Listing of Points pertaining to the private abstract business conducted by Roy C. Lee, County Clerk, and Paul Nykanen, Register of Deeds, as prepared by the Budget and Executive Committee of the Marquette County Board of Supervisors:

1. The Board of Supervisors has authority to set office hours and has so set them at from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. Monday through Friday of each week.

2. It will be improper for the Register of Deeds to have his vault and/or office open outside regular established business hours for his own private benefit.

3. Excepting for a one-hour lunch period, which has been established during the normal work day, the County Clerk and Register of Deeds

while engaged in the private abstract business, will be doing so during the time for which the taxpayers of Marquette County expect them to be conducting the affairs of their respective offices.

4. The Board of Supervisors in 1946, by resolution, directed that abstracts should not be furnished by the Register of Deeds office and since that time, private abstractors have provided this public service. The present private abstractor has a large investment in his business and competition from persons already receiving full pay from the county payroll seems unfair.

5. Should the County Clerk and Register of Deeds insist on continuing this private abstract business, they will do so with the expressed disapproval of the Board of Supervisors.

Dear Mr. Nykanen:

You have inquired as to the legality of your engaging in the abstract business independently from your duties as Register of Deeds. I have researched the State Statutes on the subject, and find nothing which would prevent you from engaging in the abstract business. As a matter of fact, Register of Deeds quite commonly do engage in the abstract business in this State, particularly in the smaller counties.

In 1946, the Board of Supervisors apparently voted to provide that abstracts should not be furnished by the Register of Deeds office nor should county supplies be used in furnishing of abstracts. This would prevent you from working on an independent abstract business only while you are performing your Register of Deeds functions, and would of course prevent you from using any county supplies in connection with this business. I am sure that you did not intend to use either county employees or supplies in connection with your private operation.

I therefore conclude that there is nothing to prevent you from engaging in an independent abstract business. However, there are some practical matters which you may wish to consider. The Board of Supervisors, under Section 5.331 M.S.A., has the authority to prescribe reasonable regulations for the office hours of county offices. The Board has established these hours as being from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m. Monday through Friday. It would be improper for you to have your office open be-

yond the hours set by the Board, even if you were working as an independent abstractor. If you were present in the office doing work independently, then there is no reason why attorneys, real estate agents, or other persons interested in examining titles should not also be offered the same privilege. In other words, it would be improper for you as a county official to have your office open for your own private convenience.

The Board of Supervisors also has the authority to establish an official county abstract system. You may wish to consider this possibility before incurring expenses and expending the time and effort involved in establishing a private abstract system.

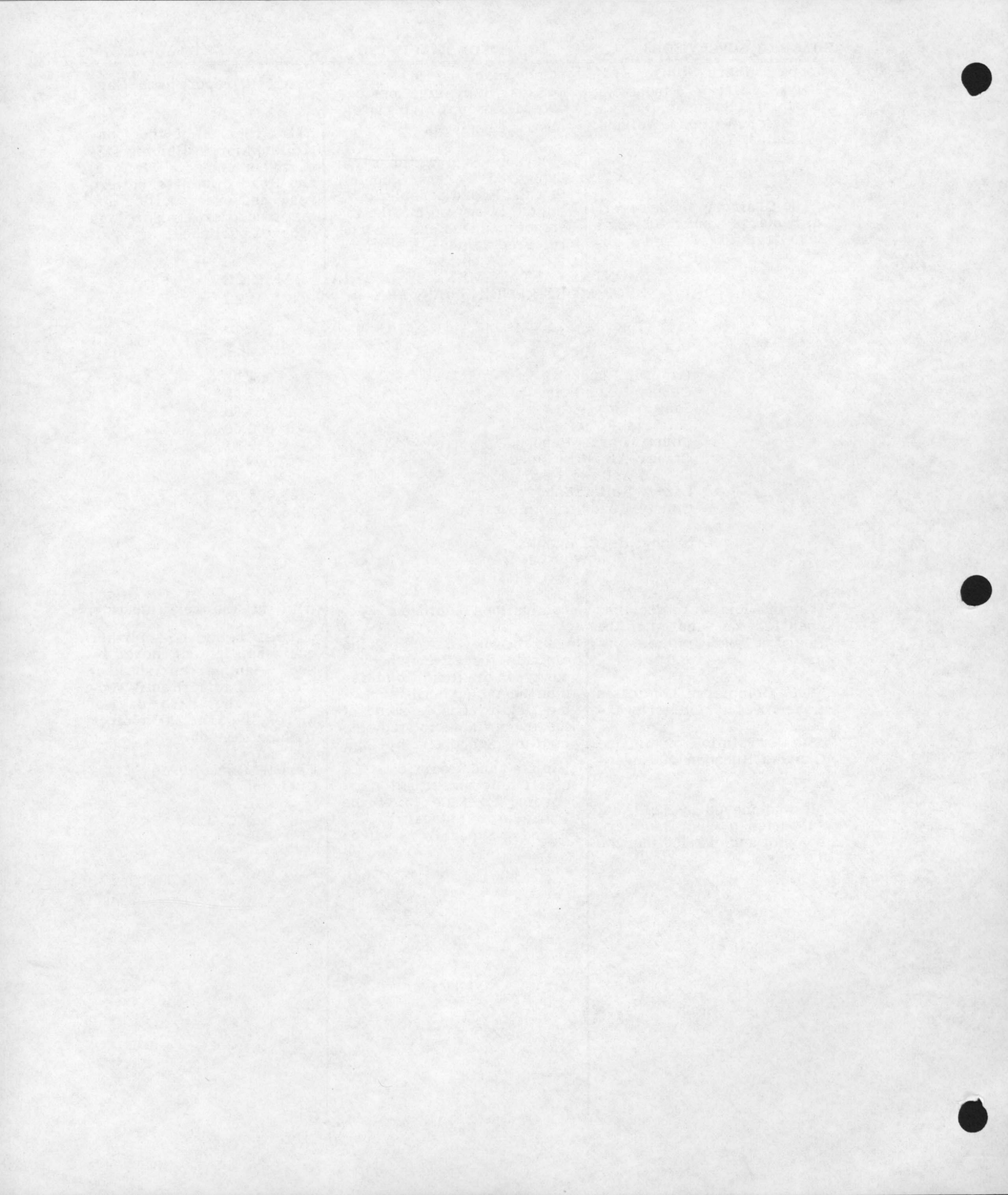

Your Equalization Commit-

tee held special meetings on April 14 and April 20, 1966, and wishes to make the following recommendations:

1. That in the 1966 and future tax rolls, Warrant and Certificate No. M 7286 be completed for each unit's roll. This form includes the signatures of the Board of Review, a certification of the unit's valuation for tax purposes as well as the various tax levies and tax rates. In the past these signatures have appeared on the roll itself and the valuations and tax levies were inserted on separate forms at a later time. In some instances this procedure was not entirely completed. The use of Warrant and Certificate No. M 7286, which is already in supply here, will prevent this incompleteness.

2. That it be the policy of the County Tax Equalization Department to refrain from issuing unofficial or estimated State equalized valuations for any of the units within the county to any person prior to the official adoption of these valuations by the Board of Supervisors annually. This policy will remove the tendency of taxing units to seek this information before it is finalized with, in some cases, wide variances which could mislead taxing units. Requests for such estimates or unofficial figures, if needed, should be made to the Board of Review, Supervisor or Assessor of the unit involved.

3. In order to broaden the services of the Tax Equalization Department, both at the office level and in expanded service to assessors in the assessing of personal property, it is recommended that one field worker be

added to the staff at this time at a salary of not to exceed \$5,000.00 per year. It is believed that the present staff of this department is not sufficient to maintain a good and adequate equalization program for a county the size of Marquette.

4. It is recommended that the Chairman of this committee be authorized to name a sub-committee within the committee to make a further study of the needs of the Tax Equalization Department in its development to a full service department and that it report from time to time to the Board of Supervisors.

5. Attached hereto is a tabulation of the assessed valuations and state equalized valuations of the three cities and nineteen townships within the County of Marquette. It is recommended that these valuations be adopted by the Board of Supervisors for the tax year 1966.

Dear Sir:

I have read, with much interest and concern, the article in the Thursday, July 21, issue of the Mining Journal regarding the proposed investigation of the Perkins Park situation. The article seemingly casts serious reflections on the job being done by your park custodian.

I have been an annual visitor to Perkins Park since 1952. During this period of time, my parents from Manton, Michigan, and a brother and a sister and their families from Manistee, Michigan, have made several trips to Parkins Park.

For the above reasons, I believe that I have a pretty good idea of the conditions at Perkins Park as they are now and, as they have been for 15 years.

On many occasions we have remarked about the fact that your park custodian, Fred Marsh, was an ideal man for the job. We have always noted that he was on the job long hours each day, 7 days a week, working at and overseeing the many details that must be taken care of in such a publicly operated facility.

I believe that Mr. Marsh always has treated park visitors in a friendly and helpful manner. I know too, that on those occasions where firmness was needed in dealing with an individual who had violated park rules he has always done so.

You and your park board are to be commended for the many improvements that

you have made in the park in the past 15 years. The improved facilities, I am sure, have resulted in bringing more visitors to the Marquette County area. No doubt further improvements can and will be made.

I believe that your facilities have been operated and maintained in a very capable manner and kept as clean at all times as reasonably can be expected, without a full time maintenance crew, particularly when you consider the type of use by persons of all ages.

I am sure that your investigation or review will be carried out in full knowledge of the facts and not perhaps be based on what would appear to be an axe grinding complaint of a disgruntled individual.

Gentlemen:

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommends that the various departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted at the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Supervisors.

In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of the department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend the authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

It is further recommended that we credit balances existing

at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund and Direct Relief Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.
