

WEATHER YESTERDAY BROKE LONG RECORD

First Snow Storm for May 23 in Twenty-Three Years—Boats Still Fast in Ice.

For the first time in twenty-three years, and only the third time since the establishment of the weather bureau here forty-six years ago, Marquette has been visited by a snow storm as late as May 23.

On May 24, 1894, snow fell to a depth of 11.3 inches, and for three days, May 23, 24 and 25, 1893, a snow storm swept this region.

Yesterday's storm was accompanied by a strong northwest wind, blowing at the rate of about twenty-five miles an hour.

Early yesterday morning a wind velocity of forty-four miles an hour was recorded for the region over Whitefish Bay.

Tugs Still Stuck. The fish tugs Theora and Columbia are still stuck fast in the ice, in the same position in which they were first reported.

Some of the members of the crews of the fish tugs, who Tuesday made the trip to shore, over the ice, in order that the men remaining on board might have mors food, will attempt a return trip with provisions today.

The fact that no south wind has blown up for several weeks, or since the steamer Munising first became jammed in the windrowed ice off Presque Isle.

Yesterday was a big day at the local recruiting office. Nine Marquette young men left last night for Escanaba to take their final examinations for various branches of the U. S. army.

It was the biggest day the recruiting officers have had for several weeks, and they accept it as an indication that enlistments will rapidly increase from now on.

No Married Men. "It must be definitely understood," said one of the officers yesterday, "that until we receive orders to that effect we are not allowed to enlist married men, young or old."
