. Inasmuch as the Road Commission has adopted a definite policy of not providing services on private roads, we recommend that the regulations of the Road Commission be followed in this case and that the petition be denied.

In the matter of the petition requesting work on two streets in the Village of Harvey, we feel that this is a routine operation of the Road Commission and that it be referred to the Road Commission for disposal.

We recommend concurrence of the Board in the above action.

The following report of the Buildings and Grounds and Insurance Committee was read. Supervisor Rose moved it be adopted. Supported by Supervisor Johnson and carried.

Hon. Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan. Gentlemen:

Your Committee of Buildings, Grounds and Insurance met on September 19th, 1947, for the regular inspection of the buildings of the several County Departments.

The first call was made at the Court House where a thorough inspection was made. The cleaning and painting, which was in progress at the time of our last inspection, has now been completed and has greatly improved the appearance of the building, as well as working condition. We noted that Modine fan heaters are being installed in the office rooms in the basement of the building. The radiators in these rooms are located near the ceiling, with the result that the floors are cold during the winter months and the installation of these fan heaters will correct this condition.

Inspection was made of the ajil building where we found everything in good clean condition. The attention of the Committee was called to the plumbing fixtures in the room in which mental cases are confined. Considerable damage has been done to these fixtures by inmates from time to time and it was suggested by the sheriff that they be encased in concrete to prevent further damage. Arrangements for having this work done are now in progress and will be taken care of in due time.

Our next call was at the Infirmary, where we found the grounds well kept and the buildings in a good clean condition. It was pointed out to the Committee that a small section of the floor in the kitchen has to be repaired and the Social Welfare Department has already arranged to have this work done.

We next visited the Sanatorium where considerable time was spent going through the entire plant with Dr. Acocks. The cleaning and painting work is almost complete in the south building as well as all exterior work and the job will be continued to completion. We feel that the work being done is definitely justified both from the standpoint of building maintenance and improvement of living and working conditions.

The inspection was concluded at Ishpeming where we went through the Road Commission headquarters buildings and the Welfare Department offices. The buildings were ingood condition and in the Welfare office we noted that the temporary fiber floor covering has been removed and replaced with battleship linoleum.

In all of the departments your Committee received full co-operation and we appreciate the courtesies shown us during the entire inspection.

Resolutions Accepting Lease of Oliver Iron Mining Company for Public Park.

WHEREAS, Oliver Iron Mining Company offers to lease to the County the surface only of the Southeast quarter of the Southwest quarter (SE_{4}^{1} of SW_{4}^{1}) of Section Thirty (30) and the north three hundred and thirty (330) feet of the North half of the Northwest quarter (N_{2}^{1} of NW_{4}^{1}) of Section Thirty-one (31) in Township Forty-eight (48) North, Range Twenty-nine (29) West in Marquette County, Michigan; and that portion of Lot One (1) of Section Thirty-six (36) in Township Forty-eight (48) North, Range Thirty (30) West described in a draft of lease proposed to be entered into by and between said Company and the County which has been presented and read in full at this meeting; and

WHEREAS, said land is suitable for said purpose; the terms, conditions, reservations and obligations contained in said draft of lease are satisfactory and it considered advisable that said lease be accepted and that said land be used in a manner consistent with all the prosivions of said lease;

THEREFORE, RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marquette that the County acquire the right to use said land for public park purposes by lease from Oliver Iron Mining Company in the form and subject to all the terms, conditions, exceptions, reservations and obligations aforesaid, to each and all of which the County agrees; and

In re: Bear and Fox.

Gentlemen:

I have been asked to give the Board some information on the status of shooting bear in Marquette County and also of paying a bounty for the pelt of a red fox.

On October, 1, 1947, the Conservation Commission promulgated an order limiting the taking of bear in Marquette County to the open season on deer hunting. This order runs for a period of two years. Farmers and homesteaders, however, may dispose of a molesting bear at any time, and special permission is not needed. In doubtful cases it is probably safest for a resident to consult the Conservation Department. I have been in touch with a member of the Conservation Department and he tells me that the Commission would undoubtedly rescind its present order on the taking of bear if the Marquette County Board of Supervisors should inform them that this is their wish. Such a rescission would

mean that bear may be taken at any time.

The 1947 Legislature also set up a bounty for wild red fox. The statute reads as follows:

"For the exclusive purpose of the payment of a \$5.00 bounty on wild red foxes, 50 cents of the fee received from the sale of each small game hunting and trapping license under section 7 of this chapter shall be made available, and if such sum is insufficient to pay said bounty, payment shall be made from the game and fish protection fund.

There shall be paid by the department of conservation a bounty of \$5.00 for the raw hide of each wild red fox taken during each year. Applicant for bounty on red fox must present the entire hide, within 10 days after taking same, to the township clerk of the township wherein the fox was taken. The application form shall be filled out in triplicate by the applicant who shall make affidavit thereon where and when the animal or animals was taken or were taken and that the hide or hides had not previously been presented for payment of bounty elsewhere. The township clerk shall mark each hide by puncturing the right ear in 3 places and shall turn over the hide to the owner who shall either sell or dispose of same. The township clerk shall then certify on the application form that he has examined and marked the hide or hides and shall register thereon his approval of the paymnet of bounty in a specified amount. One copy of the application shall be retained by the township clerk for his file and 2 copies shall be forwarded by him to the department of conservation. For his services the township clerk shall be entitled to a fee of 50 cents which shall be paid to him by the applicant. Payment of said bounty or bounties shall be made to the applicant by the department of conservation from funds designated for that purpose by the legislature."

Gentlemen: - Your County Airport Committee has for some time been working on the details of the proposed K. I. Sawyer Airport at Sands. Most of this work has been done with the State Department of Aeronautics, and involved surveys, preparation of maps, plans and specifications, and various details necessary to secure State and Federal participation in the project.

Inasmuch as the County of Marquette is the sponsor of this project, title to the land must be vested in Marquette County. The lands are now held in the name of the Road Committee, and with your approval title will be transferred from the Road Commission to the County.

Also, final action on execution of the operating agreements must necessarily come from your Board of Supervisors. This involves the signing of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement by your Chairman, authorized by resolution of your Board. A copy of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement and the resolution to be passed is attahced hereto.

The Sponsor's Assurance Agreement under Section 2, subsetion b, states that the sponsor has sufficient funds available for the portion of the costs to be paid by Marquette County. It should be noted here that the terms of this agreement are not applicable until after bids have been taken. We realize that no budgetary provision has been made for financing this project in 1948. However, at a joint meeting of this committee and your Special Airport Committee, it was decided that at least a part of the first year's funds could be raised by the sale of mature commercial timber on the County owned lands in the airport area, the timber to be sold on bids. It is our recommendation that the filed area, which includes the airport proper and approach zones, and is 2 miles by $2\frac{1}{2}$ miles, should be entirely cleared, and that the mature commercial timber on the remainder of the tract be sold and cut in accordance with good forestry practice. A considerable portion of the timber to be cut is on lands acquired from the State of Michigan, and your Special Committee, which includes the Chairman of your Board the County Controller and the Superintendent of the Road Commission, have met with representatives of the Conservation Department and agreed on standards and practices to be followed, which conform to State methods of cutting on State owned lands.

After the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement has been signed, about 10 or 12 weeks is required to process the applications through the Civil Aeronautics Authority before bids can be taken for construction. If bids can be taken on this project in March 1948, the first year's work can be completed during the summer of 1948, and the airport can be put to use.

The Northwest-Southeast run-way has been cleared and grubbed, and if the entire State and Federal allotment is used, 2 run-ways, each 4200 feet long, can be graded and surfaced. The specifications to which it is proposed to build these run-ways will meet all the requirements of commercial air lines.

We feel that Marquette County should have an airport suitable for commercial plane traffic as soon as possible, and we therefore request that your Board concur in the above recommendations, and that you pass the attached resolution authorizing the signature of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement.

RESOLUTION

Extract from the minutes of a regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County, Michigan, held on December 17, 1947.

The following resolution was introduced by Supervisor Beaudry, read in full and considered:

Resolution Adopting and Approving the Execution of the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement To Be Submitted to the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics, U. S. Department of Commerce, to Obtain Federal Aid in the Development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport.

Be it resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County, Michigan.

Section 1. That Marquette County shall enter into a Sponsor's Assurance Agreement for the purpose of obtaining Federal Aid in the development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport and that such agreement shall be set forth herein below:

Section 2. That the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Sponsor's Assurance Agreement in quadruplicate on behalf of Marquette County, and the Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to impress the official seal of this County and to attest said execution.

Section 3. That the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement referred to hereinabove shall be as follows:

DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE

Civil Aeronautics Administration

Federal Airport Program

Sponsor's Assurance Agreement.

- Section 1. For and in consideration of the execution by the United States of a Grant Agreement obligating the United States to pay a portion of the allowable project costs of a project for development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport under the provisions of the Federal Airport Act, and the Regulations promulgated thereunder, the County of Marquette hereinafter called the "sponsor", for itself, its successors, or assigns does hereby covenant and agree with the United States as follows:
- a. All terms used in this Agreement which are defined in the Federal Airport Act, and the Regulations promulgated thereunder, shall have the meaning given to them in such Act and Regulations.
- b. Insofar as legally possible, the sponsor will maintain a master plan of the airport, including building areas, approach areas, and landing areas indicating present and future proposed development commensurate with the airport and with current approval of the Administrator; and in establishing additional improvements, the sponsor will conform to such master plan or approved changes thereto.
- c. During the term of this agreement, the airport will be operated continuously as such and for no other purpose and will at all times be operated for the use and benefit of the public, on fair and reasonable terms and without unjust discrimination.
- d. The sponsor will not hereafter use or permit the use of the airport exclusively for air carrier operations, unless there are other public airport facilities in the area adequate to serve other types of users; it will not grant, exercise, or permit the exercise of any exclusive-right for use of the airport by one air carrier operator, or for rental of aircraft to the public, for conducting charter flights, or for operating a flying school, and that, after the date of this agreement, it will not grant or authorize the grant of exclusive right at the airport for selling aircraft, aircraft parts or equipment, or for repairing aircraft and engines, or for carrying on other airport services or fixed base operations of an aeronautical nature, Nothing contained herein shall be construed to waive or abrogate the requirements of section 303 of the Civil Aeronautics Act of 1938. In the interest of safety, the Administrator may wiave in writing compliance with any or all the provisions of this sub-section.
- e. Except as provided in d. above, the sponsor will permit all qualified operators, on reasonable terms and without unjust discrimination to use the airport for any aeronautical business or operation up to the capacity of the airport.
- f. The sponsor will not hereafter grant to any one an exclusive right to sell aviation gasoline or oil.
- g. During the term of this agreement the sponsor will continuously maintain in good and servicable condition and repair the entire airport and all buildings and to other improvements, facilities, and equipment, other than facilities or equipment owned or controlled by the United States; provided, however, in meeting this requirement the airport is not expected to be operated and maintained for aeronautical uses during temporary periods when climatic or flood conditions interfere substantially with operations and maintenance during such periods. Essential facilities, including night lighting systems, when installed, will be operated in such a manner as to assure their availability

to all users of the airport.

- h. The sponsor will replace and repair all buildings, structures, and facilities developed under the project if such are destroyed or damaged, replacing or restoring them to a condition comparable to that preceding the destruction or damage.
- i. If the land or improvements thereon, acquired or developed under the project, are sold, condemned, or otherwise disposed of, wholly or in part, the United States will be reimbursed in proportion to its original investment in the property so disposed of, but not exceeding its original share in the portions so disposed of, except that if the proceeds are used by the sponsor for airport purposes within two years or if a transfer is made, pursuant to this agreement to another public agency or agencies for operation as an airport, there shall be no reimbursement to the United States.
- Insofar as is within its powers and resonably possible the sponsor will prevent the use of any land either withon or outside the boundaries of the airport, including the construction, erection, alteration, or growth of any structure or other object thereon, which would be a hazard to the landing, taking-off, and maneuvering of aircraft at the airport, or otherwise limits its usefulness as an airport. With respect to land outside the boundaries of the airport, the sponsor will move or cause to be removed any growth, sturcture, or other object thereon which would be a hazard to the landing, taking-off, or maneuvering of aircraft at the airport, or when such is not feasible, it will mark or light such growth, structure, or other object. The airport approach standards to be followed in this connection shall be those established by the Administrator in Office of Airports Drawing No. 672 dated , unless otherwise authorized by the Administrator. Insofar as legally possible, the sponsor will adopt and enforce zoning ordinances and regulations to safeguard aircraft flight operations within the airport hazard areas as defined in the above mentioned drawing, prohibiting the creation, establishment, erection, and construction of hazards to air navigation; or insofar as reasonably possible, will acquire such easements or other interests in lands and air space as may be necessary to perform the covenants of this paragraph.
- k. All facilities of the airport developed with Federal aid and all those unable for the landing and taking-off of aircraft will be available to the United States at all times without charge for use by military and naval aircraft in common with other aircraft, except, if the use by military and naval aircraft shall be substantial, a reasonable share, proportional to such use, of the cost of operating and maintaining facilities so used, may be charged.
- l. The sponsor will furnish to any civil agency of the United States, without charge, (except for light, heat, janitor services, and similar facilities and services at the reasonable cost thereof), such space in airport buildings as may be reasonably adequate for use in connection with any airport air traffic control activities, weather-reporting activities and communications activities related to airport traffic control, which are necessary to the safe and efficient operation of the airport and which such agency may deem necessary to establish and maintain at the airport.
- m. The sponsor will maintain a current system of airport accounts and records, using a system of its own choice, sufficietn to provide annual statements of income and expense, balance sheet and affiliated fiscal reporting. It shall, upon reasonable request, furnish the Administrator with annual or special financial and operation reports. Such reports may be submitted to the Administrator on forms furnished by him or may be submitted in such other manner as the sponsor elects, provided the essential data is furnished. The airport and all airport accounts and records will be available for inspection at any time, upon reasonable request, by the regional Superintendent of Airports or his authorized representatives.
- n. The sponsor will not enter into any transaction which would operate to deprive it of any of the rights and powers necessary to perform any or all of the covenants made herein, unless by such transaction the obligation to perform all such convenants is assumed by another public agency eligible under the Regulations issued pursuant to the Federal Airport Act, to assume such obligations and having the power, authority, and financial resources to carry out all such obligations. If the management and operation of the airport is relinquished wholly or in part, the sponsor agrees that it will reserve sufficient powers and authority to insure that the airport will be operated and maintained in accordance with the Act and the Regulations.
- O. The sponsor will furnish to the Administrator through the District Airport Engineer within ten days after their exectuion or adoption, three copies of all deeds, leases, operation or management agreements, laws, ordinances, rules and regulations, or other instruments affecting the aeronautical use of the airport. All leases, operation of management agreements, or other instruments affecting the aeronautical use of the airport shall contain a provision that such documents shall be subordinate and subject to the provisions of this agreement.
- p. The sponsor will acquire prior to the commencement of construction the following property interests as shown on the outline survey attached hereto as Exhibit "A"; NE_{4}^{1} of SW_{4}^{1} Sec. 35, T 46 N R 25 W. The sponsor has acquired the following property interests as shown on Exhibit "A": entire Section 2, T 45 NR 25 W and entire Section 35, 46-25, except the NE_{4}^{1} of the SW_{4}^{1} of Said Section 35.

Section 2. In order to satisfy the Administrator that the sponsor is qualified

to sponsor the project under the requirements established by the Act and the Regulations, and to induce the United States to enter into a Grant Agreement with respect to the project, the sponsor does hereby warrant and represent to the United States as follows:

- a. That it holds the following property interests as shown on Exhibit "A"; Entire Section 2, T 45 N, R 25 W and entire Section 35, T 46 N, R 25 W, except the NE of the SWa of said Section 35.
- b. That it has sufficient funds available for that portion of the porject costs which is not to be paid by the United States;
- c. That it has the power and authority, of itself or through an agent, to receive a grant of Federal funds under the Act:
- d. That it has the power and authority to make these assurances and to perform all the covenants, and agreements contained herein;
- e. That it is legally and financially able to operate and maintain the airport and to perform all the covenants contained herein;
- f. That there is no pending litigation or other legal proceeding and no material or relevant fact, which might adversely affect the prosecution of the project, the operation of the airport, or the performance of any of the covenants contained in Sections 1 and 2 hereof, which has not been brought to the attention of the Administrator.
- Section 3. This Agreement shall become effective immediately except that Section 1 hereof shall not be effective until the execution of the Grant Agreement.
- Section 4. If any provision of this agreement or any application thereof shall be held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect any provision or application of this Agreement which can be given effect without the invalid provision or application.
- Section 5. This document constitutes the (sponsor's) assurance as required under Section 9 and 11 of the Act and shall be referred to as the "Sponsor's Assurance Agreement."

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, it has become increasingly apparent that Marquette County is receiving insufficient income from taxes to carry on its various public functions during the calendar year 1948 and in the future, and

WHEREAS, the Budget and Executive Committee of the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County has, over a period of weeks, conferred with various persons, Boards and Committees and other public agencies in said County to find a way to solve the financial problems confronting Marquette County, and

WHEREAS, it is the conclusion of said Budget and Executive Committee and of this Board of Supervisors that the most feasible and equitable way to solve the County's finances is to raise more tax money in Marquette County, and

WHEREAS, it is also the sense and opinion of said Budget and Executive Committee and of this Board of Supervisors that there presently exists gross inequities among tax

valuation between various taxing units in the County; and that there exist similar inequities among tax valuations covering similar properties in the same taxing units; and in some instances there are taxable properties that are presently escaping property taxation entirely, and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion and the conclusion of said Budget and Executive Committee and of this Board of Supervisors that the fairest and most equitable way to resolve any such tax inequities, and at the same time move to increase the tax revenues to the County, is to obtain a county-wide revaluation of all taxable property in the County which is presently subject to valuation by local assessing authorities

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED and ordered by the Board of Supervisors of Marquette County that the State Tax Commission of the State of Michigan be and it is hereby respectfully requested and authorized and empowered to forthwith proceed to revalue all taxable property throughout Marquette County which has heretofore been subject to tax valuations imposed by local taxing authorities; and to further discover and place upon the tax rolls any taxable property that may be found to be presently escaping property taxation entirely; and that all Agencies and Board and Commissions of the County be and they are hereby directed and authorized to cooperate with said State Tax Commission in determining and obtaining such results; and, that Marquette County shall pay for its just share of the cost and expense of such revaluation.

We recommend the adoption of the above resolution.

Gentlemen: - Your County School Committee to whom was referred a Resolution from Allegan County, Michigan, pertaining to County School District Organization begs leave to report the following:

At a meeting held Wednesday, January 7th, the Resolution from Allegan County petitioning the Legislature of the State of Michigan to amend the School District Act was studied in detail.

The New Act Number 269 of the Public Acts of 1947 provides for a County School Board and a County Superintendent of Schools in counties having a population of 15,000 or more. The office of County School Commissioner is abolished by the Act. Proponents of the Resolution would petition the Legislature of the State of Michigan to amend the Act to make it popular referendum before said Act shall become operative in any county of a population of less than 250,000.

After careful study and discussion, it was the opinion of the Committee that the new County School District organization and plan had not been in effect or operation for a sufficient length of time in which to demonstrate its increased efficiency and merit. Your Committee therefore recommends that the Resolution as presented be tabled.

Supper: Always soup, sandwiches with meat left from noon meal.

At every meal coffee and milk is served.

Those inmates employed on the Court House grounds or cleaning the Court House are allowed extra rations.

I consider this program satisfactory and well balanced to the needs of those

inmates. The menus are changed and varied according to the seasons and market conditions.

Gentlemen: - Your Committee on Highways and Bridges and the Board of County Road Commissioners met on June 18, 1948, and considered several petitions referred by your Board.

In the matter of the petition from several residents of Skandia Township requesting that Road OJ be graveled, we find that the work requested has already been done by the Road Commission, and therefore no action on the petition is necessary.

In the matter of the petition for an access road from Road BF to certain properties in West Branch Township, we find that there could be several legal points involved in accuring this righty-of-way, and because of this condition we recommend that the matter be referred to the Road Commission with power to act.

In the matter of the petition from residents of National Mine for a road and parking lot at the Finnish Church, we find that the major part of the work requested is on the church property, which is privately owned. In view of this condition, we recommend that the matter be referred to the Road Commission and the Tilden Township Board, and that an attempt be made to work out a co-operative arrangement with the Township or other interested parties paying for the cost of the work done on private property.

In the matter of the petition requesting plowing on the Ruona Road in Ely Township, we find that this is a private road, and recommend that it be referred to the Road Commission to follow their established practice in providing services on roads of this type.

We recommend concurrence of the Board in the action taken on the above petitions.

The following report of the Morgan Heights Contact Committee was read. Supervisor Wiseman moved its adoption. Supported by Supervisor Lehto and carried.

To Hon. Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette County, Michigan.

Your Morgan Heights Sanatorium Contact Committee met with the Board of Trustees and the Superintendent on June 7, 1948, at the Sanitorium.

Superintendent Acocks led the committee on a thorough inspection of the buildings. Maintainance was found to be good. The badly needed painting, which is to be completed about July 1st, has improved the appearance of the structures.

A two hour discussion on rising costs followed the inspection. The Board of Trustees expressed keen anxiety over rising expenditures. It was shown that general commodity costs had increased approximately 28% and food, which comprises 35 per cent of the budget, had risen 45 per cent since May, 1946. Cost per patient per day for 1947 averaged \$7.74 in comparison with cost of \$5.26 per day for 1946.

The deficit of 1947 was discussed with particular reference to the low patient load and to the costs of replacements, the latter being unobtainable during the past five years. Average occupancy during 1947 was 77 per cent in comparison to 97 per cent for the first five months of 1948.

The impending deficit of 1948 was discussed at length. With the present patient load and at the present prices it was anticipated that the deficit would approximate \$35,000. This figure would be reduced to about \$25,000 if anticipated rises in income became available during the last six months of the year. It was generally agreed that costs would probably continue to rise during the year.

The Committee feels that the Board of Trustees is well aware of their responsibility and that they will take every step possible to operate the Sanitorium efficiently.

WHEREAS, The Sponsor has submitted to the Administrator a Project Application dated February 11, 1948, for a grant of Federal funds for a project for the development of the K. I. Sawyer Airport (herein called the "Airport"), and a Sponsor's Assurance Agreement adopted by the Sponsor under date of December 17, 1947, relating to the operation and maintenance of said Airport, together with plans and specifications for such project, which Project Application and Sponsor's Assurance Agreement are hereby specifically incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, The Administrator has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project"), consisting of the following described airport development:

Clearing and grubbing; grading and drainage of NW/SE, N/S and NE/SW (100 feet by 4,100 feet) and N/S (100 feet by 3,500 feet) runways, taxiway and apron; turfing; furnishing and installing electrical ducts, all as more particularly described in the plans and specifications approved by the Administrator or his duly designated representative, which plans and specifications are incorporated herein and made a part hereof;

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Federal Airport Act (60 Stat. 170; Pub Law 377, 79th Congress), and in consideration of (2) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said project Application and Sponsor's Assurance Agreement, and its acceptance of this Offer, as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the

to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport, as herein provided,

THE ADMINISTRATOR, FOR AND ON BEHALF OF THE UNITED STATES, HEREBY OFFERS AND AGREES to pay, as the United States' share of costs incurred in accomplishing the Project, 50 percentum of all allowable project costs, subject to the following terms and conditions:

- 1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under the Offer shall be \$50,000.00.
 - 2. The Sponsor shall:

(a) begin accomplishment of the Project within a reasonable time after acceptance of this offer, and

(b) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the terms of this offer and the Federal Airport Act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated here in and made a part hereof, and

(c) carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications incorporated herein as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the

Administrator of his duly authorized representatives.

- 3. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the Airport as provided in the Sponsor's Assurance Agreement incorporated herein.
- 4. Any misrepresentation or omission of a material fact by the Sponsor concerning the Project or the Sponsor's authority or ability to carry out the obligations assumed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer shall terminate the obligation of the United States, and it is understood and agreed by the Sponsor in accepting this Offer that if a material fact has been misrepresented or omitted by the Sponsor, the Administrator on behalf of the United States may recover all grant payment made.
- 5. The Administrator reserves the right to amend or withdraw this Offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.
- 6. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.
- 7. The Administrator in tendering this Offer in behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Marquette, Michigan, as principal, and the Michigan Department of Aeronautics, as agent, created by the Agency Agreement of executed by W. A. Gray, pursuant to a resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marquette, adopted on February 20, 1946, and by Floyd E. Evans, Director, Michigan Department of Aeronautics, pursuant to action of the Michigan Aeronautics Commission, taken at a meeting held on January 31, 1947, copy of which Agreement is attached hereto and made a part hereof; the County of Marquette agrees that it will not amend, modify, or terminate said Agency Agreement without the prior approval, in writing, of the Administrator or his designated representative.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this Offer and certification and adoption of the Project Application and Sponsor's Assurance Agreement incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, as provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States and the Sponsor with respect to the accomplishment of the Project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport. Whereas, Section 9 of Chapter 1 of the Probate Code of the State of Michigan provides that "each probate judge shall be disqualified to sit as a court in any hearing or trial which will, or may, involve the validity or interpretation of any will, contract, deed mortgage, bill of sale, note or other document which he has prepared, or in the preparation of which he has assisted, or to the execution of which he acted as a witness; or which involves any contested matter concerning which the probate judge has theretofore advised one or more of the parties to such contest"; and

Whereas, said Section also further provides "such judge shall likewise be disqualified if any register of probate or other employee of his office, appointed or employed by him or by any other probate judge of said County, shall while holding such office, or during such employment, have prepared or assisted in the preparation of any will, contract, deed, mortgage, bill of sale, note, or other document involved in such hearing or trial, or acted as a witness to the execution thereof"; and

Whereas, said provisions were adopted in order to remove our probate judges

from even the suspicion of bias or interest; and

Whereas, a violation or disregard of those provisions naturally leads to the suspicion of such bias or interest and may subject the county to the expense of calling

in a disinterested judge from another county;

Now, Therefore, it is declared to be the sense of this association that all probate judges and resigeres of probate should scrupulously observe the provisions of law quoted above and refuse to counsel or advise any parties who may be interested in any matter pending in their court which is or may be subject to contest, or to prepare any petitions, orders or other pleadings or documents to be used in connection therewith; andbe it further declared to be the sense of this association that its members should gratuitously or for such reasonable sum as the probate court may set in all cases involving hardship.

Your Morgan Heights Contact Committee with all members present met with the Board of Trustees of the Sanatorium, Wednesday, May 11th. We inspected the premises and were well pleased with the general appearance, especially since the painting has been completed.

We were interested to see that the San is being utilized to its fullest capacity, with 87 patients when we were there. There are at present three persons in the County awaiting admission who will have accommodations in the near future. We were informed that 1948 was a record year at the San, with 31, 079 patient days.

We were especially pleased to find that the Sanatorium has been operating in the black in recent months, and that the cost per patient per day was considerably lower than for several years in the past, the figure for the last three months being \$6.88 per day, We are convinced that the Trustees are endeavoring to cooperate with other County agencies in holding expenses down to the minimum in these days of financial stringency. We feel that this is being done without impairment of the services or facilities to the patients.

With regard to recent publicity in connection with the policy of the Trustees and Superintendent concerning x-rays and opinions in connection with diagnosis of tuber-culosis and other chest afflictions, we reviewed the regulations which have been in force since 1944 and which were re-established in December 1947. We are satisfied that there can be no criticism of the established procedure and that if there is any particular which is not clearly outlined the Trustees and the Superintendent are disposed to make any reasonable request.

Gentlemen:- Your Committee on Highways and Bridges and the Board of County Road Commissioners met on June 24, 1949, and considered several petitions referred by your Board.

In the matter of the petition for gravelling all roads in Ewing Township, we find that todo all of the work petitioned for is impossible at this time, but we rec-

commend that the Road Commission attempt to work out a co-operative arrangement with the Ewing Township Board for doing the work, and that when the Township participates in the cost of the work, that the Township designate on which road or roads the work is to be done.

In the matter of the petition from several residents of Princeton requesting improvement of the road to the M. Bianchi home, we find that the work petitioned for was done shortly after the receipt of the petitions, and therefore no action is necessary.

In the matter of the petition requesting that all streets and alleys in the Village of Harvey be built, we recommend that the County Road Commission follow the usual procedure in such cases, and build or improve the streets as the plat is settled.

In the matter of the petition requesting the construction of several streets in Republic, we find that the Road Commission and the Republic Township Board are now working out a joint program to do the work requested, and no further action by this committee is necessary.
