

The Casey Lake Road, (CF, FFG & FNN) was rough graded for 3.5 to various widths.

Grading on the streets of the Plat of Palmer was completed and 80 per cent of the total street mileage or 1.85 miles was covered with crushed gravel to a surface width of 31 feet.

Road 456 to a width of 24 feet was covered with bituminous road surface for a distance of 3.5 miles. This work started at Little Lake and extended approximately to the intersection of Road 545. 3,000 gallons of T-3 tar and 640 tons of cover stone was placed on this project.

Road NB was covered with pit run gravel from road 553 westerly for one-half mile. Sands Township participated in the cost of this work.

Bryan Creek road (CCS) was rough graded to various widths to a distance of 2.45 miles from road 581.

Along the streets of the village of Republic two culverts were reset and cleaned and one culvert was replaced.

The repair work on the washouts caused by the heavy rains of the night of August 30 was completed. This work required the placing of 500 cubic yards of earth fill. These washouts also necessitated the placing of 1,524 cubic yards of pit run gravel on various county road surfaces.

On the court house driveway improvement project, the old heat tunnel between the court house and the jail buildings was removed and the concrete floor for the new tunnel was poured. Forms for the tunnel walls were constructed and ready for placement.

At the K. I. Sawyer Airport the addition to the existing office building was completed. This construction work was completed for a total cost of \$772.33 and doubled the floor space for this building.

In cooperation with the County Forestry Commission, 72,000 Jack Pine trees were placed in Section 25, T 46 N R 25 W.

4.0 miles of surface on Road SI was covered and reshaped with 5,014 cubic yards of pit run gravel.

Road OI was extended for one tenth of a mile and surfaced with 252 cubic yards of pit run gravel.

One thousand, three hundred and thirty tons of cover stone were hauled from Lindberg's gravel pit on Road 480 to Birch in preparation for the sealing of the surface of Road 550 from Eagle's Nest north to half-way. Twenty-six thousand gallons of T-6 tar was ordered for this sealing operation.

On road 550-K, Federal Aid Secondary Project, 9.3 miles of bituminous surface was placed and extensions were added to existing culverts in the locations where the road was raised. In this work 52,000 gallons of T-3 tar, 29,000 gallons of T-6 tar, 1,740 tons of cover stone and 284 lineal feet of corrugated metal pipe culvert were used.

The annual inspection tour of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee of the Board of Supervisors was conducted. The Committee inspected the Court House, Morgan Heights, Ishpeming property of the Commission, County Citizen's Home and the Gwinn Garage of the Road Commission.

The monthly reports of Veteran's Referral Agency, County Treasurer, Dept. of Social Welfare were read and ordered filed.

The monthly report of the County Controller was read in part by Mr. Denny and ordered filed by the Chairman.

A resolution from the Presque Isle County Board of Supervisors urging opposition to the amendment to Act 117 of the P.A. of 1935 was read. This act created a county school district under the control of a County Board of Education. Supervisor Nicholas moved that the resolution be filed, inasmuch as the set up in the County of Marquette was functioning properly and also harmoniously with the Board of Supervisors.

✓ A resolution from the Huron County Board of Supervisors urging that County Parks be exempt, as are the State Parks, from the provisions of Sec. 12 of Act 143 of the P.A. of 1939, was read. The Chairman ordered the matter referred to the Legislative Study Committee.

✓ A resolution from the Iosco County Board of Supervisors urging the Legislature to enact legislation to place titles to undeveloped and unexplored mineral rights on the tax rolls of the various counties was read. This was likewise referred to the Legislative Committee for study by the Chairman.

Supervisor Dwyer moved that the Chairman appoint a committee to draft a resolution of appreciation for the work of Mr. Michaels, retiring member of the Social Welfare Commission. Supported by Supervisor Altobello and carried.

The Chairman appointed Supervisors Allen, Altobello and the Prosecuting Attorney to draft the resolution and gave them a five minute recess.

At this point Supervisor Dwyer addressed the Board and gave the following report.

Mr. Chairman:

At the last meeting of the Board of Supervisors, a motion was made and carried authorizing the expenditure of a flat rate of \$8,500.00 to the Sheriff's Department for the feeding of prisoners. There were two dissenting votes - one of which was mine. At that time, I made the remark that I thought the amount was too much. According to the Mining Journal, I was rebuked by the Chairman with the statement that I was evidently talking about something about which I knew nothing and that under the new set-up, the County would save money.

Later, after thinking the matter over, I still couldn't see where I was wrong, so I started to break down the figure of \$8,500.00 and with your permission, I will read the figures that I arrived at.

At a figure of \$8,500.00 a year for this purpose, simple arithmetic will show that it would cost the County (by the County, I mean the taxpayers), a monthly sum of \$708.33. Breaking this figure down further, it would mean that in case there were no prisoners, the County would be donating a sum of \$23.61 daily to the Sheriff's Department. If there was one prisoner, it would cost \$23.61 to feed him; 2 would cost \$11.82 each; 3 would cost \$7.87; 4 would cost \$5.90; 5 would cost \$4.72; 6 would cost \$3.93½; 7 would cost \$3.37 plus a fraction; 8 would cost \$2.95; 9 would cost \$2.62 1/3; 10 would cost \$2.36; 11 would cost \$2.14 plus; and 12 would cost \$1.96 plus. All of these are per diem charges. I understand that the average number of prisoners varies from 4 to 7 which under the proposed set up would cost from \$5.90 to \$3.37. As the present rate is \$1.20, I do not see where there is any saving.

Now on the other hand, we have a number of children who are being care for by foster parents. These good people receive the sum of \$22.25 per month for the care of these children, who after all are likely to become good American Citizens. This means that these people receive the sum of Seventy-four cents per day. For this amount, they do their washing and provide them with all of the comforts that they themselves enjoy. In this connection, the ones that are in jail are not there for the purpose of sprouting their wings. Frankly, I cannot see the ratio of these figures.

As this \$8,500.00 is not effective until Jan. 1, 1952, I would like to have you gentlemen review these figures and if you have any comment, I would like to hear same. Also, for your information in this connection, the County Clerk in his report to the Auditing Committee just stated that the cost of boarding the jail prisoners for the previous month was \$523.00. I cannot see where the County is saving any money by spending \$708.33, whereas cost of same for the past month was \$523.00.

I am going to ask you gentlemen to check on these figures and if I am wrong, I will stand corrected--otherwise at the next meeting of the Board of Supervisors, I am going to ask the Board to rescind the motion and that the present per diem of \$1.20 for feeding the prisoners remain in effect.




AND WHEREAS, the County of Marquette and the County of Alger are included in said service area

O. A. S. I. RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Social Security Act has been so amended by the Congress of the United States as to permit political sub-divisions of the several states to extend to their employees and officers the benefits of Old Age and Survivors' Insurance, and

WHEREAS, The Michigan Legislature, in regular session enacted Public Act No. 205 to enable political sub-divisions to secure coverage under the Old Age and Survivors' Insurance provisions of Title II of the Federal Security Act as amended, and

WHEREAS, An agreement has been entered into between the State of Michigan and the Federal Security Administrator to extend the benefits of the Federal Old Age and Survivors' Insurance system to employees of the state or any political sub-division thereof.

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, That the governing body of Marquette County, Michigan, hereby elects coverage under the Old Age and Survivors' Insurance, as provided by Act No. 205, Public Acts of 1951.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the County Clerk, be and he is hereby authorized and directed on behalf of Marquette County to enter into agreement with the department for the extension of the benefits under Title II of the Social Security Act subject to the provisions of Sec. 8 of Act 205, Public Acts of 1951.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proper fiscal officers be and they are, hereby authorized to make all required payments into the Contribution Fund established by the said Enabling Act and to establish such system of payroll deductions from the salaries of employees and officers as may be necessary to their coverage under said Old Age and Survivors' Insurance system.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the proper officials of the political sub-division do all things necessary to the continued implementation of said system.

IT IS FURTHER RESOLVED, That any funds payable to the County of Marquette from any department of the State of Michigan may be withheld by said department and transferred to the State Employees' Retirement Board to be used in the payment of any default on the part of Marquette County in accordance with paragraph Vc of the contract between the State of Michigan and Marquette County.

The following positions are hereby designated as those which are to be excluded:
 (a) All employees presently covered by a retirement system; (b) All employees employed to relieve them from unemployment; (c) Employees of a hospital who are inmates or patients thereof; (d) Services of an emergency nature; (e) Part-time employees; (f) Employees paid on a fee basis and the fee portion of the salary received by employee who receives fees for services; (g) Agricultural labor; (h) Students; (i) All elected officers through the period of their current terms.

For the purpose of carrying out the provisions of Title II, Sec. 218 of the Federal Social Security Act and amendments thereof the agreement entered into between the State Agency with the approval of the Attorney General and the Social Security Administrator is made a part of this Resolution and shall be termed as an agreement between this political sub-division and the State Agency and shall become a part of the agreement, or modification of the agreement between the State and the Social Security Administrator.

This Resolution shall be in full force and effect upon passage and approval, for all intents and purposes, except that active coverage shall begin on the 1st day of July or January, 1951.



Gentlemen:

A joint meeting of the Highways and Bridges Committee with the County Road Commission was held at 9:30 A.M., Thursday, January 17, 1952 at the County Road Office, Ishpeming, Michigan.

The purpose of the meeting was the consideration of a petition of the Dead River Sports and Camping Association for a new county road connecting JI and JH crossing sections 12, T 48 N. R. 27 W and Sections 7, 8, 16 and 17, T 48 N. R. 26 W., Negaunee Township, a distance of approximately two and a half miles.

Chairman Stakel and Superintendent Shroeger described in detail the existing situation with regard to the locality, having traveled in car and on foot much of the proposed location and explained the present and future financial structure of the County Road funds. After considerable discussion and questions the committee voted unanimously against recommending the structure of the road, at the present time.

The explanation and discussion that influenced the committee to vote against the petition disclosed the following facts:

1. A preliminary survey and personal visitation by the Road Commission of the territory to be served indicated a probable construction cost of \$25,000 for an ordinary gravel road, over the cheapest route. An alignment nearer the Basin would involve additional grading as well as a \$15,000 bridge.

2. The owner of a one-half mile section to be crossed by proposed road, absolutely refuses to grant a right of way. Condemnation proceedings would be necessary. The owner of another quarter mile stretch will only grant a right of way in the North-South section, which direction takes the road away from the basin. While no estimate has been made of an alternate route to avoid these two properties, it is believed that it would involve a more expensive project or defeat its purpose by being too far from the basin.

3. Only 35 camps would be benefited, whereas there are 139 signatures on the petition.

4. The 1951 legislation regarding state highway funds has changed the amount of state funds allotted to the county for roads from what has formerly been received, as well as changing the purpose and as of the present date, it is not possible to determine accurately what will be received in 1952. Under any circumstances, it is exceedingly

improbable within the next few years, that ^{there} will be sufficient funds available for the proposed roads, unless the money is diverted from that planned for more highly traveled roads.

5. Ishpeming and Negaunee Township boards have already determined where the 1952 road money is to be placed, so no help can be expected from that source.

The morning was spent inspecting the new construction on Road 557 in the Southern part of Forsyth Township where realignment and bridge construction was well under way. The gravel pit and surface graveling operations on road 426 in Wells Township was also inspected. The next stop was at the L. S. & I. railroad crossing at road 480 just east of the City of Negaunee, where Mr. Schroeger explained the two types of black top that had been put on road 480 this season. An inspection of black top operations in progress had been planned but owing to the good weather the work had been completed earlier than expected so there was no opportunity to see this work being done. Lunch was served at the Mather Inn at which Mr. Corneliuson, Chairman of the Board of Supervisors was present.

After lunch, Mr. Schroeger, County Road Superintendent discussed the problems of the Road Commission. The general discussion that followed brought out the following needs, which tend to handicap the operation of the Road Commission:

- 1. Salaries and wages should be raised.
- 2. The necessity of the replacement of the old equipment, most of which is over ten years old. Attention was called to the fact that in 1951, \$71,000 was spent in repairing equipment alone, 38,000 being machinery parts and the balance, \$33,000, in labor and that this amount would probably be exceeded in 1952.
- 3. The need of a portable hot mix bituminous plant owned and operated by the Commission. The cost of such a plant would be approximately \$110,000, which probably could be purchased on the installment plan. Such a plant would produce more than thirty miles of black top on County Roads besides that which may be required by the three municipalities. It was estimated that this asphalt surface could be laid at a better than 50 per cent saving under contract price.

The Highways and Bridges Committee wishes to commend in the highest terms the splendid work that the Road Commission, the Superintendent and all the employees are doing on the county roads.

The Highways and Bridges committee recommends that wholehearted support be given to any plan for the purchase of highway equipment, wage increases or a hot mix bituminous plant that may be proposed by the Commission.

There being no further business to discuss, the meeting was adjourned at 2:45 P.M.

Gentlemen:

Your Legislative Committee has had under consideration the resolution from Ogemaw County in regard to the reservation of minerals by the State of Michigan upon the sale of land received for non-payment of taxes, and wish to report that your Committee found considerable merit in the resolution. The law providing for such reservation of mineral rights was adopted in 1909 and it has been learned that the State received since 1927 income from leases in an amount exceeding \$14,000,000.00 and that for the last five years, the annual income has been around \$1,000,000.00. The Supreme Court of the State of Michigan has held that the law is constitutional, but there is considerable difference of opinion as to the policy whereby the State reserves these mineral rights.

It does not appear to this Committee that the solution of the problem and that the recommendation contained in the Ogemaw resolution is necessarily the correct one.

Your Committee therefor, recommends that this Board take action in favor of a study of the problem by the Michigan State Association of Supervisors, with the thought in mind that this Association might be able to make some satisfactory recommendation to the Legislature covering the subject matter.

Your Committee further recommends that a copy of this report be sent to the Michigan Association of Supervisors and also copies mailed to the Representative and Senator from this district.

WHEREAS, the present type of bituminous road surface construction within the Marquette County certified road system has proven to be unstable and will not adequately withstand the present traffic loads and spring break-up conditions, and

WHEREAS, the cost and labor and equipment time consumed in patching and repairing the existing bituminous road surfaces have definitely limited the amount of improvements that have been made in the Marquette County Road system, and

WHEREAS, the continuance of the existing type of bituminous construction will result in the spending of increasing amounts of labor time, equipment time, and dollars each year in the patching of road surfaces only and will definitely decrease the number of miles of new bituminous construction each year, and

WHEREAS, the Road Commission believes that the solution to these problems is the purchase of a modern, portable hot mix bituminous plant with necessary accessories and haul trucks, which will produce a better and more durable bituminous road surface that will not only greatly reduce future patching and general maintenance costs but will have a smoother riding qualities, and

WHEREAS, THE revenues of the Road Commission will not permit the purchase of the above mentioned equipment, and,

Whereas the purchase of the above necessary described equipment will amount to approximately \$150,000.00, payment for which may be made in five equal annual payments, and

WHEREAS, the Road Commission will pay any interest that may arise out of a time purchase plan as described above,

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that for proper and progressive road construction and maintenance in Marquette County and to more adequately serve the people of Marquette County with better roads, the Board of Supervisors for Marquette County hereby provides the Marquette County Road Commission with an additional \$150,000.00 in five annual payments of \$30,000.00 each, the first of which shall be turned over to the Marquette County Road Commission on purchase of the equipment in 1953 and the succeeding payments each year thereafter for four years.

The new construction at Morgan Heights Sanatorium was inspected. It was noted that the framing and exterior were completed and that construction crews are presently engaged in interior masonry and plumbing.

Your Committee then proceeded to the site of the new bituminous plant and inspected the plant in actual operation. A further inspection was made of the black top paving project on County Road 553. Operations were carried out very efficiently and the Committee was pleased to see the purchase of the plant is proving to be a major step forward in the County Road Commission program.

The County Road Commission buildings at Gwinn and Skandia were visited and found in excellent condition.

An inspection of the County Citizen's Home was made and found to be clean and in good condition; however, it was suggested that the fire escape be painted to prevent deterioration. It was also noted that the compressor in the boiler room was noisy and in need of repair.

The County Court House was visited next where it was brought to the attention of the Committee that the office equipment of the Probate Judge is inadequate. It is recommended that the purchase of a new desk, table and steel shelves be authorized to correct this situation.

The County Jail was inspected and found in excellent condition. The first and second floors have been recently painted and it is recommended that this painting program be continued on the third and fourth floors and in the basement of the Sheriff's dwelling.

The Juvenile Detention Home was found to be clean and well kept, however, it was noted that certain repairs are necessary. It is recommended that the linoleum top on the kitchen cabinets be replaced and that the loose plaster in the kitchen be repaired. It was also found that the bathroom plumbing is badly worn and that the hot water tank should be transferred from the kitchen to the basement.



Gentlemen:

Your Committee on Education met with your County Board of Education for the purpose of visiting the schools of Marquette County. Upon inspection we found that most of the suggestions made two years ago by this group had brought results.

Some of these suggestions and results obtained from them were:

1. Improvement in the classroom lighting was suggested. As a result many of the schools had redecorated the walls and ceiling in light colors. The dark oil stain had been removed and the floors finished in natural color or light colored linoleums installed. In many schools new lighting systems were installed or were to be installed in the near future.
2. Sanitation improvement had been suggested. These conditions were much improved.
3. A number of schools had improved their school libraries as a result of the previous suggestions.
4. A definite improvement in some school curriculum was a direct result of suggestions made earlier.
5. In several instances school rooms had been refurnished with light furniture, heating systems had been improved or new ones had been installed; and ventilation had also been improved. All of this contributed to the comfort and well being of the pupils and teachers.

We still found some schools in which conditions need improvement. These conditions concern sanitation especially. In a few instances safety conditions need improvement. For example: In places where fuel oil was being used for heating purposes, the tanks, in some places, were placed just outside of the school. Some of these storage tanks had faulty connections and dripped oil. This could be exceedingly dangerous to the safety of the school and its pupils.

We believe many of these below standard schools would benefit much by transporting their pupils to other schools. We found that many of these schools owned their own buses because they brought in pupils from out lying areas.

Their routes of travel were over very good roads. We believe that transportation to other areas or districts would much improve conditions for the pupils and save money for the districts.

It is our belief that much could be accomplished along this transportation line if the County Board of Education would meet with the local Boards of Education to explain the values of transportation to other standard schools and help them work out these problems of improvement.

of AIR FORCE base facilities, which are now owned by the County of Marquette, or said Board of Supervisors of Marquette County will lease the lands designated above to the United States Government or represented authority thereof at a nominal cost of \$1.00 for a period of 25 years, with an option in the United States Government or represented authority thereof to renew said lease for an additional 25 years, subject to certain reversionary rights in the County of Marquette in the event the AIR FORCE abandons its use of these facilities.

2. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate in providing adequate aviation easements as indicated in AIR FORCE regulations 86-3 and more specifically to particularly cooperate in providing adequate easements in those areas included on the map which is attached hereto and made a part of this resolution and colored green.

3. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate with the AIR FORCE authorities in passing zoning ordinances where it is possible for them to do so to further protect the aviation easements required by the AIR FORCE as indicated in its regulations as numbered aforesaid.

4. That insofar as it is possible, the Board of Supervisors will make an effort to provide any additional easements which may be required by the AIR FORCE in the establishment of its installation for access roads and utility lines.

5. That it will be recognized by the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette that either under the terms of its fee simple donation or lease of properties to the UNITED STATES AIR FORCE for their installation, that the UNITED STATES AIR FORCE will have the use and control of the Airport facilities, subject to continued use of the Airport facilities as tenants of the UNITED STATES AIR FORCE by commercial carriers now operating from said Airport, or contracting with said AIR FORCE for its use in the future; it is also recognized that all landing fees paid for the use of such Airport facilities will be payable to the United States Government under the terms of AIR FORCE regulations 87-7.

6. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate insofar as it is possible to have the private companies now furnishing gas, electricity, telegraph and telephone services to said Airport, to furnish such additional facilities as will be required; it is understood that this is intended to accommodate not only the K. I. Sawyer Airport but the personnel who are to be attached to the unit assigned to the AIR FORCE base when established.

7. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate to whatever extent is possible in assisting the AIR FORCE in obtaining adequate additional water supplies and an adequate sewage system for the Airport facilities as well as the personnel who are to be attached to the unit assigned to said Airport; that the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate to whatever extent is possible in making transportation by bus, air and railroad to and from the Cities of Negaunee, Marquette and Ishpeming and the Townsite of Gwinn, and the Airport in order to meet the needs of the personnel stationed at the AIR FORCE BASE in question.

8. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette insofar as possible will cooperate with the AIR FORCE in the removal of anything that is considered a flight hazard by the AIR FORCE and in the prevention of the installation or construction of any further flight hazards in the area required by the AIR FORCE for its operations.

9. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate with the AIR FORCE insofar as it is possible in assisting the AIR FORCE personnel and their families in finding housing facilities wherever it is necessary; that the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate insofar as is possible in providing the necessary school facilities for those dependents of the military personnel who will be stationed at the aforementioned AIR FORCE base.

10. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate insofar as is possible in providing the necessary medical facilities for the dependents of those men who will be stationed at the aforementioned air base.

11. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette, as individuals, will cooperate insofar as is possible in having the churches of all denominations in the Cities of Marquette, Ishpeming and Negaunee and the Townsite of Gwinn accept the military personnel as well as their dependents as members and welcome guests of their churches; that it is expected that the ministers and clergymen connected with the aforementioned churches will make determined efforts to have the AIR FORCE men and their families made welcome in their various congregations.

12. That the Board of Supervisors for the County of Marquette will cooperate insofar as is possible in having the military personnel connected with the air base and their families accepted as active participants in the cultural and recreational life in the various communities within Marquette County.

13. That the data contained herein has been especially prepared at the suggestion of Colonel Merrill DeLonge, Headquarters, U.S.A.F., as evidence of Marquette County's interest in the proposed plans for the future use of the K. I. Sawyer Airport by the AIR FORCE and hope that it can be considered as a pledge of Marquette County's cooperation to the fullest extent in bringing this matter to a successful conclusion.





Gentlemen:

Since the revaluation of the County of Marquette in 1949 by the State Tax Commission, the County has assumed the function of preparing and correcting descriptions on the tax rolls of the nineteen townships. This system, with complete addressograph facilities was established as the Tax Department at a considerable expenditure of time and money and is undoubtedly intended to be continued and improved upon.

The original system was set up by Mr. William Ottmann of the County Road Commission and was under his direction until he was recalled by the County Road Commission in the latter part of 1951. In November of 1951 the operation of the tax department was made the duty of the Assistant Controller and this arrangement has been in effect to the present time.

However, because the position of Assistant Controller no longer exists, it is apparent that some other provision must now be made for the proper preparation of the township tax rolls.

It is my opinion that the employment of a person to assume charge of the Tax Department is a matter deserving your prompt attention. Such a person could be of great value not only in preparing tax rolls but also in eventually assisting Supervisors in all phases of taxation, when such assistance is requested.







Should the Department of Conservation advise us that they do not wish to make these lands available for farming, there would be no necessity for rezoning the area and your committee has, therefore, directed a communication to Mr. Gerald E. Eddy, Director of Conservation at Lansing, to clarify this point. To date, no reply has been received from Mr. Eddy and your committee requests an extension of time for a recommendation in the matter.
