Your Budget and Executive Committee, to whom was referred the proposition that a County Plat Book be made of Marquette County wishes to report that the matter was considered by your committee at its meeting held on June 11, 1962.

It has been proposed that Marquette County have a pat book printed at a cost of approximately \$5,000.00 for 2,000 copies and that these booklets then be offered for sale at a suggested price of \$4.50 each. Your committee believes that if the county proceeds on this basis that the major portion of the cost would nver be recovered from the sale of books. It is the consensus of your committee that the availability of such a plat book is very desirable but that it can be obtained on a more favorable basis to the county. The Marquette County 4-H Council has agreed to undertake the publication of this plat book with the sale of ad-

vertising. Mr. Nyouist, agent for the 4-H Council, has informed your committee that he believes the sale of approximately \$3,2000.00 in advertising is possible and that if the County of Marquette would contribute to the project to the extent of \$1,000.00 that the book could be completed and made available for sale to the public at a cost of \$4.50 per copy. Once the total cost of the printing has been recovered, the 4 - H Council could then look forward to the sale of the remaining books so as to provide funds for future 4-H activities within the county.

Your committee recommends, therefore, that the Board of Supervisors authorize the Marquette County 44-H Council to proceed with the plat book publication project and that Marquette County 4 - H Council to \$1,000.00 in advertising in the bocklet payable when the plat book has been completed and made available for sale to the public.

The annual meeting of your Morgan Heights Contact Committee was held at the Morgan Heights Sanatorium on June 13, 1926. Your committee wishes to report that the affairs of this institution are being conducted

institution are being conducted in a very efficient manner. There has been no increase in the tuberculosis case load during the past year and the patients are still being cared for on floor of the sanatorium. The other floor, with 33 beds, is still available for use as a medical unit. It is especially helpful to Marquette County to have as many of the county patients as possible cared for at the medical unit since the income from this source

helps operate the institution without making greater demands npon county taxes and, too, the daily rate charged the welfare department for its cases is substantially less than in other area hospitals.

Your committee was informed that a number of minor changes have been recommended by the State Fire Marshal with a view of reducing fire hazards. The Board of Trustees are going ahead with these improvements and should have them completed without delay.

The trustees informed your committee that the budget request for the ensuing year will be \$10,000.00 less than it has been in recent years. It is very gratifying to report that the fine management of this institution has resulted in increased services being rendered at reduced total costs to the county.

Your committee wishes to thank Dr. J. R. Acocks, Superintendent of Morgan Heights Sanatorium, and the Trustees of Morgan Heights for the excellent job that is being done at this county institution.

The following report of the Auditing Committee was read. Supervisor Beaudry moved it be accepted. Supporter by Supervisor Rautio and carried.

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

Your Aud t Committee has made a study of the report of the Examination of the Records and Accounts of Marquette County for the period January 1, 1961 to December 31, 1961, submitted by the Department of Auditor General, County Audit Divsion, Lansing, Mich. We find that in all county departments, funds received and disbursed have been properly accounted for. All corrections or alterations suggested by the auditors during their examination have already been taken care of.

The need for a surety bond for the County Medical Examiner was noted and the same was acquired while the examiners were making the'r audit. Approval of the bond was made by them prior to their completion of audit work in the county.

Mention was made of the entering of official receipt numbers in the daily receipt register in the office of Register of Deeds. For many years the system has been to enter the complete information, including individual receipt numbers in the reception books in this office. Since the reception books are a permanent record and maintained at all times in this office, it was apparently felt that a second listing of the same receipt numbers in another book maintained in the same office was unnecessary. In any event, the aud tors never before mentioned the need to make this second listing. Since the request was made, however, the second listing is now being maintained. This change was made while the auditors were still working the 1961 audit and it seems strange that they wrote the item up as one needing correction when, to cheir knowledge, the matter nad been settled prior to completion of their work here.

Your Committee has been informed by Morgan Heights Sanatorium that the subsidiary account ledger for private pay patients' accounts receivable, suggested by the aud tors, is now being maintained.

Your Committee has also been informed by the County Road Commission that the matter of including as an employee's fringe benefit the payment of only the employees share of the premium for hospitalization insurance coverage has already been corrected, and was, in fact, corrected to meet the suggest on of the auditors as soon as the point was raised. Again, this matter was settled to the satisfaction of the aud tors at the time they were working the 1961 audit, and there is, therefore, no further correction to be made at this time.

It appears that all four suggestions made by the auditors in the 1961 audit report have already been taken care of satis factorily nd your committee recommends that the report of the Examination of Records and Accounts for Marquette County for the year 1961 be placed on file.

Your Parks and Airport Committee held its annual inspect on tour on Sept. 13, 1962. The inspection began by a meeting at the Marquette County Airport. During this season, the interior and exterior surfaces of the Terminal Building were painted and the J & L Steel Company hanger was completed by a private contractor. This facility is very well managed and maintained and the volume of traffic there is increasing stead ly. A \$130,000.00 field improvement is planned for the 1963 construction season with Federal, State and County funds part cipating.

Because of a lack of funds in the Park Commission Fund, improvements to the county parks was 1 mited this year. Tollet facilities at the caretaker's home and plastic water supply lines were installed in the Perkins Park trailer area. During the 1963 season, however, it is planned to provide picn c and bathing as well as new road facilities in the Gwinn Park and an extension of electric facilities for the trailer area at Perkins Park.

Sept. 25, 1962

Honorable Chairman and Members of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors Marquette, Michigan Gentlemen:

The Highways and Bridges Committee had its annual highway tour and inspection on September 24, 1962, and wishes to report the progress made to county roads during the 1962 season. On County Road 561, approximately 1.27 miles of highway was reconstructed from U. S. 41 southerly to County Road 492. With the exception of sodding and the installation of guard rail and guardrail posts, the project was entirely completed by Marquette County Road Commission forces. The blacktop surface construction for this project is scheduled for the summer of 1963. Total project cost was \$58,269.00.

County Road 561 from County Road 492 southerly to County Road 480, a distance of 0.95 mines, was also reconstructed this season. A. Lindberg and Sons completed the work under contract with the Federal Government and Marquette County sharing equally in the cost. The black top surface construction for this project is a so scheduled for the summer of 1963. Cost of this project wa \$52,995.00.

On County Road 557 the reconstruction of 1.50 miles northerly from County Road 426 was carried out under contract with the I. L. Whitehead Construcion Co. with the Federal Government and Marquette County sharng in the cost. Continuing nertherly from this point to the Big West R ver, a distance of approximately 5.64 miles, county forces prepared the roadway for black top surface. The entire distance was then paved with black top and gravel road shoulder construction and was carried out by County Read forces. Total project cost was \$108,609

The reconstruction of County Road 426 in Wells Township from the Dickinson County line to the Delta County line, a distance of 14.68 miles, was also carried out by contract with the I. L. Whitehead Construction Company with the Federal Government and Marquette County sharing in the construction cost. Cost of the project was \$249,648.00. This roadway was then paved with black top

and gravel road shoulder construction and was carried out by County Road forces under the Federal Aid Secondary Road program at a total cost of \$140.162.00.

On the local road system, 22.70 miles of black top surface was constructed in Wells Township with the Township assuming 50 per cent of the cost.

The reconstruction of County Road 545 in West Branch Township was started and is being carried out by Road Commission forces. Through August 31, 1962, approximately two miles of this reconstruction was completed at a cost of \$37,435.00. It is the intention of the Road Commission to continue this program throughout the fall of 1962 and into the next construction season. The completed project will extend from the West Branch Town Hall southerly to County Road 456.

Bids were taken this season for the replacement of the bridge carrying Road BAA over the Chocolay River near Lakewood. The contract has been awarded to the Mattila Construction Company of Houghton, Michigan on its low bd of \$44,223.12. The project is scheduled for competion in November of this year and 50 per cent of the cost will be borne by Chocolay Township.

Future projects include the relocation of 1.67 miles of Road 533 north of Road 480 in Sands Township. This project will be a complete relocation away from the existing road and will be carried out at an estimated cost of \$276,000.00. Bids for the project will be taken this fall and will be carried out under the Federal Aid Secondary Road Program. A complete relocation of Road 557 for a distance of 1.50 miles in Forsyth Township is also planned. The project will be carried out by the Road Commission forces this fall and continuing into the next construction season. The completion of this project will eventually provide a continuous black top surface from M-35 in Forsyth Township to County Read 426 in Wells Township.

1963 will be the eleventh construction season that the Road Commission will have carried out black top surface construction programs. Since the program has been instituted, it has not been necessary to carry out any extensive maintenace prooram such as seal coating on any of the previously constructed black top surfaces. It is planned in 1963 to carry out recapping programs on Roads 480 and 553. In addition, paving construction programs for loca! roads located in Champion, Chocolay, Ishpeming, Marquette, Negaunee, Republic and Sands Townships are tentatively scheduled. The final scheduling of these programs has not been been completed.

In addition to the above projects, the Road Commission carried out its normal summer and winter maintenance operations throughout the county.

It is to be understood that the yearly salaries stipulated, with the exception of Elective Officers may be changed at the pleasure of the Board of Supervisors.

It is to be further understood that all fees received by the County Clerk, County Treasurer, Sheriff, Register of Deeds and Judge of Probate be turned over to the County Treasurer on the last day of each month for deposit in the proper county funds, excepting however, that fees for civil process, not payable from county funds, served on off time in private cars by the Sheriff or his deputies may be retained by the serving officer.

All travel, office or other allowances now in effect are to be continued until altered by action of the Board of Supervisors.

Commencing January 1, 1963, all elected officers and regular employees in the Court House and Jail Group shall be allowed, as a fringe benefit, payment of the total premium for Blue Cross-Blue Shield Hospitalization, Surgicai and Medlcal Service for the officer or employee only. Currently this premium is between \$8.20 and \$9.01 per person, depending upon wage classification. It is to be understood that coverage for dependents of officers and employees is at the officers' and employees' expense and, further, that if an officer or employee choses not to accept this fringe benefiet, no alternate payment or other benefit is to be grant-

ed in lieu thereof. Regular part time officers and employees shall be granted one-half of this fringe benefiet. The granting of similar benefits to officers and employees of the Department of Social Welfare is hereby recommended.
