1. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors support legislation increasing the membership of the State Equalization Board to 4 members. The majority of the counties of the State support this resolution.

Your committee feels that no action should be taken on this proposed resolution as it lacks clarity.

2. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors disapprove any acro's the board raise of state equalization of more than 50 per cent by the State Equalization Board.

Your committee recommends that we oppose the adoption of the resolution.

3. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors support Legislation permitting the County Boards of Supervisors to fix the pay of County Tax Allocation Boards and permit the County Clerk to act as Clerk and to receive the same per diem as other members of the County Tax Allocation Board.

Your committee recommends that we favor the adoption of this resolution.

4. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors go on record as urging the Legislature to adopt a proposed constitutional amendment, amending Section 10 of Article VIII of the Constitution to make it possible for County Boards of Supervisors to levy an amount in excess of one tenth of one mill on the assessed valuation of the county and accumulate the same in a building and site fund within certain limits.

Your committee failed to adopt a motion in support of this resolution and recommends that it be opposed.

5. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors support the request of Ogemaw, Arenac, Wexford, Dist. 3 and Dist. 2 for proposed changes to the Conservation Laws. "Open Doe Season", "Small Game Opening" and "Dip Net Catching of Suckers".

Your committee recommends no action be taken on this proposed resolution.

6. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors support Legislation permitting an increase in fees, collected by the various county offices.

Your committee recommends that no action be taken on this proposed resolution.

7. Resolve, That the State Association of Supervisors support Legislation making it mandatory for all people employing migrant labor to provide hospitalization for such workers.

This matter involved county government, county tax money and county of icers. It appears that the board of supervisors should inquire into the means by which payments were allegedly obtained from the county, in a reportedly fraudulent manner, and what, if anything, can and ought to be done to prevensuch matters in the future.

February 11, 1958 Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Bd. of Supervisors Marquette, Mich. Gentlemen:

Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration for a long time the problem of increasing expenditures by the Social Welfare Department and the accumulating deficit of that department. Your committee ffnds that during the past four years the Welfare Department has spent more than its annual allocation each year and that the accumulated deficit of that department amounted to \$82,788.80 at the close of 1957. The 1958 allowance for the Social Welfare Department is \$70,000.00 for Direct Relief and \$100,000.00 for the Social Welfare Fund, or a total of \$170,0000.00.

On January 2, 1958, these total allowances were transferred to these funds. The Social Welfare Fund received its \$100,000.00 but, with a minus balance to begin with, it left only about \$17,000.00 clear to last the rest of the year. January bills have been paid but there is not enough left in the fund to take care of February obligations nor the obligations for the rest of 1958.

Your Committee is greatly concerned over this problem, especially in view of the fact that greater demands wil be made upon the Welfare Department this year because of increased unemployment. It is felt that now is the time to realize that we fare spending wil have to be cut back so as to put the available money into the hands of those who have the greatest need.

The biggest single expense in welfare work in this county is the hospitalization program. In 1957 the actual cost to the county for hospitalization cases was \$96,-019.54, not counting the administration costs of the program. Effective July 1, 1957, new State rules were set up which caused the County Welfare Department to be responsible for more hospitalization cases, including O'd Age Assistance cases, Aid to the Blind Aid to Dependent Children cases and Aid to the Disabled cases. These rules also provided, however, that the state would pay 90 per cent of the hospitalization expenses for these type of cases. At the same time, the new rules also cut back the state payment on Direct Relief from 50 per cent to 30 per cent but in the overall picture, it was believed that the net costs for the county welfare would be reduced.

The Welfare Department has this week been served with notice that since State funds are running low that for the rest of the fiscal year, the State will pay only 20 per cent of hospita ization cases for those receiving Aid to the Disabled, 55 per cent of hospitalization cases for those receiving Old Age Assistance and 90 per cent on the Aid to Dependent Children and Aid to the Blind cases. Over 90 per cent of these category cases are Old Age Assistance cases so the State participation on the bulk of these cases has been reduced from 90 per cent to 55 per cent while State payment on Direct Relief cases remains at the new low figure ... 30 per cent. This, of course, adds to the burden of the County Welfare Department and is another reason why the department will have to find ways to cut back on the overall welfare load.

Your Committee finds that the welfare rules and regulations for Direct Relief and for some types of hospitalization care are set by the County Welfare Board and they have the right to revise the rules so as to decrease their expenditures. Your Committee feels that this should be done now so as to cut back welfare spending before all county funds are gone leaving the welfare department out of business.

A study of the financial condition of the County General Fund shows that the surplus which has been accumulated during the past seven or eight years by careful management amounts to \$77,000.00 as of December 31, 1957. This is almost \$6,000.00 less than the shortage in the Social Welfare Fund, but it should be possible to accumulate enough additional surplus in the general fund during 1958 so that the deficit in the Social Welfare Fund can be

wiped out. It is, therefore recommended that the Board of Supervisors authorize the transfer of \$82,788.80 from the General Fund to the Social Welfare Fund with caution to everyone concerned that all county surplus funds will then be depleted and that the county will not be in a position to transfer further sums for this or any other purpose for a considerable period of time. With this in mind, and for the protection of other county operations, it should be stated plainly that the Board of Supervisors will not be held liable for any future obligations of the Social Welfare Department beyond the amounts allocated each year from tax monies for the operation of the Welfare Depart-

Your Committee further recommends that if adopted, a copy of this report be sent to each member of the Social Weifare Board, to the Director of the Social Welfare Department and to the State Director of Welfare at Lansing, Michigan.

Whereas, the current depressed economic situation promises adversely to affect monies available in Marquette County for direct relief; and

Whereas, House Bill No. 30 presently under consideration before the Ways and Means Committee of the Michigan State Legislature seeks to relieve local authorities by changing the ratio of direct relief participation from the current 70 per cent County, 30% State, to the original ratio of 50 per cent County, 50 per cent State participation; and

Whereas, House Bill No. 30 has been endorsed by the Michigan State Association of County Social Welfare Boards and by the Supervisors Association of the State of Michigan; and

Whereas, the Marquette County Board of Social Welfare after earnest consideration believes the adoption by the Legislature of House Bill No. 30 will promote the best interests of Marquette County and the State of Michigan.

Now Therefore, the Marquette County Board of Social Welfare recommends that endorsement be given by the Marquette County Board of Supervisors to House Bill No. 30 and that a copy of the Resolution of Endorsement be forwarded by the County Clerk to

The Honorable Board of Supervisors of Marquette County Court House Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

A construct on project application, under which Federal and State funds shall be made available to Marquette County is being submitted under separate cover for your consideration and action.

The project under consideration in the application is the completion of the airport clearing and the construction of an addition to the administration building at the Marquette County Airport. We have discussed this matter informally with many members of the Board of Supervisors on various committee tours os well as other occasions. Formal action is now required if the project is to become a reality.

Estimated cost to complete the project is \$81,600.00. After crediting certain expenditures a ready made by the county for land acquisition at a cost of approximately \$4,000.00, the County's share of this estimate will be \$14,275.00. It is necessary at this time for the County to certify to the Michigan Department of Aeronautics that this money is available for the proposed project.

As a matter of review, the proposed clearing is necessary to provide a 50 to 1 glide or approach angle at the East approach to the E-W runway. The building addition is necessary to house an air traffic communications station which the government plans to locate at the airport. The instruments and equipment for this station are being furnished and installed by the Government at a

cost of approximately \$200,000.00. The County will not share in this cost. Such an installation will greatly increase the value of the Marquette County Airport to all air traffic.

We recommend that your Honorable Body concur in the acceptance of the project application and authorize the proper County officials to execute the same.

Gentlemen:

Your Morgan Heights Contact Committee met with the Board of Trustees of Morgan Heights Sanatorium on March 26, 1958. Your committee still finds that this institution is being operated in a very efficient manner and that a thorough job is being done in Marquette County in the prevention and treatment of tuberculosis.

Your committee was informed that the patient load is steadily dropping at the sanatorium. While this is an excellent indication insofar as the treatment of tuberculosis is concerned, it does cause financial problems for Morgan Heights Sanatorium. State participation is based primarily on the case load under treatment and, while the income from this source is steadily declining along with the decline of the case load, expenses of the institution remain at approximately the same level it would if the institution was at capacity. We were informed that the sanatorium would probably incur a deficit before the end of the fiscal year. The amount of such a possible deficit cannot be determined now because of the uncertainity in the case load for the remainder of the year but by budget time this fall, they should be in a positioin to make a good estimate. The Board of Trustees made it plain to your committee that they are not now seeking additional funds but would like the Board of Supervisors to know that a good possibility exists that next year's budget request may have to be larger than in previous years.

Your committee also wishes to report that Morgan Heights Sanatorium is now in the process of being approved by State authorities for the admittance of nontuberculosis cases. When this has been done and when the number of patients decreases to below 70 and they can be accommodated on the second door of the hospital, the first floor can be used to admit non-tuberculosis patients. This will add 34 hospital beds to the hospital faci ities within county as well as increase the income to that institution without raising operating costs any preciable amount. This, in turn, will go a long way toward reducing that portion of operating costs which must be paid from tax monies.

The Board of Trustees and Doctor Acocks, the administrator, are doing a fine job in tubercurosis prevention and treatment and at the same time keeping operating costs at a minimum. We feel certain that this fine co-operation will continue between the Board of Supervisors and the administrators of Morgan Heights Sanatorum to the benefit of Marquette County residents.

The meeting was called to order by the Chairman, Carl W. Corneliuson.

Supervisor York moved the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last regular meeting. Supported by Supervisor Altobello and carried.

A request for at least the same financial support as last year was received from the Upper Peninsula Deve'opment Bureau. No discussion, the Chairman ordered the request referred to the Budget and Executive Committee.

A lengthy report on Civilian Defense activities from Mr. Glen B. Wilson, County Director, was read. After commending Mr. Wilson for his fine report, the Chairman ordered the report filed.

With reference to the petitions referred by the Board to the Marquette County Road Commission, the Supt.-Engineer reported by letter as follows: (1) The petition from residents of Forsyth Township urging extension of Pearce Street in the town of Swanzy. This project will be undertaken as soon as permission is obtained from the Public Service Commission to construct a railroad crossing at the site. (2) The petition of the Dead River Sports and Camping Assoc., was denied due to lack of funds. No discussion the Chairman ordered the letters filed.

A letter from Mr. James B. Scanlon, Sec. of the Director of the Social Welfare Dept. was read Mr. Scanlon cited the critical condition of the finances of the department and asked permission for his Board to appear at the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors in June for the purpose of discussing allocation. Supervisor Larson moved the request be granted. Supported by Supervisor Mattson and carried.

The Chairman stated the Budget and Executive Committee had made a careful study of the Social Welfare problem in previous meetings and as a result a resolution was drafted by the Committee. The Clerk, at the order of the Chairman read the following resolution.

## RESOLUTION

Whereas, The Marquette County Board of Supervisors has received notice from its County Welfare Department that welfare funds are rapidly depleting and are not sufficient to meet welfare needs for the remainder of 1958; and

Whereas, The Board of Supervisors is gravely concerned about the welfare needs of its perple and the lack of funds to provide relief for the same; and

Whereas, The Board of Supervisors has recently transferred all available funds, other than those actually needed to operate other county departments, to the welfare department so as to enable that department to continue aiding those within the County who have need and who qualify for assistance; and

Whereas, It is now certain that present welfare funds will not be sufficient to maintain minimum relief standards for the remainder of the fiscal year; and

Whereas, By Inquiry, the Board of Supervisors is informed that a similar financial dilemma exists in counties throughout the State of Michigan; and

Whereas, A major part of the problem has been created by the cut back of State participation in direct relief and hospitalization by the reduction of direct relief aid by the State of Michigan from 50 percent to 30 percent, the increasing of hospitalization responsibilities to county units and the

reduction of hospitalizaton State aid from 90 percent to 55 percent with a further reduction effective May 1, 1958 from 55 per cent to an undetermined lower percentage and

Whereas, The Legislature of the State of Michigan has recessed without making provision for additional welfare and relief funds so that the County Welfare Departments are left with ever increasing welfare loads but without funds to administer the needed assistance; and

Whereas, The State Department of Welfare has the right to reduce or discontinue the distribution of welfare and relief monicate the county units when State funds are being depleted at a higher than normal rate or have been completely exhausted, leaving the counties with the welfare problem but without the funds to carry on welfare programs; and

Whereas, Marquette County can presently find no solution to the we'fare problem other than to do as the State of Michigan Goes in decreasing welfare allowances and eventually discontinuing assistance entirely when all funds have been depleted; and

Whereas, The Marquette Ccunty Board of Supervisors believes that, since the greater part of tax revenues lie with the Federal and State governments, that those governments should make more funds available for relief and welfare, to be disbursed either by those units of government directly through its own agencies or through county agencies by fund allocation; and

Whereas, The rules for eligibility for most forms of welfare are set up by the State and Federa! governments and in so doing, this Board feels that the responsibility of family groups to help one another has been minimized and that the rules for all forms of assistance should be reconsidered with a view to require persons of reasonable means to bear a greater portion of the cost of assisting members of their families in need so that a larger portion of available welfare funds can be retained for those needy persons without family members to assist them.

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved, That the Marquette County Board of Supervisors go on record in favor of revising the rules and laws to require responsible relatives to bear a greater share of the welfare load and to further urge the elected representatives in the State and Federal governments to do all in their power to have their respective governments assume a greater portion of the cost of welfare.

Be It Further Resolved, That a ropy of this resolution be forwarded to the Honorable G. Mennen Williams, Governor of the State of Michigan; Honorable John B. Bennett, U.S. Congressman; Hon. Patrick V. McNamara and Honorable Char'es E. Potter, U.S. Senators; Honorable Phillip Rahoi, Michigan Senator; Honorable Dominic Jacobetti, Michigan Representative and to the Board of Supervisors of each county in the State of Michigan.

Supervisor Larson moved its adoption. Supported by Supervisor Hammerschmidt and carried.

Mr. Powell of the We'fare Board then gave a resume of the unemployment conditions in the county.

## Vacation and Sick Leave Regulations

Regulations governing sick leave and vacation for employees of the County of Marquette, Michigan, who are regularly employed at the Court House and County Jail in the City of Marquette. These regulations shall not apply to elected officials of the County of Marquette.

## Sick Leave

Effective June 1, 1958, all employees shall be entitled to one day of sick leave for each ca'endar work month. A calendar work month shall consist of a minimum of twelve days actually worked by an employee during any calendar month. Paid vacation time shall be considered time worked. Time absent from work by an employee when on sick leave shall not be considered time worked.

In case of an occupational injury, payment for the first six days lost will be made by the County of Marquette, provided that said first six days lost time are not paid by the Compensation Insurance Company. Payment for this first six days by the County of Marquette shall be made with no loss of sick leave time to the injured employee.

Sick leave will be granted to an empployee when he is actually sick or when there is illness or death in his immediate family. Employ ees shall be granted sick leave time from their accumulated sick leave when serving as pall bearers when death of friends or anvone outside of the immediate family occurs, in an amount not to exceed five days per calendar year and subject to the approval of the department head involved. It is understood and agreed that sick leave time cannot be taken for anything other than the reasons stated above and cannot be

used as additional vacation time. It is further understood and agreed that an employee shall not be entitled to sick leave during the first two work days following vacation time taken by an employee.

For the purpose of inaugurating this sick leave plan, all employees who were employed by the County of Marquette for one year or more prior to June 1, 1958 will start with a credit of 12 days sick leave time on June 1, 1958, and to this will be added one day each calendar work month thereafter until a maximum of one-hundred days is accumulated. When 100 days have been accumulated no further time shall be added, but as soon as some of the accumu'ated sick leave time is used, 1 day for each calendar work month will be added until a maximum of onehundred days is again accumulated. Appropriate records reflecting each employees sick leave credit shall be maintained by the County Controller.

An employee shall not be paid for any accumulated sick leave time when employment is terminated.

Whenever an employee does not report to work because of illness, the County of Marquette reserves the right to have the department head, or some other designated employee or a physician, call at the home of the employee to check the case and make a complete report.

In case an employee is unable to report for work, his department head shall be so notified as far in advance as possible.

### Vacation

Any employee having one year of continuous service shall be entitled to a vacation of one week with pay, two years of continuous service shall be entitled to a vacation of two weeks with pay, and after fifteen years of continuous service shall be entitled to an annual vacation of three weeks with pay.

Vacation time cannot become accumulative; any vacation time earned for any 1 year and not used within that year shall be considered lost to the employee.

The actual time that an employee shall be granted a vacation

shall be at the discretion of the department head involved and shall be subject to the work schedule and personnel requirements.

Appropriate records reflecting each employees vacation time credit shall be maintained by the County Controller.

Gentlemen:

At the June 9, 1958, meeting of your Budget and Executive Committee, the financial condition of the County Welfare Department was again discussed with representatives of the medical society, representatives of the 3 hospitals within the county, members of the County Road Commission and the Social Welfare Board.

As your committee has previously reported, it is certain that there will be a substantial shortage of needed welfare funds before the close of the year in spite of the fact that the Welfare Department has revised its rules to curtail welfare spending. It is obvicus to your committee that an attempt should be made to raise additional funds so that a greater welfare allocation may be made next year to take care of an anticipated 1958 deficit and provide sufficient funds to operate that department in 1959.

In order to increase county revenues sufficiently to adequately take care of the problem, your

committee recommends that the Board of Supervisors adopt the attached resolution providing for an election to be held in Marquette County on August 5, 1958 which coincides with the General Primary Election, to vote authority to levy two additional mi'ls per year for a five year period starting with 1958, for general county operations. If the e'ectorate will approve such add tional millage, the Board of Supervisors can then levy as much of the additional millage as is necessary meet county needs.



The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee was read. Supervisor Larson moved its adoption. Supported by Supervisor Cox and carried.

Sept. 25, 1958

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette Michigan Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour on September 22. 1958 and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1958 season.

The paying of County Road 541 and portions of County Roads 456 and EA has now been completed. These projects were a part of the Federal Aid Program. Construction has started under two contracts and bids have been taken on a third sontract for the improvement of County Road 492 which is also a part of the Federal Aid Program. Engineering work on the relocation of two miles of County Road 553 near the K. I. Sawyer Air Base has started with the Federal Government raying the entire relocation

During this season on the primary road system paving operations have been completed on County Roads 456, 541 and 557 amounting to 18.22 miles. On the local road system, with townships participating in the cost, paving operations have been completed on 11.16 miles of road in Forsyth Township and 9.25 miles will be completed in Skandia Township by the end of this construction season, making a total of 20.41 miles paved on the local road system. Adding the 18.22 miles of paving completed on the primary road system indicates a total of 38.63 miles that has been or will be paved during this season. In addition to the paving operations, eytensive road grade improvements were carried out in preparation for paving. It is expected that the bituminous aggregate plant wil be located in the central county area for the 1959 season and plans are under way to improve a number of roads in this area.

The bridge carrying County Road 438 over the West Branch of the Escanaba River was completely reconstructed and the bridge carrying County Road 438 over Chardler Creek was removed and replaced with a metal pipe arch.

In addition to the above projects the Road Commission carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance programs.

A discussion was held relative to the access road leading from the Village of Republic to the newly constructed M-95 Highway. It was the opinion of the committee that the Road Commission pave this access road with the Township participating in the cost of the paving. The replacement of the existing bridge on this access road is financially impossible.

It was again pointed out to your committee that the Road Commission cannot possibly complete all of the improvements that have been requested on the local road system. The state law requires that 75% of the funds received from the State be expended on the primary system, which includes 275 miles, and the remaining 25% of State funds be expended on the local road system which includes 990 miles. Your committee is confident that the Road Commission is using the funds allocated for local roads to the best advantage possible but of necessity, some of the requests for improvement of local roads will have to be put off.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

The annual inspection of the Parks and Airport Contact Committee was made on September 16, 1958. The inspection began by meeting at the Marquet'e County Airport administration building. The Coffee Shop there is now being operated by the County Airport Commit'ee and while there is no profit in this phase of the operation, good service is being given the public there without extra cost.

A tour of the runways of the airport was made. On the east end of the East-West approach, a cosstruction project was pointed out which consisted of clearing and excavating a knoll which extends into the glide path. This is

being done to provide a fifty to one glide angle so that instrument landings may eventually be made.

The hanger was also inspected and found to be in good repair. Plans for the future require an additional hanger to house privote planes but it is expected that the revenue received from the housing of these private planes will eventually offset the cost of the hanger.

It was also pointed out that plans are being prepared for the erection of an addition to the present administration building which will house an Air Traffic Communication Station. Instruments and equpment for this station will be furnished and installed by the government at a cost of approximately \$200,000,00

Your Committee inspected Perkins Park at Big Bay and found it to be clean, pleasant and well managed. During this season the new water system was completed throughout the park area and the initial steps for a sewage disposal system there were discussed.

Reports show that there were 8,255 visitors, 6,761 bathers and 361 camping parties who used the facilities of Perkins Park this summer. Your Committee did not inspect the park at Gwinn but it is planned to include the Gwinn Park in its inspection tour next season.

The following monthly reports of county departments were read and ordered filed by the Chairman: County Treasurer, Veterans' Agency, Mine Inspector, Civil Defense, Social Welfare, Controller and Marquette County Road Commission.

VA resolution from the Republic Township Board citing the hazardous condition existing where the Republic road enters the recoursed portion of Highway M-95 north of Republic was read. After much discussion and explanatory remarks by Mr. Shroeger of the Road Commission and remarks by Several supervisors, Supervisor Carlson moved it be referred to the Marquette County Road Commission. Supported by Supervisor Rautio and carried.

Supervisor Allen spoke relative to Civil Defense and praised Mr. Glenn Wilson, County Director for his efforts in the matter. The Chairman joined in the commendation and stated the Director was doing a fine job.

Supervisor Hill stated he was informed by several persons that there was some "chiseling" going on with respect to relief rolls in the county. He further stated that the Welfare Dept. was well managed and wondered what could be done in the matter. The

Chairman agreed that the Department was well run and said complaints were reported monthly to the Budget and Executive Committee and proper investigations were made.

Supervisor Ma'tson asked if any air police were provided by the Air Force now because of the increase in traffic and extra duties by law enforcement agencies. Sheriff Jernstad stated no air police were provided for this purpose now but he was informed air police will be assigned to Marquette County after activation of the air base.

Mr. Shroeger of the Road Commission stated construction of the new air traffic communications station at the Marquette County Airport would begin in the near future as contracts would soon be awarded inasmuch as the bids had been opened and processing of the necessary paper work was in progress.

There being no further business, on motion of Supervisor York, supported by Supervisor Altobello and carried, the Board adjourned until Wednesday, the 21st day of January, A. D., 1959 at 2:00 o'clock P. M.
