
PROCEEDINGS OF BOARD OF SUPERVISORS MARQUETTE COUNTY



Marquette, Michigan January 18, 1961

RESOLUTION

A Resolution adopting and approving the execution of the first amendment to the Grant Agreement by the Ccunty of Marquette, Michigan and the United States of America, Federal Aviation Agency, for the purpose of obtaining Federal A'd for the Development of the Marquette County Airport under Project No. 9-20-063-0701.

Be It Resolved by the members of the Board of Supervisors of Marquette M'chigan:

Section I. That the County of Marquette shall enter into a Grant Amendment for the purpose of obtaining Federal Aid for the development of the Marquette County Airport and that such Grant Amendment shall be set forth herein below.

Section II. That the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors is hereby authorized and directed to execute said Grant Agreement in five copies on behalf of the County of Marquette and the County Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest said execution.

Section III. That the Grant Amendment referred to hereinabove is attached hereto.

Whereas, the Admin strator of the Federal Aviation Age c (hereinafter the "Adm.nistrator") has determined that, in the interest of the United States, the Grant Agreement relating to the above numbered project between the Administrator of Civil Aeronautics (predecessor in authority and respons bility to the sad Administrator of the Federal Aviation Agency), and the County of Marquette, Mich., (hereinafter called the "Sponsor"), accepted by the Sponsor on August 28, 1956, should be amended as hereinafter provided and

Whereas, It has been determined necessary to increase the maximum obligation of the United States payable under this project from \$45,000.00 to \$49,500.00, to cover project costs which were higher than originally estimated.

Now Therefore, Witnesseth:

That in consideration of the benefits to accrue to the parties hereto, the Administrator, acting for and on behalf of the United States, on the one part, and the Sponsor, on the other part, do hereby mutually agree that the said Grant Agreement be and is hereby amended by the deletion of the amount "\$45,000.00" as it appears in Paragraph 1, Page 2 of the Grant Agreement, and substitution in l'eu of said amount of "\$49,500.00".

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

On March 8, 1961, your Conservation Committee held a meeting at which State Conservation officials and Conservation Officers were present. It was the feeling among the members of your committee that every effort should be made to promote an expanding program of fish hatchery and planting operations rather than a curtailed one. Besides the great recreational benefit our own citizens would enjoy of increased fish planting, your committee feels that it would bring about an expansion of our tourist business as well. This of course, is of great importance to our area as the tourist business is now the number two industry in this area.

Officials of the Conservation Department explained to your committee that the decrease in hatchery and planting operations has come about as a result of decreased revenues. As has been experienced in all phases of government, costs of operating the Conservation Department have climbed steadily in the past several years but during those same years revenues to the Dept. have fallen off. It has been explained

that one half of the cost of operating the Conservation Department is drawn from the State General Fund and the remainder is financed by the sale of deer and fishing idenses. These sales have been steadily declining and the end result is a smaller budget for operations. This directly effects the fish hatchery and planting program.

Because of the great importance of the Conservation Department's activities, your committee believes the State Legislature should be urged to find some means to expand the budget for that department so that it will be in a position to expand its program. It is further suggested that interest should be stimulated in sportsmen's clubs, tourist councils, economy advancement groups and other similar organizations towards this goal. It is again pointed out that better fishing in the Upper Peninsu a will certainly help the tour.st business which in turn, will help the economy of our area.

It is recommended that the information in this report be conveyed to Honorable John B. Swainson, Governor, Honorable Phllip Rahoi, State Senator, Honorable Dominic Jacobetti, State Representative and to Mr. Gerald Eddy, Director of the Michigan Department of Conservation.

Your Committee was very pleased with the he pfulness and co-operation given it by the representatives of the Conservation Department and it is hoped that this committee will be permitted

to meet again so as to pursue its study of the problems in conservation. Suggestions in the matter will be welcomed by any member of your committee for study.

Your Budget and Executive Committee to whom was referred a request from the Marquette City Health Council for the establishment of a county health unit, wishes to report that the mater was studied by your committee at its meeting held on March 15, 1961.

The Committee is in sympathy with the recommendations of the Marquette City H a'th Council and realizes that this additional agency of the county would be desirable. The financial problems such a unit would pose for the county, however, seem insurmountable.

Our county has tried for years to live within its income. Counties having the same problems as other units of government in coping with the ever increasing costs of operation and the solution to the problem lies in either increasing the revenues by taxation or by curtailing expenses so as to live within our income.

Three years ago because of increasing costs of welfare, it was necessary to ask the voters to approve the raising of an additional two mills for a five year

period. This approved m.llage will expire in two years and we will again have to ask the voters to extend the minage if we are to be able to run our existing departments.

The establishment of a county health unit has been considered several times by the County of Marquette within past years. The county has relied on experts in the health field for guidance and it has never been feet that such an agency was desperately needed. The Marquette County Board of Supervisors has never been able to determine how to finance such additional health facilities without placing an additional tax burden on the people.

Through county government facilities at the present time, in the health field we now operate a tuberculosis hospital, a medical unit for non-tube cu osis cases and hospital and medical care is provided by local hospitals and doctors at county expense through the Welfale Department. These combined annual expenditures now amount to approximately \$306,000.00 and are ever increasing.

It is the op nion of your committee, based upon previous studies made in the field of county health units, that an adequately staffed unit for Ma quette County would cost at least \$100,000 00 per year to operate. During 1960, by careful management, Mar quette County was able to pay its obligations and cose out the year with about \$7,000.00 unspent in its budget. This figure is indeed a small one when the many varied responsibilities of the county are considered; it is a so too small to even consider as a starting point to finance a county health unit. We are now facing declining mine valuations within the county and this wil seriously effect the amount of county income to support presently operating agencies.

Because of the reasons stated in this report your committee

recommends that the Board of Supervisors regretfully inform the Marquette City Health Council that the Councy of Marquette is unable to support so costly an agency at this time.

APPENDIX 1

The County of Marquette Resolves:

Section 1-Intent and Purpose
a. It is the intent and purpose
of this resolution to establish an
organization that will insure the
complete and efficient utilization
of all the counties facilities to
combat disaster resulting from
enemy attack or natural disaster
as defined herein.

b. The Marquette County Office of Civil Defense will be the coordinating agency for all activity in connect on with Civil Defense: It will be the instrument through which the Board of Supervisors and its Chairman may exercise the authority and discharge the responsibilities vested in them by this resolution, and Act No. 154, Public Acts of 1953 as amended by Act No. 98, Public Acts 1954.

c. This resolution will not relieve any county department of the normal responsibilities or authority given to it by general law or by local ordinance, nor will it affect the work of the American Red Cross or other volunteer agencies organized for relief in natural disaster.

Section 2. Definitions

a. For the purpose of this resolution certain words used herein are defined as follows:

- 1. "Civil Defense" shall have a broad meaning and shall include preparations against, said relief from, the effects of attack on the county or any part of the State of Michigan, by the forces of an enemy nation or agents thereof, and it shall also include such activity in connection with natural disaster as defined herein. It shall not, however, include any activity that is the responsibility of the military forces of the United States.
- 2. "Attack" shall mean a direct assault against the coun'y, or any part of the State of Michigan by the forces of a hostile nation or the agents thereof, including assault by bombing, chemical or biological warfare, or sabotage.
- 3. "Natural Disaster" shall mean any condition seriously threatening public health, welfare or security as a result of a severe tornado, hurricane or similar natural or accidental cause and which is beyond the control of public or private agencies ordinarily responsible for the control of relief of such conditions. (This does not include rots, strikes, insurrections, or c'vil disturbances.)
- 4. (Civil Defense Forces) shall mean the employees, equipment and facilities of all county departments, boards, institutions and commission suitable for, and adaptable to, civil defense as recommended by the County Director and designated by the Chairman, with the approval of the Board, to participate in the civil defense activity.
- 5. "Volunteer" shall mean contributing service, equipment, or facilities to the civil defense organization without remuneration

or without a formal agreement or contract of hire.

- 6. "Civil Defense Volunteer" shall mean any person duly registered and appointed by the Director and assigned to participate in the Civil Defense activity.
- 7. "Chairman" shall mean the Chairman of the County Board of Supervisors; and Board shall mean the Marquette County Board of Supervisors.

Your Budget and Executive Committee to whom was referred the request from the City of Ishpeming Board of Review for a reassessment of all properties in the County of Marquette, wishes to report that the matter was considered by your committee at its meeting held on June 12. 1961 Your committee beileves that re-

assessment is not the answer to the problems which exist in assessing within the county as it is a very costly project and a temporary one under the present assessing laws. Your committee further believes that the best results, the most economical and permanent solution to the problem lies in the establishment of a county tax department with sufficient authority to control all assessments in the county. Such a department can only be had when enabling legislation is adopted.

Your Committee recommends, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors direct the Prosecuting Attorney to draw a proper resolution asking that the right to create a county tax assessing unit with sufficient authority to control assessments be included in the Constitution of the State of Michigan when revised and that copies of the resolution be sent to the Governor of the State of Michigan, the State Association of Supervisors, District No. 1 of the State Assn. of Supervisors and to all counties within the State of Michigan.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

The annual meeting of your Morgan Heights Contact Committee was held at Morgan Heights Sanatorium on June 1, 1961. Your committee wishes to report that the affairs of this institution are beng capably and efficiently handled. The incidence of tuberculosis in this area is steadily decreasing but the available room is being used to very good advantage in the care of long term non-surgical or convalescent patients in the section set aside and designated as the Marquette County Medical Unit.

As was reported by your committee in prior years, Morgan Heights Sanatorium has been faced with the financial problem of decreasing income due to a decrease in the tuberculosis caseload while the total cost of operating the institution remains almost the same. We are happy

to report that during the past year the caseload in the Marquette County Medical Unit, of which the vast majority are county patients has steadly risen to a point where 27 patients are being cared for there. Since the patient day rate charged the Social Welfare Department is approximately \$4.00 per day less than the rate in private hospitals in this area, and further, since the smaller rate also includes drugs, there is a considerable savings to the county. It has been estimated that the savings affected this year on county cases cared for in the medical unit is in excess of \$35,000. This new program has enabled the sanatorium to continue its work without requiring an additional appropriation.

The trustees informed your committee that the budget request for the ensuing year will be the same as it has been for the past three years and much credit should be given to the Board of Trustees and Dr. Acocks, Supt., in the orderly and profitable transition they are accomplishing by increasing the load in the Marquette County Medical Unit to compensate for the loss in the tuberculos's caseload. It is, of course, very gratfying to report that this dread illness is still on the decline and it is hoped that this trend will continue.

The following report of the Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee and attached letters were read. Supervisor York moved the report be adopted and that the matter of improvements to the Detention Home be referred to the Budget and Executive Committee. Supported by Supervisor Smith and carried.

June 30, 1961 Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

Your Buildings, Grounds and Insurance Committee made its annual inspection tour on June 28, 1961 and wishes to report that all buildings inspected were found to be well maintained and properly managed. Your committee also finds that the insurance program on county owned buildings and county liabilities is adequate and in good order.

The matter of the Detention Home facility was given special attention this year. Your committee believes that the small number of cases and the short duration the average inmate is detained does not justify a large county expenditure for either

the erection of a new detention home or the extens ve remodeling of the present facility. The major objection to the use of the Detention Home at present is the fact that inmates in the fire proof cells could not easly be removed in the case of fire and they might suffer from heat or smoke. Your committee recommends that the window on the south wall of each of the two cells should be replaced with a type that can be locked and unlocked from the outside and that keys for these windows be kept on hand at all times in the matron's home and in the office of the shefifi where a 24 hour a day coverage is now maintained. A regulation metal fire escape should be attached to the south wall of the building so as to service the two cells in case of fire. Your committee believes that if this small improvement is made there will be no further objection to the use of the detention cells as far as fire regulations are concerned. Your Budget and Executive Committee has had under consideration the matter of appointment of a Marquette County Medical Examiner and the matter of expenses in connection with autopsies. Request has been made to the Board of Supervisors for the allowance of a \$10.00 morgue fee and a \$15.00 technician's fee for laboratory work in connection with each autopsy. Information has been had from other counties within the State of Michigan using the Medical Examiner system and your committee believes that the morgue fee and laboratory fee are proper and reasonable charges. It is recommended, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors adjust the pathologist's fee for autopsies from the present \$50.00 fee per case to \$75.00 per case and that this adjusted fee include the morgue and technicians fee.

Your committee further recommends that Dr. R. L. Carefoot be appointed Medical Examiner for Marquette County effective immediately. It is further recommended that the Medical Examiner be authorized to draw up rules consistent with State law to regulate the reports to be made by deputy medical examiners and to further provide that the Prosecuting Atterney or other law enforcement agency be notified of all sudden deaths without delay, such rules to be approved by your committee before becoming effective.

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommends that the various Departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted at the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Supervisors.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary then we recommend that authority be granted transferring a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

It is recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund and Direct Relief Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.

The following report of the Highways and Bridges Committee was read. Supervisor Larson moved it be adopted. Supported by Supervisor Phare and carried.

Marquette, Mich. October 2, 1961

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette. Michigan Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour and inspection on September 27, 1961, and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1961 season.

On County Road HC to Forrestville, 2.2 miles of local road was paved and completed. Marquette Township shared in the cost of this project.

On County Road 492 from County Road HD to HA, a distance of 1.08 miles, reconstruction of the road and road shoulders was carried out as a bid project. Reconstruction of 1.01 miles of roadway on County Road HA from County Road 492 easterly to the Marquette City limits was also carried out this season as a bid project. Surface completion of these projects was made by County Road forces.

Approximately 7 miles of roadways and streets were paved in the Plat of Gwinn and vicin'ty in co-operation with the Forsyth Township Board.

As of September 22, 1961, the blacktop plant produced 43,162 tons of blacktop during the saeson. 14,978 tons of this black op were placed on the primary road system; 24,196 tons on the local road system and 3,988 tons were furnished to the three cities of the county, the Forsyth School District, the County Airport and the Michigan State Highway Department.

Bids were taken this season for the reconstruction of 16.1 miles of highway in Wells Township. The contract was awarded to the I. L. Whitehead Co. at a total bid price of \$320,000.00. One-half of this cost will be paid by the U.S. Government. Completion date on this project is December, 1961.

Bids were also taken this season for the reconstruction of 1 mile of County Road 561 running northerly from County Road 480 in Negaunee Township. This bid was awarded A. Lindberg and Sons at a total cost of \$61,600.00 with the U. S. Government sharing in the cost. Completion date on this project is December, 1961

The reconstruction of approximately 1.6 miles of readway on County Road 561 from U.S. 41 southerly to County Road 492 is planned as a winter project to be carried out by the Read Commission forces. A relocation project on County Road 557 for a distance of approximately 15 miles south from County Rea? EA is also being planned for completion during the 1962 season.

Approximately 42 miles of blacktop surface construct on is scheduled in Wells Township for the 1962 construction season. The actual miles of paving are about equally divided between the primary and local road systems and the cost of the local road system portion will be carried out in co-operation with the Wells Township Board.

In addition to the above projects, the Road Commission carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance operations.

Your committee made an inspection of the bridge carrying County Road BAA over the Chocolay River in Chocolay Township. Since the project involves engineering and there is a problem of financing to be worked out, your committee has requested the Marquette County Road Commission to make a thorough study of the problem and report directly to the Board of Supervisors after the study has been completed.

Your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom was referred a proposed resolution submitted by the Upper Pen numbership in U.P.C.A.P.) inviting Marquette County to membership in U.P.C.A.P., wishes to report that the matter has been under consideration by your committee for the past three months.

Marquette County has an economic planning committee made up of prominent, well qualified people who are meeting regularly and have, in the short time of less than one year, accomplished a great deal. This Marquette Economic Study Committee has already completed the preparation of a preliminary Overall Economic Development Program which has been accepted by the Federal Government in qualifying Marquette County for certain benefits. It is expected that this organization will continue to function for the benefit of Marquette County residents.

Recently a report was made available of a two year study of economic resources of the Upper Pen'nsula prepared for the Michigan Econom'c Development Commission by Ebasco Services Inc. This report was financed by the State of M chigan and civic minded groups and corporations throughout the entire Upper Peninsula. The report is adequate and complete. Marquette City and at least two of the adjoining townships in Marquette County are currently planning their districts.

Your Committee feels that Marquette County has had and is gettnig adequate development planning and that no additional funds should be made available from tax monies for this purpose. It is recommended, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors decline the invitation to participate in the Upper Peninsula Committee on Area problems and that it continue to co-operate with the existing planning agencies in Marquette County and the Upper Peninsula.

RESOLUTION

Whereas, the United States of America has heretofore filed a complaint in the Federal District Court at Marquette, Michigan, seeking to condemn certain lands in which the County of Marquette claims an interest, which said action is known as Miscellaneous No. 89, and,

Whereas, the lands involved in said condemnation proceedings are identified as Tract No. A-100-8, and Tract No. A-123, and,

Whereas, the County of Marquette holds a fee simple title in and to Tract No. A-100-8 as more particularly described in Schedule "A" attached to sa'd complaint, and said County holds a defeasible fee interest in Tract No. A-123, as more particularly described in said Schedule "A", the State of Michigan holding a reverter interest in sa'd property in the event that said property should ever cease to be used for forestry purposes, and,

Whereas, it has been agreed among representatives of the United States of America, the County of Marquette, and the State of Michigan that the just compensation to be paid for Tract No. A-100-8 is the sum of Nine Hundred and Fifty (\$950.00) Dollars, and the just compensation for Tract No. A-123, is the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (\$1,250.00) Dollars, and.

Whereas, it has been agreed between the County of Marquette and the State of Michigan that the total compensation to be paid for the said Tract No. A-123, being the sum of One Thousand Two Hundred Fifty (\$1,250) Dollars shall be refunded by the State of Michigan to the local taxing units in Marquette County with jurisdiction over said tract, in proportion to their tax equities and,

Whereas title to botht said tracts No. A-100-8 and A-123 became vested in the United States of America upon the initiation of said condemnation proceedings,

Now Therefore, Be It Resolved:

- 1. That the County of Marquette does hereby assign, transfer and set over to the State of Michigan all of its interest in the condemnation award to be paid with respect to Tract No. A-123, as more particularly described in Schedule "A";
- 2. That the County of Marquette hereby consents to the taking of the premises known and described in said suit as Tract No. A-100-8, and consents that the reasonable value of said

Tract No. A-100-8 is the sum of Nine Hundred Fifty (\$950.00) Dollars, and further consents that a judgment may be entered in the United States District Court for the Western District of Michigan, in regard to the determination of just compensation for the taking of said property, in said amount, without further notice to the County of Marquette;

3. That Edward A. Quinnell, Prosecuting Attorney for the County of Marquette, be authorized to execute on behalf of said County, the Stipulation attached hereto, and such further documents as may be necessary to effectuate and complement this resolution.
