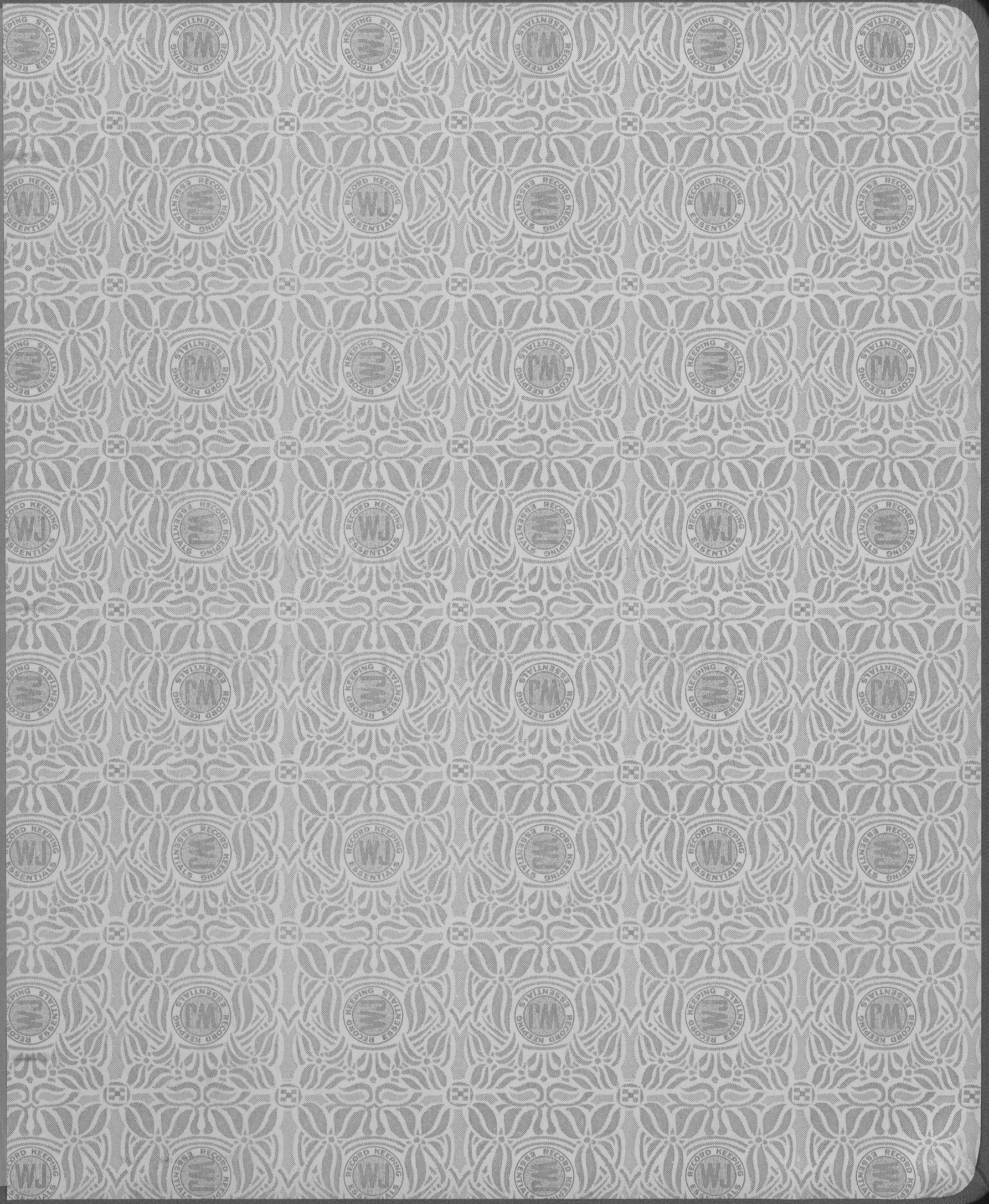


**PROCEEDINGS OF

January 18, 1956

The Board of Supervisors of Marquette County met pursuant to a call duly made at the Court House in the City of Marquette, on Wednesday, the 18th day of January, A. D. 1956 at 2:00 o'clock p.m.

Supervisor Bouley moved the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting. Supported by Supervisor Rautio and carried.

✓ A letter with attached resolution from Mr. Shroeger of the Road Commission relative to Social Security coverage for county road employes was read. Mr. Shroeger requested the Board to adopt the resolution. Supervisor Dompierre moved the adoption of the resolution. Supported by Supervisor Rose and carried. The resolution follows:

Whereas, pursuant to the authorization of the Governor, a referendum has been held among the employes who are members of a retirement plan maintained by the county road commission in Marquette County, and

Whereas, the majority of the employes of the said road commission voted in favor of social security coverage, and

Whereas, the Governor has certified to the Secretary of Health, Education, and Welfare that the referendum indicated an affirmative vote of more than 50 per cent of the employes of the road commission was cast in the referendum,

Therefore Be It Resolved That the Board of Supervisors, governing body of Marquette County, hereby request a modification of its social security agreement covering the employes of said county, so as to include the employes of the county road commission under the same conditions as set up in the original Plan and Agreement, said coverage to be effective January 1, 1955.

Letters from the V.F.W. Tounsignant - Ramile Auxiliary No. 5670, Gwinn, Marquette County Industrial Union Council, Beacon and Local No. 2656 of the United Steelworkers of America C.I.O.-A.F.L., Ishpeming, urging adoption of the Surplus Commodities program were read.

The Chairman stated the Budget and Executive Committee of the Board had studied the matter and were ready to report their recommendation and asked the Clerk to read the following report:

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan  
Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee to whom was referred the Surplus Commodities Distribution Problem, wishes to report that this matter was studied at a meeting of your committee held on January 9, 1956. At that meeting, Mr. Engleman of the State Surplus Commodities Board went over the provisions governing the distribution of these commodities again and it now appears that there is a

possibility the operation of this program by the Social Welfare Department may pay its way by reducing the number of claims for direct relief which otherwise would be made.

Your Committee wishes to recommend that the Board of Supervisors approve the negotiation of a contract between the Social Welfare Department and the Surplus Commodities Board for the distribution of these commodities on a trial basis.

Marquette County, Mich.  
Gentlemen:

In connection with the construction of a new civil airport in Negaunee Township it will be necessary to purchase several tracts of land. The Superintendent of the Marquette County Road Commission and the Controller have contacted the property owners involved and reported to a joint meeting of your Budget and Executive Committee and Special Airport Committee which was held on January 9, 1956.

We find that it will be necessary to purchase the following described lands:

The North ½ of the Northwest Quarter of Section 28, Township

48 North, Range 26 West.

The Southwest ¼ of the Northeast ¼ of Section 28, Township 48 North, Range 26 West.

The East ½ of the Northwest ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 21, Township 48 North, Range 26 West.

The West ½ of the Northeast ¼ of the Southeast ¼ of Section 21, Township 48 North, Range 26 West.

The South ½ of the Southeast ¼ of the Southwest ¼ of Section 21, Township 48 North, Range 26 West.

That part of the S.E. ¼ of the Southwest ¼ of Section 22, Township 48 North, Range 26 West lying west of County Road JJN containing approximately 26 acres.

The above described parcels of land may be purchased for a total of \$15,640.00 by Marquette County and the expenditure will be reimbursed from Federal Government Funds allocated for the construction of a civil airport in Negaunee Township to replace our present facilities at K. I. Sawyer Airport. While there are lands in this area on which height control easements are still to be acquired, there are no other parcels which the county would be required to purchase outright in connection with this airport construction.

Your Budget and Executive Committee and Special Airport Committee jointly recommend that the Board of Supervisors authorize the purchase of these lands for the sum of \$15,640.00 and to file a claim for reimbursement of that amount of Federal funds.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

In connection with the operation of the proposed new civil airport in Negaunee Township it will be necessary for the County of Marquette to secure easement to control the height of objects on certain adjacent lands. Approximately 100 acres of these adjoining lands are owned by the Cleveland Cliffs Iron Co. and they have expressed their willingness to give easement to Marquette County to control the height of objects, including timber growth, on these lands at an annual easement fee of \$1.00 per acre. They have also indicated a willingness to sell the lands to the County if the County desires to purchase same. The following described lands are involved:

The Northeast quarter of the Southwest quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 29, Township 48 North, Range 25 west, containing 10 acres.

The North half of the Southeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 29 Township 48 North, Range 25 west, containing 20 acres.

The east half of the Southeast quarter of the Northwest quarter of Section 28, Township 48 North, Range 25 west, containing 20 acres.

The northeast quarter of the Northeast quarter of Section 21, Township 48 North, Range 25 west containing 40 acres.

The South half of the South half of the Southeast quarter of the Southeast quarter of Section 16, Township 48 North, Range 25 West containing 10 acres.

A joint meeting of the Budget and Executive Committee and the Special Airport Committee was held on January 9, 1956 and this matter was discussed. Your committees jointly recommend to the Board of Supervisors that Marquette County secure a 99 year easement on the above described lands at an annual rental of \$100.00 with option to purchase these lands during the term of the easement, providing the Cleveland Cliffs Iron Co. will include such option in the easement. Since no part of the airport construction will be on these lands, it is believed to be in the best interests of the county to secure the easement rather than invest in the actual purchase of these tracts of land.

Gentlemen:

During the negotiations with U.S. Air Force officials regarding the K. I. Sawyer Airport, the County of Marquette was requested to eventually provide a site adjacent to the airport area for the construction of family housing units. The U. S. Corps of Engineers have now requested title in fee simple to the following described lands:

SW $\frac{1}{4}$  of Section 31, T 46 N, R 24 W and the N $\frac{1}{2}$  of NW 1-4 of Section 6, T 45 N, R 24 W, containing 240 acres.

Marquette County has only surface rights in this parcel having obtained it from the State of Michigan without mineral rights and without the right to reconvey. The Lands Division of the Department of Conservation has tentatively agreed that an exchange of equivalent acreage can be made so that the County of Marquette may be in a position to give title in fee simple to the Corps of Engineers on lands they desire for the building site. In order to accomplish this, however, the Conservation Department has requested that deed to the surface rights in these lands be given to the State of Michigan and they

will then issue deed in fee simple to Marquette County in exchange for fee simple title to equivalent acreage of county owned lands. A check of county owned lands has been made by the County Road Commission office and it has been suggested that the following described 240 acre parcel be deeded to the State of Michigan as an exchange item:

NW 1-4 and the NW 1-2 of the NE 1-4 of Section 3, T 45 N, R 25W.

It is requested, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors authorize the transfers listed above as well as the eventual transfer of the family housing site to the U. S. Corps of Engineers and that the proper county officials be authorized to execute the necessary instruments to accomplish this.

The following report of the Budget & Executive Committee was read. Supervisor Bouley moved it be adopted as read. Supported by Supervisor Carlson and carried.

 Your Budget and Executive

Committee, to whom was referred the Sheriff's 1955 annual report, wishes to report that the matter was studied at a meeting of your committee held on March 15, 1956. The report is well detailed and reflects the keeping of good systematic records. We find, however, the following statements which we believe incorrect or which should be clarified:

1. On page 5 of the report it is stated that the flag pole was painted and the spray of paint caused by a high wind damaged several cars. Since the maintenance work is done at the Court House by jail inmates, your committee would like to point out that the pole was not painted; rather the flag hoisting chain was given a coat of aluminum paint to prevent rusting. Spray falling on three cars parked on Spring street was cleaned by Mr. Summersett and his son and two cars washed the following morning by inmates. On one of the two cars cleaned by inmates, the spray spots were so few and small that the owner had not even noticed them but the car was washed to assure no later claim.

2. On page 8 of the report the statement is made that changes at the jail required by the State Jail Inspector, as outlined in a letter to the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors, have not yet been authorized. Since the letter was addressed to the Chairman and not the Board, the Chairman submitted the same at the September 13, 1955 meeting of the Budget and Executive Committee. The Jail Inspector stated in his communication that there were not half enough coveralls for the inmates. A check of this matter was made and it was found that no requisition for additional coveralls was made by the Sheriff's Department to the purchasing Department until September 13th and when the requ-

sition was made, the order was placed immediately. The Jail Inspector's complaint was registered two weeks earlier than date of the requisition and should, therefore, not have been made at all as no request had even been made by the Sheriff's Department for the additional supply.

The Jail Inspector also stated that he had previously written the Board about moving the main light control panel from inside of the jail. On August 27, 1952, the Board of Supervisors adopted a report from its Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee which read in part as follows: "Light panel was not moved on first floor of Jail. Your Committee found that all that was necessary was to have a new lock and keys made. This installation was made." The following year, on August 19, 1953 a communication was received by the Board of Supervisors from the State Jail Inspector stating that the County Jail was in excellent condition. Your committee feels therefore, that the recommendation of the building, Grounds and Insurance Committee was proper and should be retained.

The Jail Inspector also stated that "The entire electrical circuit within the jail should be checked by a competent electrician, as we found some of the circuits overloaded." Your Budget and Executive Committee directed the Controller to have an inspection made of the wiring in the jail. At a later meeting of your committee the Controller reported that the Marquette City Electrical inspector had made a complete inspection of the wiring in the jail and had filed a written statement on his inspection. The inspection report, dated September 25, 1955 ends with the following statement by the electrical inspector: "I can offer no recommendations for improvement of the electrical layout as everything seems to be in order.

3. Mention is made in several paragraphs of the Sheriff's report that bills for the transportation of prisoners from Justice Court to the Jail and bills for the payment of fees for issuing drivers' licenses are not submitted to him for approval. The Auditing Committee has always looked to the Prosecuting Attorney for approval of bills that result from Justice Court cases, whether they involve court costs or transporting of prisoners as a result of a court case and we can find no reason to alter the system. Bills for the issuance of license fees are checked in the Controller's office where copies of the officer's reports to the State are on file. We can find no reason to alter this system either as it is a complete and accurate check.

4. On Pages 10, 11 and 14 of the Sheriff's report, he questions the Board's action in paying fees to the Deputy Sheriff at Gwinn and at Michigamme for issuing drivers' licenses and stated that the Board has never explained its reasons for making refunds to these two examiners while refusing to authorize refunds to other examiners. The only other examiners involved would be the Sheriff and his staff. At the January, 1955 meeting of the Audit Committee, the Sheriff submitted a bill in the sum of \$878.00 for refunds on drivers' license fees. The Audit Committee discussed the matter with the Sheriff and did not allow the bill. The Audit Committee informed the Sheriff that the Sheriff has never been allowed these fees in the past for the reason that the licenses are issued by full time employees of the County on County time. Billings for license fees issued by the Deputy Sheriff at Gwinn and Michigamme are honored as they are not employees of the County, and, therefore receive no salary from the County for their services. They are paid the exact amount of refund from the State on those licenses

actually issued by them.

5. Objection was made by the Sheriff to the charging of other miscellaneous fees to his department. Miscellaneous fees have always been charged to the Sheriff's Department and have been taken into consideration at budget time in establishing the department budget. Since fees are part of his earnings and are, therefore, a cost of maintaining the Sheriff's Department, they properly should be charged to that department.

6. On page 13 of the report, suggestion is made that the detention Home accounting be separated from the Jail. Because the new State law provides for separate accounting on county expenditures for neglected children, this matter will be automatically adjusted by charging Detention Home expenditures to the Child Care Fund on and after April 1, 1956.

7. On page 12 of the report, the Sheriff again recommends the appointment of a special committee to handle problems of his department. This matter has been before the Board of Supervisors in the past and the Sheriff, as well as all County Officers has been advised that the Budget and Executive Committee is always available for discussion of any problem involving any of the County departments. On Page 14 of the report the statement is made that requests of the Sheriff for permission to appear before the Budget and Executive Committee to discuss certain problems have been disregarded. To the knowledge of your committee the Sheriff has never been denied an audience on any matter. Your Budget and Executive Committee wishes to restate that it will grant audience to any county officer or any county problem.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

At a meeting of your Budget & Executive Committee held on March 15, 1956, the matter of establishing a Child Care Fund was discussed. New State law requires that on and after April 1, 1956, expenditures for children placed in State institutions shall be divided between the State and the County of Commitment. Prior to that date, the State pays all of the expenses involved at State institutions. However, on and after April 1, 1956, the State will share in the cost of maintaining the dependent children who are wards of the county. Until this time, the County has been paying the initial cost of support for these children.

The law now requires that a Child Care Fund be established from which to draw all payments for dependent and delin-

quent children, whether placed in foster homes or in institutions so as to simplify the accounting between the County and State on matching funds. Your Committee recommends that the Child Care Fund be established in an amount equivalent to unexpended balance of the Neglected Children's Fund Budget balance as of April 1, 1956. This involves only a bookkeeping entry to change the name of the fund.

Your Conservation Committee to whom was referred a communication from the Historical Society of Michigan, School Activities Council, proposing that a lake renaming project be undertaken within the county, wishes to report that this matter was discussed at a meeting of your committee held on May 17, 1956. It is recommended that no action be taken on the proposition for the following reasons:

1. To rename lakes so that there would be no duplication within the State of Michigan, the program would necessarily have to be conducted at the State level as all Michigan counties would be involved to accomplish the purpose of the project.

2. No complaint has originated within the county on the use of the present lake names and we do not believe that any confusion actually exists in this matter within our county.

3. A project to rename lakes within the county would entail countless corrections of our records in the Register of Deeds office and in the Tax Roll Department where a large percentage of land descriptions include the names of our lakes. It is felt that this costly expense would not be warranted.

Section I. That the County of Marquette shall enter into a Grant Agreement for the purpose of obtaining Aid in development of the Marquette County Airport, Marquette, Michigan, and that such Grant Agreement shall be set forth hereinbelow.

Whereas, the Sponsor has submitted to the Administrator Project Application dated July 24, 1956 for a grant of Federal funds for a project for development of the Marquette County Airport (herein called the "Airport"), together with plans and specifications for such project which Project Application, as approved by the Administrator is hereby incorporated herein and made a part hereof; and

Whereas, the Administrator has approved a project for development of the Airport (herein called the "Project") consist-

ing of the following described airport development:

"Land acquisition; construct terminal building with utilities including water well." All as more particularly described in the property map and plans and specifications incorporated in said Project Application;

Now Therefore, pursuant to and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of the Federal airport act (60 Stat. 170 pub law 377, 79th Congress), and in consideration of (a) the Sponsor's adoption and ratification of the representations and assurances contained in said Project Application and its acceptance of this Offer, as hereinafter provided, and (b) the benefits to accrue to the United States and the public from the accomplishment of the project and the operation and maintenance of the Airport, a herein provided,

The Administrator, For and On Behalf of the United States Hereby Offers and Agrees to pay, as the United States' share of costs incurred in accomplishing the project 50 percentum of all allowable project costs, subject to the following terms and conditions:

1. The maximum obligation of the United States payable under this offer shall be \$45,000.

2. The Sponsor shall

a. begin accomplishment of the Project within a reasonable time after acceptance of this Offer, and

b. Carry out and complete the project in accordance with the terms of this offer, and the Federal Airport act and the Regulations promulgated thereunder by the Administrator in effect on the date of this Offer, which Act and Regulations are incorporated herein and made a part hereof, and

c. Carry out and complete the Project in accordance with the plans and specifications and

property map incorporated here in as they may be revised or modified with the approval of the Administrator or his duly authorized representatives.

3. The Sponsor shall operate and maintain the airport as provided in the Project Application incorporated herein.

4. The Administrator having determined that no space in airport buildings will be required by any civil agency of the United States for the purpose set forth in Paragraph 9 of Part II of the Project Application that provisions of said paragraph shall be deemed to be of no force or effect.

5. Any misrepresentation of omission of a material fact by the Sponsor concerning the project or the Sponsor's authority or ability to carry out the obligations assumed by the Sponsor in accepting this offer shall terminate the obligation of the United States, and it is understood and agreed by the Sponsor in accepting this offer, that if a material fact has been misrepresented or omitted by the Sponsor the Administrator on behalf of the United States may recover all grant payments made.

6. The Administrator reserves the right to amend or withdraw this offer at any time prior to its acceptance by the Sponsor.

7. This Offer shall expire and the United States shall not be obligated to pay any of the allowable costs of the Project unless this Offer has been accepted by the Sponsor within 60 days from the above date of Offer or such longer time as may be prescribed by the Administrator in writing.

8. It is understood between the parties hereto that any reference herein or in the Project Application to Plans and Specifications shall mean the plans and specifications approved by Archie W League, Chief Airports Division, Region 3, Civil

Aeronautics Administration, on August 15, 1956

9. The Administrator, in tendering this Offer on behalf of the United States, recognizes the existence of an agency relationship between the County of Marquette, Michigan, as principal and the Michigan Department of Aeronautics as Agent, created by the Agency Agreement entered into respectively between the said parties on February 20, 1946, and January 31 1947, copy of which Agreement is attached to the Project Application, dated February 11, 1948, in Project No. 9-20-021-701 and made a part of this Grant Agreement by reference. The Sponsor agrees that it will not amend, modify or terminate said Agency Agreement without the prior approval, in writing, of the Administrator or his duly designated representative, and further represents that said Agency Agreement is in full force and effect at the time of the acceptance of this Grant Offer.

10. The sponsor hereby covenants that it will not permit or suffer any structure or object, except such structures as are necessary as aids to air navigation, nor will it permit or suffer any use or activity which would attract or bring together an assembly of persons, on any land owned by it or hereafter acquired lying within a zone 1,000 feet wide and extending outwardly 2,700 feet from the end of such runways.

11. It is understood and agreed between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make nor shall it be obligated to make the final grant payment hereunder until the sponsor has furnished to the Administrator satisfactory records of the cost of the sponsor of the following items included in the plans and specifications which are ineligible items for Federal Participation:

- a. Two 15" clocks.
- b. The two - compartment sink in Room 11
- c. Two waste baskets in Room 8 and two waste baskets in Room 7.
- d. The mill work comprising the inserts in the airline counters.
- e. The equipment for the public address system listed on Sheet 18 of the plans.

12. It is understood and agreed between the parties hereto that the United States shall not pay, nor be obligated to pay, all or any part of the cost of all items listed in the alternate bid noted as Alternate No. 1 in the specifications hereinabove referred to and approved by Archie W. League, Chief, Airports Division, Region 3, Civil Aeronautics Administration, on August 15, 1956

13. It is understood and agreed between the parties hereto that the United States shall not make nor be obligated to make any grant payment pertaining to the cost of acquiring land under this project until the sponsor has submitted evidence satisfactory to the Administrator that it has completed construction of the E-W and N-S runways and has further submitted evidence satisfactory to the Administrator that it has vacated a road shown on exhibit A attached to the Project Application as County Road JP where said road crosses parcels 1, 8 and 10 delineated on said Exhibit A.

The Sponsor's acceptance of this offer and ratification and adoption of the Project Application incorporated herein shall be evidenced by execution of this instrument by the Sponsor, as hereinafter provided, and said Offer and acceptance shall comprise a Grant Agreement, as provided by the Federal Airport Act, constituting the obligations and rights of the United States and the Sponsor with respect to the accomplishment of the project and the opera-

tion and maintenance of the Airport. ervised. County officials who have the responsibility of maintaining the various buildings are to be commended for the manner in which they maintain these buildings.

Your Committee wishes to recommend to the Board of Supervisors that in order to simplify the handling of the numerous policies for insurance coverage on the Court House and Jail Group that the coverage be handled in the future through the Marquette County Association of Insurance Agents.

Your Committee wishes to further recommend that the following improvements be scheduled for completion as funds become available:

COURT HOUSE

1. Redecorate the entire interior of the building.
2. Replace obsolete office furniture and equipment and acquire needed additional filing equipment in the offices of the County Clerk, County Treasurer and Probate Court.
3. Remove the ornamental lights at the east entrance to the building as these fixtures are beyond repair and constitute a hazard.
4. Replace doors on both rest rooms reserved for juries so as to afford more privacy.

JAIL and SHERIFF'S RESIDENCE

1. Repair floor covering in the kitchen.
2. Replace bathroom fixtures and repair floor covering in the bathroom on the second floor of the Sheriff's residence.

DETENTION HOME

1. Install shower in the basement and replace bath room fixtures on second floor.
2. Paint exterior of the building or have it covered with asbestos shingles.

CITIZENS HOME

1. Renew outside steps on the west side of the building.
2. Renew flooring in the living room.
3. Replace wooden benches in the living room with comfortable chairs.

Gentlemen:

The annual inspection of the Parks and Airport Contact Committee was made on September 10, 1956 and your committee wishes to submit the following report:

#### Marquette County Airport

Construction of this airport is proceeding to the satisfaction of the County Airport Commission. The underground drainage and utility systems have been installed, grading of the runways is almost completed and construction has now been ordered for the administration building. It is already apparent that the county will have an exceptionally fine airport when completed.

During winter months of operation, snow removal equipment will be required at the airport in order to provide uninterrupted service and the County Airport Commission has recommended that the Board of Supervisors consider the purchase of a truck and plow to be stationed at the airport. This Committee recommends that the Board give favorable consideration to this equipment purchase. It is probable that the snow plowing equipment will not be needed until the winter season of 1957-58 and will cost in the neighborhood of \$20,000.00

Your Committee discussed the matter of hangar space rental with the Airport Commission and it was found that they have had considerable difficulty in handling these rentals with private individuals. It is believed that it would be more profitable to the County and an easier way of administering the hangar rental if the County Airport Commission leased the building to a private person or corpor-

ation so as to get the County out of the hangar rental business. Your Committee recommends that the decision on hangar rental be left to the County Airport Commission and that the Board of Supervisors approve their action if the building is leased as one unit.

#### Perkins Park

The general condition and cleanliness of the park indicates very good management of this area. Attendance at this park is on the increase and with the completion of the new highway to Big Bay, it is expected that park attendance here will grow steadily. Your Committee feels that since VanRiper Park is no longer a financial obligation of the county that funds will probably be available within the years ahead to make the improvements to this park that have long been waiting. The County Park Commission have made the following plans for improvements of Perkins Park and Your Committee wishes to recommend the support of these improvements as time and funds permit:

1. Bring running water into the area.
2. Install a sewage disposal system.
3. Develop a new bathing area just south of the present bathing area. The present area is subject to constant erosion and is a serious maintenance problem.
4. Provide more facilities for trailer parking.
5. Provide additional tables in the picnic area.

✓ The following report of the Highway & Bridges Committee was read. Supervisor Larson moved its adoption. Supported by Supervisor York and carried.

September 25, 1956

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan.

Gentlemen:

The Highway and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour on September 24, 1956 and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1956 season.

The paving project on County Road No. 550 covers approximately 22 miles from the Village of Big Bay south to Harlow Creek and the work is being done on a share basis with the Federal Government at a total cost of \$183,000.00. In addition to the actual paving operations for this project it was necessary for the Board of County Road Commissioners

to make extensive base improvements to insure a long life for the new paved surface and this work was completed at a cost of approximately \$70,000.00. Due to the extremely wet weather this project is about 6 weeks behind schedule and completion is expected during the first week in October.

Another section of County Road No. 550 is being rebuilt under contract with A. Lindberg and Sons and in co-operation with the Federal Government. This project is two and a quarter miles in length and extends from Harlow Creek south to Sugar Loaf Landing. The project is very rugged in nature and provides practically a new routing throughout its entire length. The contract price for this project is \$112,000.00 and will not provide any hard type paving. Unforeseen conditions encountered in construction will probably raise the final cost to about \$123,000.00. The contractor will complete his work by November 15, 1956 and bituminous paving for this section of road will be placed during the next construction season.

During this season, Township co-operation projects were confined for the most part to Powell and Wells Townships. In co-operation with the Powell Township Board the Road Commission has agreed to construct approximately ten miles of bituminous aggregate surface paving at a cost to the Township of \$23,000.00. Seven miles of this project has not yet been completed but, weather permitting, the work will be completed in October of this year. Base preparations for this paving program was carried out at a cost to the Road Commission of approximately \$15,000.00.

In cooperation with the Wells Township Board, 13.4 miles of gravel road surface construction was completed at a cost of approximately \$10,000.00 to the Township. In cooperation with the Negaunee Township Board 0.35 of a mile of gravel and bituminous aggregate surface construction on Road JG was started. Completion date of this work will be determined by the weather.

The completion of bituminous aggregate surface paving on County Road No. 480 immediately west of U.S. 41 is scheduled for this year but probably will have to be rescheduled for the 1957 season unless exceptionally good weather prevails late into the fall.

Present plans call for the location of the blacktop plant in the western part of the county for 1957 and in the southeastern part of the county for the summers of 1958 and 1959. However, bad weather the remainder of this season would force a change in these plans.

Recently requests have been received for the construction and addition of new roads into the county road system. Your committee agrees that favorable action to these petitions is impossible under the present budget conditions. The County Road Commission is not now able to do an adequate job of maintenance on many of the roads that are now a part of the county road system and to add

more roads to the system would necessitate the shifting of funds from planned projects that have waited years for improvement. To add more miles to the system, to say nothing of new road construction costs, would decrease maintenance on existing county roads and result in more of our existing roads falling into a disgraceful state of repair.

Your Committee discussed with the Road Commission the petition received for the improvement of County Road JF in Negaunee Township. An estimate already made for the relocation of this road indicates a cost of \$9,000.00 and funds were not available to carry out the work. The Road Commission, however, has done some additional maintenance work on this road to improve it but its rebuilding will have to await the availability of funds.

Gentlemen:

In March of this year a petition was received by your Budget and Executive Committee from county employees in the Court House Group, the Social Welfare Department and the Morgan Heights Sanatorium, requesting the adoption of a retirement system to supplement Social Security Coverage. Your committee has had this matter under consideration since that time and wishes to report its findings to date.

At the beginning of the study, contact was made with the Social Welfare Department and with the Morgan Heights Sanatorium Board and both agencies favored the adoption of a retirement plan for its employees. The committee then acquired a proposed plan from an insurance company so that possible

retirement provisions could be studied and an estimate of costs obtained. This proposed plan would provide retirement in an amount of \$2.00 per month for each year of service prior to retirement at 65 years of age, discounting the first five years of service. The cost of purchasing prior service for the group was estimated at \$75,663.98, payable over a period of 20 years. Annual costs were computed as follows: Current Service and Administration \$8,529.34; Suggested Payment to Apply on Past Service \$4,800.00; to make a total estimated annual cost of \$13,329.34. A portion of this cost, however, could be covered by employee contributions.

Your committee felt that some savings could be had in administrative costs and in the reducing of funds set aside in a retirement fund by establishing a "self administered" plan. Letters were addressed to the other counties in the State to obtain information on systems used by other counties and it was found that 14 of the 83 Michigan counties now have private retirement systems to supplement Social Security Coverage and that 3 of them are included in the Michigan Municipal Employees Retirement System while 11 of the counties have self administered plans.

Your committee then studied the possibility of formulating a set of rules and regulations to establish a retirement system in simple form, completely controlled by the County. In checking the enabling laws with the Prosecuting Attorney it was found that very definite restrictions have been placed in State law which would control a number of the provisions of any retirement system adopted by a Board of Supervisors for county employees. One of the provisions of the State law provides that the reserves established for the retirement system "shall be determined on an actuarial basis — established, maintained and funded to cover the pensions and other bene-

fits provided for in said plan in the same manner and within the same limits as to time as is provided for Benefit Plan B in the "municipal employees' retirement act".

Since the services of a consulting actuary would be required to establish reserve requirements and since the writing of pension plans is a specialized field, an inquiry was directed to Mr. A. G. Gabriel, Consulting Actuary, at Detroit. A copy of this exchange of correspondence is attached.

It is now apparent that no simplified retirement system may be set up by the County nor can we adopt a system which could easily be adjusted from time to time as Social Security coverage and economic conditions change through the years. Your committee, therefore, feels that at this point the matter should be brought before the Board of Supervisors for a determination as to whether or not the matter should be pursued and, if so, to recommend the employment of Mr. Gabriel to formulate a plan.

This report is intended to neither advocate the adoption of a retirement system nor the rejection of one. Your committee feels, however, that the matter should be brought before each Supervisor in advance of a regular meeting so that he may consider it.

At the December 10, 1956 meeting of your Budget and Executive Committee, a communication was received from Aaron Lowenstein City Atty. for the City of Negaunee, recommending that a railroad acct. be hired to make an examination of records of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company and to testify in opposition of the discontinuance of the Chicago and Northwestern Railway Company's trains number 209 and 214-240 between Escanaba and Ishpeming.. It has been suggested that the cities of Ishpeming and Marquette, the County of Marquette and possibly the City of Escanaba and the County of Delta join with the City of Negaunee in this hearing and prorate the cost of hiring the accountant.

Your Committee feels that it is vital to this area to keep the rail transportation accommodations we now have and that we should do all we can to prevent the discontinuance of this rail service.
