

PROCEEDINGS OF
BOARD OF SUPERVISORS
MARQUETTE COUNTY

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The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call made by the Clerk, on Friday, the 3rd day of January, 1969 A.D. at the Court House in the City of Marquette.

The meeting was called to order by the Clerk. The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Anderson C, Anderson H, Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Jacobson, Jernstad, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, Morrison, McCracken, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Walimaa and Yelle.

The Oath of Office was administered by the Clerk.

✓ The Clerk declared that nominations were in order for the office of Chairman: Sup. Hammerschmidt nominated Sup. Dompierre. Sup. Walimaa nominated Sup. Mattson. There being no further nominations they were declared closed and Sup. Walimaa and Sup. Jenkin were appointed tellers. Results by secret ballot. Dompierre 8 votes and Mattson 13 Votes. Mattson declared elected Chairman.

The Chairman asked the Prosecuting Attorney for his opinion on the legality of electing a Vice-Chairman. The Prosecutor informed the Board that there is no Statutory provision for the election of a Vice-Chairman, but he saw no reason that one could not be elected, except that in the absence of the Chairman from a meeting, the Vice-Chairman would have to be appointed by the Board to act as Chairman for that particular meeting. It was then moved by Sup. Pellonpaa and supported by Sup. Walimaa, that a Vice-Chairman be elected. Carried.

✓ The Chairman declared that nominations for Vice-Chairman were in order. Sup. Dompierre nominated Sup. Hammerschmidt. Sup. Selin nominated Sup. Jernstad. Sup. Pellonpaa moved that nominations be closed, supported by Sup. Krook. Carried. The Chair appointed Sup. Pellonpaa and Sup. Jenkins as tellers. The ballots were tallied and the results are: Hammerschmidt 7 votes and

Jernstad 14 votes. Sup. Jernstad was declared elected as Vice-Chairman.

A telegram from the Michigan State Association of Supervisors was read informing the Board of a special meeting for new Supervisors to be held in Detroit on Jan. 27 & 28 1969. Sup. Walimaa moved that as many supervisors should attend as may be possible. Support by Sup. Linjala. Discussion was had. Sup. Walimaa amended his motion to say that 4 or 5, or 1 carload of Supervisors should be authorized to attend the meeting in Detroit. Sup. Linjala supported the amended motion. Carried. on a roll call vote, all present voting aye.

Sup. Walimaa moved that the Chair appoint a committee to attend the Detroit meeting, supported by Russo. Carried.

✓ A request from the Hon. George E. Hill, presiding Judge of the 96th District for the confirming of the appointment of Benjamin O. Pascoe of Negawnee, to be the Magistrate of the Court. Moved by Sup. Walimaa and supported by Sup. Pellonpaa that the Board confirm Mr. Pascoe's appointment. Carried.

A request from the 96th District Court to establish a Traffic Bureau was read. Moved by Sup. Pellonpaa and supported by Sup. Jenkins that the request be approved. Carried.

A letter from the Marquette Family Project Advisory Board regarding a meeting with the Board of Supervisors was read. The Advisory Board wishes to make a report of the Project and also make some recommendations to the Board regarding future programs and staffing of the Juvenile Court. Hon. Michael DeFant also wishes to appear at the same time to answer any questions that the Board may have regarding the Family Project and Juvenile Court. Moved by Sup. Dompierre and supported by Sup. Goldsworthy that the request be granted. Carried.

✓ A letter from the County Controller regarding payment of delinquent taxes to the Township and School District was read. The only change from past

procedure would be the making of two distribution checks instead of one. The County Treasurer would issue separate checks to the Township and to the School Districts for payment of Delinquent taxes instead of one to the Township as is presently being done. Moved by Sup. Walimaa and supported by Sup. Krook that the County Treasurer is directed to distribute delinquent taxes directly to the school districts on and after Jan. 1, 1969.

Public Act No. 261 of the Acts of 1968 require that the Various Boards of Supervisors publish or post a notice of all regular meetings to be held in the forthcoming year. The list of tentative dates was presented to the Board for approval. Moved by Sup. Dompierre and supported by Sup. Morrison that the Board adopt the meeting schedule but amend the schedule to include Jan. 22, 1969 as an additional meeting date. Carried.

In as much as the Board must adopt a pay scale prior to Feb. 15, 1969, it was moved by Sup. Hammerschmidt and supported by Sup. Goldsworthy that the Board keep the present rate per diem that has been in effect from the old Board, being \$20.00 per diem. Sup. Walimaa moved that the motion lay on the Table until Jan. 22, 1969. Supported by Sup. Russo. Carried.

Sup. Walimaa moved that in order to avoid some confusion, the Board members should be

seated alphabetically from West to East, Supported by Sup. Lawry. Carried.

The Chairman spoke about past procedure where the Chair-appointed various committees. He suggested that a 5-man committee be appointed, including the Chairman and Vice-Chairman to make appointments and to study and revise the procedure manual and to report to the Board. Moved by Sup. Walimaa and supported by Sup. Pellonpaa that the Chairman appoint such a committee. Car-

ried. The Chairman then appointed Sup's Dompierre, Selin and Walimaa to meet along with the Chairman and Vice-Chairman.

There being no further business, Sup. Pellonpaa moved that the Board adjourn until 1:30 p.m. Wednesday, Jan. 22, 1969. Supported by Sup. Krook. Carried.

The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to the call duly made at the Court House, in the City of Marquette, on Wednesday, the 22nd day of January, 1969 at 1:30 P.M. The meeting was called to order by the Chairman Theodore R. Mattson. The roll being called the following Supervisors were present: Anderson, Clayton J., Anderson, Herbert E., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Jacobson, Jernstad, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, Morrison, McCracken, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Walimaa and Yelle.

Absent: None.

Supervisor Walimaa corrected the minutes of the Board for the previous meeting stating he had not been appointed teller by the Chairman to count votes. Sup. Thomas Jernstad was appointed teller.

It was moved by Supervisor Walimaa, supported by Supervisor Pellonpaa and carried that the Board dispense with the reading of the minutes of the previous meeting.

Supervisor Dompierre read the following statement:

Statement by Supervisor James Dompierre to the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, January 22, 1969.

I would like to make a statement of policy on behalf of the minority party of this Board.

At the organizational meeting of this Board on January 3rd the Chairman asked for and received permission to appoint a committee of five members to select the committees of this Board. The Chairman and Vice Chairman along with Leslie Selin, Kenneth Walimaa and James Dompierre made up the committee.

The committee met the same evening and decided that the first order of business would be the selection of the Audit and Budget and Executive committees, as these were the first ones that would have to hold a meeting. Both committees were selected and then the matter of selecting the chairman and vice chairman was considered. It was agreed that Mr. Russo would be chairman of the Audit Committee and that Mr. Yelle would be the vice chairman. Mr. Leslie Selin then suggested that James Dompierre be appointed as chairman of the Budget & Executive committee, this was heartily approved by Mr. Thomas Jernstad. With these two committees selected the committee adjourned until Monday, January 13th.

At the opening of the meeting on January 13th Kenneth Walimaa advised the selecting committee that the leaders of the Democratic Party were demanding that all major committees be chaired by a Democrat. After much discussion and over the strong objections and pleading of Mr. Thomas Jernstad, Mr. Selin and Mr. Mattson joined Mr. Walimaa in voting James Dompierre out of the chairmanship of the Budget & Executive committee and Mr. Walimaa in.

After this action by the committee I advised the members that if this was the attitude of their party then I suggest that they appoint Democrats to all chairmanships and vice chairmanships. Mr. Walimaa advised me that was only my opinion and they would appoint the rest as they saw fit. I then informed them that if they appointed members of my party to these offices I would suggest to these people that they not serve in this capacity. After the completion of selecting the committees, I contacted those of my party appointed and suggested the action previously stated. All members concurred in this action.

The reason we have taken this course is that we feel that we were elected by all of the people of our districts, not by our party, and that as individuals we are free to vote on any issue as our conscience dictates. Exercising this type of free-

dom, we believe, will continue to give the people of our County the type of government that they have enjoyed for these many years.

We would like to compliment Mr. Thomas Jernstad for his honesty in this matter. He has displayed the qualities of a true representative of all of the people of his district and the county.

In discussing the proceedings of our committee meeting I do not feel that I have violated the confidence of this group, as I have reported only to this Board, one of the other members took the liberty to immediately report our actions to the leaders of his party before the committee had completed its work.

Supervisor Walimaa reported he objected to the calling of the earlier meeting. He also stated that fellow Democratic Supervisors were contacted after the first committee meeting by him Sup. Walimaa to find out what committee they had an interest in, and it was not the County Democratic Party but the Democratic Supervisors who were greatly concerned about the committee appointments. He further stated that Sup. Dompierre told him "If we can't have the Budget and Executive committee we don't want the crumbs". He also said, "he would personally contact appointed Republicans and tell them all to refuse."

A report of the Family Project was made and the following people spoke briefly on the need for a professional worker with a masters degree in Social Work assigned to the Probate Court: Victor Holiday, Vern Dahlquist, Rev. Paul Landstrom, Dr. Jean Phillips, Dr. Robert Bujard, William Brady and Judge Michael DeFant. The matter was referred to the Budget and Executive committee.

✓ A communication from the Intermediate School District for the acquisition of 30 acres of county owned property near the Citizens Home was read and referred to the Budget and Executive Committee on motion of Sup. Pellonpaa, seconded by Sup. Russo and unanimously carried.

✓ A letter from the Dept. of State Highways regarding installation of a flasher at the intersection of U. S. 41, M 28BR and County Road 494 West Ishpeming was read. Motion was made by Sup. Walimaa supported by Sup. Jenkin and unanimously carried the matter be referred to the Marquette County Road Commission.

✓ A letter from the County Health Board regarding a site for the building of an administration office on County owned land adjacent to U. S. 41 in Negaunee Township was read and referred to the Budget and Executive committee, upon motion of Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Morrison and unanimously carried.

The matter of compensation for the Board of Supervisors was recalled from the table on motion of Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. Goldsworthy and unanimously carried. It was moved by Sup. Walimaa, seconded by Sup. Krook and carried that the Board take a five minute recess to meet as a committee of the whole to discuss the matter.

✓ It was moved by Sup. Pellonpaa, supported by Sup. Russo that per-diem be raised to \$25.00 with mileage at 10c per mile and this compensation be allowed to the Chairman for his attendance as ex-officio member of all committees, and carried by the following Yea and Nay vote:

Yeas: Clayton Anderson, Herbert Anderson, Eureti, Jacobson, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin and Walimaa.

Nays: Dompierre, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jenkin, Jernstad, Morrison, McCracken, and Yelle.

The Prosecuting Attorney announced there would be a meeting in Lansing, Michigan Jan. 31, 1969 regarding Federal funds available for law enforcement by Districts and suggested the

Board send representatives to said meeting. It was moved by Sup. Walimaa, supported by Sup. Pellonpaa and unanimously carried that the Chairman appoint a committee to attend this meeting.

A report of the Audit Committee was read. It was moved by Sup. Russo and supported by Sup. Dompierre and unanimously carried that the report be approved

✓ A motion was made by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. Linjala and unanimously carried that the Board of Supervisors recommend adoption of a resolution asking for change in the law to provide equity in the State funds distributed to county health departments, copies to be sent the Governor, Senator and Representative in Lansing, Mich.

✓ A report from the Budget & Executive committee recommending that the Board of Supervisors concur in Grand Traverse County's resolution requesting change in law to make the State responsible for providing office space for Dept. of Social Services was read. On motion of Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Lawry and unanimously carried the Board concurred with the said resolution.

✓ A report from the Budge and Executive committee recommending adoption of a resolution to amend law to make State responsible for at least one-half of the cost of Veterans' funeral expenses (\$300.00 per funeral now borne by the County) was read. A motion was made by Sup. Jenkin, supported by Sup. Pellonpaa and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation and adopt the resolution and that copies be sent to the Governor, Senator and Representative in Lansing, Michigan.

✓ A report from the Budget and Executive committee and a letter from AMCAB was read requesting the Board of Supervisors name two more members to AMCAB's Board of Directors. A motion was made by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. Jenkin and unanimously carried that the Board concur with recommendation. The Chairman then appointed Sup. Clayton Anderson and Mr. Robert Leach as members to AMCAB.

✓ A report from the Budget and Executive committee recommending that an Ordinance be prepared for adoption by the Board at a later date to create a Marquette County Planning Commission was read. A motion was made by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the recommendation.

✓ A report from the Budget & Executive Committee and a letter from the Dept. of Social Services were read requesting transfer of \$70,000 to Social Services Fund to cover expenses for the remainder of 1969. A motion was made by Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Hammerschmidt and unanimously carried by a roll call vote the sum of \$70,000.00 be transferred from the Social Welfare Revolving Fund to the Social Welfare Fund and that \$24,000 of this amount be earmarked as reimbursement to the Social Welfare Fund for its payment to the Brookridge Project.

✓ A report from the Budget & Executive Committee with a letter from Robert E. Menhennick owner of a residence on Baraga Ave. next to the County Jail were read. A motion was made by Sup. Dompierre, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously carried by a roll call vote to purchase the residence by the County of Marquette for the sum of \$18,000.00. That the action of the B & E Committee in securing an option to so purchase be approved and that the county serve notice on the seller that it elects to exercise the option to purchase immediately. The B & E Committee further recommends that the Building, Grounds and Insurance Committee be directed to give consideration to the use the building will serve pending the development of a long range program for Court House and Jail facility improvement.

✓ Communications from Marquette County Democratic Party and Marquette County Republican Party each nominating three persons for membership on the County Canvassing Board were read. Terms of Howard Lehto (R) and Fannie Aartila (D) expire on 11/1/69. According to law, one member must be named from each party. The Chairman called for nominations. Sup. Dompierre nominated Howard Lehto (R) and Nina Moffitt (D). Supported by Sup. Jenkin. Sup. Hammerschmidt moved nominations be closed and the Chairman cast an unanimous ballot for those nominated. Supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously carried.

✓ Appointment of member on County Welfare Board was discussed as term of John Backels expires November 1, 1969. Sup. Hammerschmidt nominated John Backels, supported by Sup. Morrison. Sup. Euret nominated Patricia Micklow, supported by Sup. Linjala. Sup. Racine moved that the nominations be closed. Supported by Sup. Pellonpaa. The balloting proceeded and the Chairman announced the following vote: Mrs. Micklow 11 and Mr. Backels 7. Mrs. Micklow was duly elected term to expire November 1, 1972.

The reports of the following County Officers were read and ordered filed, and the Treasurer's report ordered published: Marquette County Health Department, County Road Commission, Morgan Heights Sanatorium, Controller and Treasurer.

Gentlemen:

Your Finance and Taxation Committee recommended that the various departments in the Court House and Jail Group keep within the budgets as adopted at the annual meeting and that no clerk hire or salaries be paid beyond the amount fixed by the Board of Supervisors.

In the case of an emergency or in case a department requires additional funds or needs some special equipment which could not be foreseen at the time of the annual meeting, we recommend that the head of that department, together with the Controller, present the matter to the Board of Supervisors for their consideration and that they grant, where deemed necessary, authority to exceed the figures established in the annual budget.

If it develops that the amount stipulated in the budget of any department exceeds the need of that department, or if a sum authorized is found unnecessary, then we recommend that authority be granted to transfer a sum or surplus to some other department by proper resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

It is further recommended that any credit balances existing at the close of the fiscal year in the Social Welfare Fund be transferred to the Social Welfare Department Revolving Fund to apply against possible future deficits of the Department of Social Welfare.

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE CREATION,
ORGANIZATION, POWERS, AND DUTIES OF A
PLANNING COMMISSION FOR
MARQUETTE COUNTY, MICHIGAN
THE COUNTY OF MARQUETTE ORDAINS:

1. There is hereby created a planning commission to be known as the Marquette County Planning Commission, pursuant to Act 282 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan, 1945, whose office will be located at Marquette, Michigan.

2. The Marquette County Planning Commission shall have all powers and duties as provided by law, except that it shall exercise no authority over construction, improvement or maintenance of any part of the County Road system by the Marquette County Road Commission.

3. (a) The Commission shall be constituted of 5 members, appointed by the Marquette County Board of Supervisors, who shall serve for a term of 3 years and until their successors are appointed and qualified, except as hereafter provided.

(b) The Board of Commissioners shall be broadly based and representative of the interests of all areas in the planning region, including rural areas. The Commissioners shall individually be representative of important segments of economic, governmental, social life, and development of the county.

(c) Two Commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 3 years. Two Commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 2 years. One Commissioner shall be appointed for a term of 1 year. Thereafter, Commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 3 years.

(d) The Marquette County Board of Supervisors shall fill any vacancy in the membership for any unexpired term.

4. The County Board of Supervisors may remove any member of the Commission for nonperformance of duties or misconduct, upon public hearing.

5. Members of the Commission shall receive compensation not to exceed that paid to members of the Board of Supervisors, any may be reimbursed for actual, reasonable and

necessary expenses incurred in the discharge of their duties.

6. All ordinances, resolutions, and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance, to the extent of such conflict, are hereby repealed and each section of this ordinance and each subdivision of any section thereof is hereby declared to be independent and the finding or holding of any section or subdivision thereof to be invalid or void shall not be deemed or held to affect the validity of any other section or subdivision of this ordinance. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, publication and approval of the Governor as required by law.

The Marquette County Board of Supervisors met pursuant to a call made at the Court House in the City of Marquette at 1:30 p.m. December 17, 1969. The meeting was called to order by Chairman, Theodore Mattson.

The County Clerk and Deputy Clerk being absent from this meeting, it was moved by Sup. Krook, supported by Sup. Dompierre and unanimously carried that Controller Robert H. DeRoche be appointed clerk pro-tem for the purpose of recording the proceedings of this meeting.

The roll being called, the following Supervisors were present: Anderson, C., Anderson, H., Dompierre, Eureti, Goldsworthy, Hammerschmidt, Jacobson, Jenkin, Krook, Lawry, Linjala, Mattson, McCracken, Morrison, Pellonpaa, Racine, Russo, Selin, Sodergren and Yelle. Absent: Supervisor Jernstad.

Supervisor Hammerschmidt noted that in the minutes of the previous meeting held on November 19, 1969, the motion to employ Daverman Associates, Inc. to complete the preliminary survey of Marquette County's needs to improve its Court House and Jail facilities failed to indicate the Board of Supervisors' desire to include officials from the City of Marquette in the planning meetings so that whatever economies might be affected in the joint planning of city and county improvements might be accomplished. The Chair directed the clerk to cause the minutes of the previous meeting to be amended accordingly. Moved by Sup. Morrison, supported by Sup. McCracken and unanimously adopted that the minutes of the previous meeting, as amended, be approved.

✓ A communication from U.S. Senator Philip Hart acknowledging Marquette County's resolution requesting the imposition of quotas on the import of foreign ore was read and ordered filed.

✓ A communication from State Senator Joseph Mack acknowledging Marquette County's resolution regarding the law which now requires the certification of township supervisors as assessors was read and ordered filed.

✓ Moved by Sup. Goldsworthy, supported by Sup. Jacobson and unanimously carried by roll call vote that request of Probate Judge Michael DeFant for permission to attend a conference of Probate Judges at Kalamazoo, Michigan on January 14-17, 1970, be approved.

✓ A communication from the Marquette County Economic Study Committee regarding the preparation of recreation proposals for the various Marquette County political units was then read. Moved by Sup. Hammerschmidt, supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously adopted that the report be accepted and that a letter be sent to the Marquette County Economic Study Committee commending them for the fine report and encourage their further efforts in the matter.

✓ A communication from the County Road Commission regarding the abatement of hazard at the railroad crossing on County Road 456 near Little Lake was read. An order on the matter from the Michigan Public Service Commission has been expected for some time and it was moved by Sup. Linjala, supported by Sup. Racine and unanimously carried that Forsyth Township contact the Michigan Public Service Commission to determine what it intends to do in the matter.

✓ A communication from Ernest Ronn, declining his appointment to membership on the Morgan Heights Board of Trustees, was read. Moved by Sup. Pellonpaa, supported by Sup. REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, there is a need for a comprehensive plan for the physical, social, and economic development and need to conserve water and prevent and abate pollution in the area; and

WHEREAS, a comprehensive plan for the area will promote efficient and orderly development of the communities, provide information necessary to avoid overlapping, duplication, overdesign or underdesign of facilities including those for land use, health, sanitation, water, transportation, and schools; and

WHEREAS, Alger, Delta, Dickinson, Marquette, Menominee, and Schoolcraft Counties, desire to have created a Regional Planning Commission pursuant to the provisions of Section 5.3008, of Michigan Statutes Annotated, Act 281 of 1945.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THESE LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS THAT:

1. There be created pursuant to Section 5.3008, Michigan Statutes Annotated, a Regional Planning Commission to be known as the Central U.P. Regional Planning Commission, whose office will be located at Escanaba, Michigan.
2. The area or territory of the planning region over which

the commission has jurisdiction is within the boundaries described as follows:

The entire counties of Alger, Delta, Dickinson, Marquette, Menominee, and Schoolcraft. The area Does not include any city, town, or village with a population of 5,500 or more according to the latest population figures.

3. The commission shall consist of 30 commissioners who shall serve for a term of 3 years and until their successors are appointed and qualified. The Board of Commissioners shall be broadly based and representative of the interest of all areas in the planning region including rural areas. Ten commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 1 year. Ten commissioners shall be appointed for a term of 2 years. Ten commissioners should be appointed for a term of 3 years. Thereafter commissioners should be appointed for terms of 3 years. Five commissioners shall be appointed by each County.

4. Marquette County hereby appoints the following persons: Carmello Russo, Negaunee, Michigan, Marquette County Board of Supervisors; Ernie Neumann, Marquette, Michigan, Marquette County Economic Develop. Corp.; James Jenkins, Ishpeming, Michigan, Industry (Cleveland Cliffs Iron Company); Melvin Nyquist, Marquette, Michigan, M.S.U. Extension Service; Frank W. Mead, Marquette, Michigan, Marquette-Alger Intermediate School Dist.

He further noted that there were four highway fatalities on U.S. 41 west of Ishpeming recently. Moved by Sup. C. Anderson, supported by Sup. Krook and unanimously carried that the Chairman be authorized to meet with Mr. Claude Tobin, State Highway Commissioner, to urge the construction of 4 lane highways on U.S. 41 south of Marquette and west of Ishpeming without delay and that he work with local city officials and Chambers of Commerce in the matter.

A resolution to the Board from the Northern Michigan Sportsmens Association was read urging the closing of antlerless deer seasons in Marquette County until the deer population has been increased. Moved by Sup. Linjala, supported by Sup. Morrison and unanimously carried that the Board concur with the resolution and direct a copy of same to all State Representatives from the Upper Peninsula. Mr. Roland Juchemich, Jr., President of the Northern Michigan Sportsmens Association then addressed the Board briefly to urge support for a ban on the hunting of antlerless deer.

Memorandum from J. R. Acocks, M.D., Superintendent of Morgan Heights Sanatorium, was read submitting copies of two recent news releases from The Week for Hospitals, a publication of the American Hospital Association, indicating the freeze on reimbursement to hospitals under the Medicaid program in Massachusetts and in New York State were unconstitutional and the states ordered to adjust same to a "reasonable cost" basis so as to conform with Federal regulations.
