Gentlemen:

Your Morgan Heights Contact Committee wishes to report on its meeting held on February 10, 1960. As in the past, your committee finds that the affairs of Morgan Heights Sanatorium are being capably and efficiently handled by its Superintendent and Board of Trustees.

For the past two years, your committee has reported to the Board of Supervisors that the income to this institution from State and other sources has been dropping off because of a decrease in the case load. A comparison of 1959 figures with 1958 figures shows that State Aid, paid on a basis of the number of patient days involved, has dropped \$8,500.00 and income from other counties for non-county patients care for at Morgan Heights has dropped in the same period from \$88,714.39 to \$48,144.48, a decrease of a little over \$40,000.00. The decrease in the case load, however, causes little, if any, reduction of the total overall cost of operating the institution. Unless the patient load at Morgan Heights can be increased, the Board of Supervisors will be faced shortly with the need to increase the annual budget of this department so that it may continue to function. Coun-



ty financial problems being what they are, your committee feels that a substantial budget increase to this or any other department would create a serious county problem.

Morgan Heights Sanatorium has been approved for the care and treatment of non-tuberculosis patients. Your Committee is informed that approximately 33 beds are available on one whole floor of the new hospital for care of this type of patient and that the staff is capable of providing adequate care for an additional patient load without adding materially to the total operating cost of the institution. At the present time only four or five non-tuberculosis cases are being handled at Morgan Heights.

Marquette County's Hospitalization program, administered by the Social Welfare Department, is expanding steadily and the costs per case is also advancing. Your committee feels that a number of these cases where surgery is not involved, or where surgery has been completed at another hospital and a period of convalescence is needed, can and should be cared for at the county owned facility. The cost per patient day at Morgan Heights will be less than in other hospitals and this will, of course, be to the advantage of the Social Welfare Department. The big advantage, however, will be in the paying of these funds into the county owned facility so as to avoid the need of increasing county funds to that department.

Your committee feels this matter is of great importance to the financial status of the county and that the Board of Supervisors and all departments involved should do all possible to encourage the use of the county owned facility for the care and treatment of patients who are county obligations.

Whereas, The Duluth South Shore & Atlantic Railroad Company has announced that as a part of the planning for such merger at least 110 of the positions or jobs it provides in this county will be eliminated, which includes the transfer of heavy repairs to locomotives & freight cars, as well as certain administrative and clerical operations now located within this County, to a point outside the State of Michigan; and

3. That the said opposition petitioner be provided with all proper and pertinent information

and testimony in support of a protest to such merger and in defense of the public interest and service;

4. That certified copies of this resolution be prepared by the County Clerk and made available for use as exhibits at such hearing before the Interstate Commerce Commission.

Your Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee made its annual inspection tour of county buildings on Sept. 14, 1960 and wishes to report that all properties inspected were found to be in good order and properly managed.

Your Committee finds, however, that the two small offices in the county jail, which comprise the total space for the Sheriff's Department and Jail offices, are no longer adequate for the volume of business carried on in those offices. It is your committee's belief that a portion of the first floor area now used as a cell block and corridor should be converted into office space. The loss of cells with a total capacity of eight prisoners will lower the total jail capacity to 92, but this is still considerably more than is actually needed. It is suggested that the space be converted by the removal of the iron grill work which forms one wall of the cell

block, the opening of a new doorway from this area to the driveway on the east side of the jail building, the removal of a few plumbing fixtures which will no longer be needed and the installation of adequate lighting fixtures. Since there are several types of work involved in making this improvement and the combined cost of the various jobs estimated at \$2,000.00 or less, your committee recommends that the Controller be authorized to cause the improvement to be made in the manner most advantageous to the county.

Your Committee finds that all recommendations made during the past and prior years by the committee have been complied with and that the insurance program on county buildings is in good order.

Persons in charge of county buildings should be thanked for their interest and cooperation in the fine maintenance of public property.

Be it further resolved that the prosecuting attorneys for the Counties of Iron and Marquette, prepare and file in one of the Circuit Court's of either county, a petition on behalf of the Boards of Supervisors of both the Counties of Iron and Marquette, which said petition shall set forth the description of the lake and the reasons why the normal height and level of the waters of the said Fence Lake thereof, shall be determined and established.

Be it further resolved upon the adoption of this resolution by both Boards of Supervisors of the Counties of Iron and Marquette, that copies be served up-

on the prosecuting attorneys of the said counties, and that the said prosecuting attorneys shall commence the necessary action in Court as soon as possible.

Be it further resolved that a certified copy of the resolution herein adopted by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marquette, shall be sent to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Iron and to the Department of Conservation of Lansing, Michigan.

Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour on September 30, 1960, and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1960 season.

On County Road 492, 1.08 miles of road construction has been completed, including the construction of proper base, gravel sur-

facing and the installation of 804 feet of metal culvert pipe and 159 guard rail posts. Bituminous aggregate surfacing and crushed gravel shoulders will be placed on this portion of the roadway during the summer of 1961. The entire cost of this improvement is gravel surfacing, sodding, and borne by the County Road Commission.

Bids will be taken this season for the construction of 1.01 miles of roadway on County Road HA from County Road 492 to the westerly city limits of Marquette City. The project consists of base correction, drainage improvement, the installation of metal beam guard rail and guard rail posts. This project will be carried out under the Federal Aid Secondary Road Program and is scheduled for completion by July 1, 1961.

On County Road 581 southwest-erly from the Westerly city limits of Ishpeming City, a distance of 11.98 miles of new highway has been constructed. The project consisted of grade and drainage improvements, gravel surfacing, black top surfacing and shoulder construction. 1,948 lineal feet of metal culvert pipe was also installed and about five miles of roadside was cleared and grubbed of a heavy growth of shrubbery and trees. The County Road Commission bore the entire cost of this improvement.

The severe spring break-up and numerous wash-outs curtailed the paving program this year. Extensive road surfacing and maintenance operations were carried out as well as the necessary base correction in preparation for base construction.

On the Local Road System, with townships and cities participating in the cost, 9.1 miles were paved. A total of 7.6 miles of bituminous aggregate surfacing was scheduled in Marquette Township but only 4 miles was constructed. 9.2 miles of improvement were scheduled in Richmond Township but only 2.2 miles of 30

foot wide surface was completed. In Champion Township 0.4 miles was completed. In co-operation with the cities of Ishpeming and Negaunee, 2.5 miles of the Cliffs Drive Road was paved.

In addition to the above projects, the Road Commission carried out its normal summer maintenance and an extensive winter maintenance program as a result of a near record snowfall during the past winter.

Your committee feels that mention should again be made of the state law requirement that 75% of all funds received from the State be expended on the 275 miles of primary roads while the remaining 25% of funds must be expended on the local road system which includes 990 miles of roadway. This restriction makes it impossible for the Road Commission to cause all of the improvements requested on the Local Road System to be done but your committee feels confident that the Road Commission is using the funds allocated to the Local Road System to the best advantage for all concerned.

#### STATE OF MICHIGAN THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS FOR MARQUETTE COUNTY

Whereas, a petition addressed to the Board of Supervisors of the County of Marquette has been filed with the Marquette County Clerk, praying that the property described below, now located in the Township of Ishpeming, be annexed to the City of Ishpeming, and,

Whereas, said petition has been filed with the Clerk of this Board more than thirty days before the convening of this Board in regular session, and,

Whereas, it appears that said petition conforms in all respects with Public Act 279 of the Public Acts of Michigan of 1909, as amended, and that the statements contained in said petition are true;

Be It Therefore Resolved that the following question concerning the making of the proposed change of boundary between the City of Ishpeming and the Township of Ishpeming, shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the City of Ishpeming and the Township of Ishpeming, at the biennial Spring election to be held on the 3rd of April, 1961. The question to be submitted as follows:

"Shall the following described territory, to-wit:

The Northeast One Quarter of the Southwest One Quarter of Section 34, Township 48 North, Range 27 West, located in Ishpeming Township, Marquette County, Michigan be detached from the Township of Ishpeming and annexed to the City of Ishpeming?"

Be It Further Resolved that at said election upon said question, the Township of Ishpeming shall conduct the election in such manner as to keep the votes of the qualified electors in the territory proposed to be detached from the Township of Ishpeming and annexed to the City of Ishpeming in a separate box from the one containing the votes from the remaining portions of such Township.

Be It Further Resolved that within three days after the passage of this resolution, the County Clerk shall transmit a certified copy of the said petition and of this resolution to the Township Clerk of the Township of Ishpeming, and to the City Clerk of the City of Ishpeming.

A resolution of tribute to Supervisor John Ghiardi for his long and faithful service to the City of Negaunee and County of Marquette was submitted by the Negaunee City Council. The Chairman ordered the matter filed.

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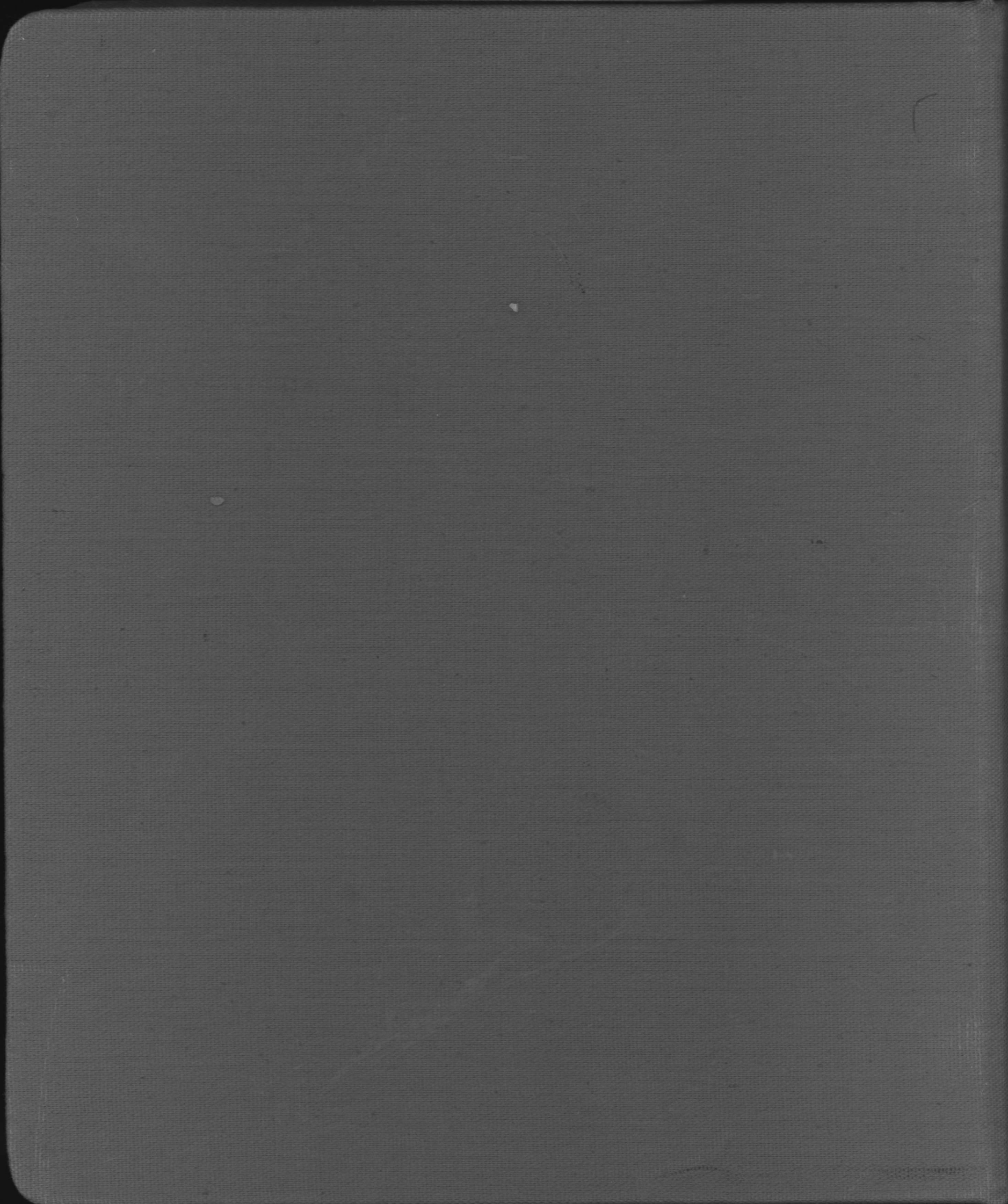
