PRESIDENT'S POWER GREAT AS MONARCHS'

Senator Bristow Sees Peril in Tremendous Possibilities of Executive Action.

Washington, Dec. 22.—There is on the statute books a mandatory law providing for the manner by which trusts and monopolistic combines violating the anti-trust law shall be proceeded against. The settlement of the case against the telegraph and telephone combine out of court by the attorney general last week has centered attention upon the possibilities that may result from placing such an enormous power in the hands of one man. In certain quarters the legality of such private arrangements is questioned. One view is that it is questionable use of a very questionable authority that may lead to abuses and a weakening of the federal courts. Democrats are afraid to discuss this just as they are timid about criticizing acts of the administration. Privately many agree that violation of law ought to be prosecuted before the courts and violators compelled to pay whatever penalty or suffer whatever punishment the courts may prescribe.

Senator Bristow of Kansas said: "The policy of the president in dealing with big business, as shown in the negotiations with the telephones and telegraph trust, opens the door to the widest opportunity for the grossest scandals and if followed out, in time will bring the country to a state of revolution. To permit one man to supervise the gigantic corporate influences of this country as a matter of executive order independent of the law, is a most amazing proposition."

"The currency bill, just passed, places a tremendous power in the hands of the secretary of the treasury, equally as great over the banks and currency interests of the country as that assumed by the attorney general over the industrial and telephone business of the country."

"The executive is acquiring and assuming power as great as that ever assumed by any European monarch not excepting Louis XIV or Napoleon I. When the people realize its tremendous possibilities there will be a revolt, sweeping and decisive."

George Rodel, the Boer heavyweight, outboxed Jim Flynn, the Pueblo fireman, in another ten-round contest. Rodel had the better of every round except the ninth.

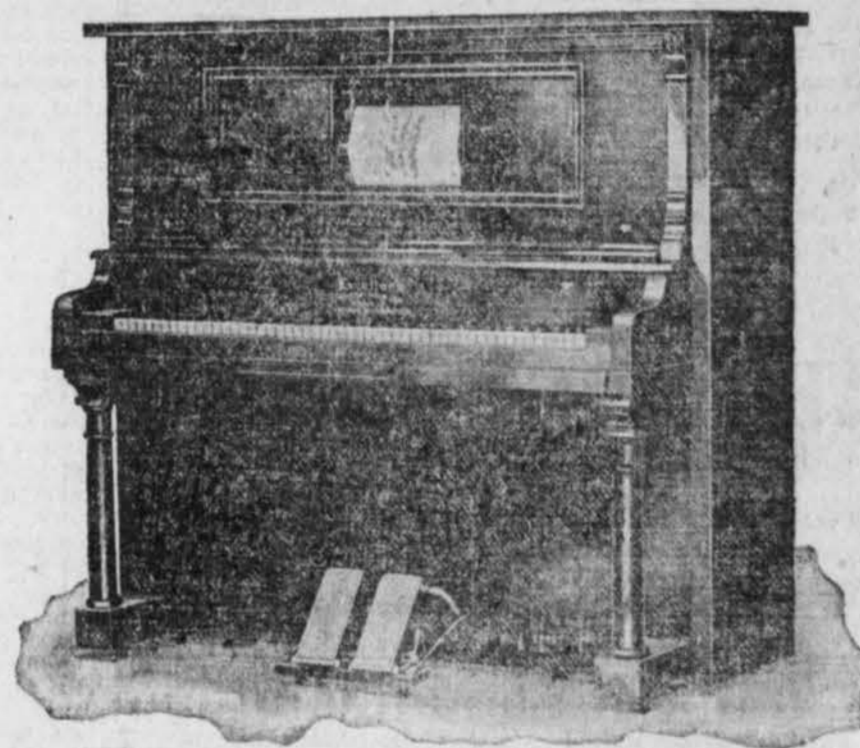

JONES & LAUGHLINS ACTIVE IN ORE HUNT

Independent Steel Concern Will Greatly Increase Its Output Next Year.

The Jones & Laughlins interests are aggressive operators on the Mesaba and Cuyuna ranges. They are to develop the Columbia mine, within the city limits of Virginia, as an open pit producer. Stripping operations will be started in the spring, and will require two years. The Columbia contains no less than 5,000,000 tons of ore, it is estimated. The company will have one of the biggest producers on the Cuyuna range in the property of which Thomas Feigh of Duluth, owns the fee. On his return from a recent inspection of the property, Captain Thomas Walters, general manager of the Jones & Laughlins mining department, informed The Mining Journal that the hydraulic process of removing the overburden might be used at the Feigh property. A press dispatch says: "It is believed the Jones & Laughlin company will open several mines in the Grand Rapids country. The work in progress now is of a preliminary nature. Much interest attaches to the innovation of employing a hydraulic dredge or excavator in removing overburden. The process has been thoroughly tested within recent weeks, and so far as can now

be judged it appears the method is wholly practical. The dredge—named the John B. in honor of John Beckwith of Grand Rapids, discoverer of much of the ore in the region—is designed to remove the overburden by washing it away. A grinder at the front of the barge is revolved by twin Corliss engines and as the detached refuse drops down it is taken up by powerful suction pumps and forced through conveyor pipes to any required distance. These pipes are laid along pontoons which may be swung into any position on the stream along which the work is being done, enabling the residue to be deposited as far from the scene of actual operation as may be necessary. The process was submitted to a particularly severe test when the discharge end of the conveyor pipe was placed at an elevation of sixty feet from the intake and the flow obstructed by two right angles and two angles of 45 degrees. The pumps forced the sand and dirt through the lines satisfactorily. It is considered as a result of this experiment that there will be no trouble in removing the entire overburden, although it will be necessary in some places to go down to a depth of 100 feet."
