BRAASTAD ADVOCATES PUBLIC SCALES YOUNG TEACHERS MUST HAVE TRAINING

Ishpeming Merchant Thinks City Council Should Establish One Without Delay. Superintendent of Public Instruction Keeler Quotes New Provision of the Law.

"I think it is time the city authorities provided a public scale," said E. Braastad yesterday. "Most of the farmers have been using my scales for many years past, and while I am glad to have them use it, I feel that a public scale is needed, as practically all of the grain, vegetables, fuel, etc., is now sold upon the weights of the dealers, farmers, and other vendors."

"I believe a public scale would more than pay for its maintenance, and think that an ordinance should be passed providing for the weighing of all such articles as I have mentioned on scales supervised by a man paid by the city, whose duty it shall be to see that the weights are what they are represented to be. A statement of the weight of the load should be given the purchaser on delivery."

"I have talked with a number of the farmers about a public scale and they all want it. At present there is no supervision of weights and if a farmer or dealer is inclined to short-weight a customer there is no way to prevent him from doing it."

"I think the money necessary to establish a scale and provide a supervisor could be spent to better advantage than it is in inspection of scales and measures in the retail stores. It has been my custom during the years I have been in business to test the scales in my grocery store and meat market at least once a week and I have no objection to a county or state official going over my weights and measures as often as they please. But I think the public would be most benefited by checking the weights of load stuffs."

"I have talked with some of the city officials about the establishment of a public scale and they favor it. The number of farmers doing business with the merchants and others in the city is increasing right along and during the fall and spring seasons there is almost constant use for a scale."

FELL FROM SWINGING BRIDGE.

Hundreds of persons on outings near the Cleveland-Cliffs Iron company's swinging bridge north of Deer Lake Sunday saw a thrilling incident. Two men and a girl were crossing the bridge, when it turned over. One of the men was precipitated into the water. He was exhausted by the time rescuers in a boat reached him. Persons crossing the bridge do so at their own risk, as it turns over easily. Notices signed by the Cleveland-Cliffs company are posted at either end, warning people to not attempt the crossing.

GERMAN PHOTOGRAPHIC RECORD IS COMPLETE.

Berlin, May 29.—(Correspondence of the Associated Press.)—No history that ever will be written about the great world war now raging will be quite as complete and striking as the huge collection of photographs, bearing on every conceivable phase of the conflict, that is being made by the general staff of the German army.

Already more than 20,000 reproductions that range from soldiers in the trenches to wounded men in the hospitals have been gathered together and filed away for present or future reference. The collection is constantly growing, and requires a staff of men to keep in order and supervise.

This pictorial record of the war is finer because the government is able, through the rules which it lays down for all photographers who go to the front, to secure a copy of every picture that is made by amateurs or professionals. The general staff, therefore, has been able to pick and choose for its own gallery the cream of everything pictorial that concerns the war, and has acquired not only accurate and interesting representations, but photographs that in a great many cases are artistic in the extreme.
