MORGAN'S WIFE TRIED BRAVELY TO STOP HOLT

Glen Cove, N. Y., July 5.—Frank Holt, the university professor, who shot J. P. Morgan, declared today that when he is arraigned on Wednesday he will tell the story of his actions...

Mr. Morgan, who was shot twice by Holt last Saturday at his home near here, continued to improve today, so much so that specialists in attendance announced he was out of danger.

The favorable turn in the condition of Mr. Morgan, was in marked contrast to that of Holt, the financier's assailant.

Some Think Holt Is Muentzer. Holt helped today to discount the theory that he might be Erich Muentzer, the Harvard professor who disappeared in 1906 after his wife had died.

Word was received at the jail tonight that tomorrow morning an officer is expected to arrive from Cambridge, Mass., who could possibly identify Muentzer.

Over 450 Men Worked for City at One Time or Another During the Month.
