Mayor Begole will, it is understood, appoint a health officer, and the commission will define the conditions under which the work will be carried on in the future As reported, a "full time" health officer, at a salary of \$2,000 a year, will be named. His duties will include school inspection and general supervision of the sanitary condition of the city.

It is possible that an ordinance will be adopted making the garbage collector the officer who will have charge of the collection of the dog tax. This work has heretofore fallen on the police officers, and it has been practically impossible for them to attend to it properly without giving it too much of their time. It would be looked after by the garbage collector in an effective manner in connection with his other duties.
