

### Local students earn awards

-- Alma College has recognized the academic achievements of its returning tuthents for the fall of 1993 with scholarship awards to-taling more than 53.1 million. More than 60 percents of the ap-proximately 850 upperclassmen will receive these merit-based scholarships, recognizing out-standing academic achievement. In total, Alma College gives 556 million in merit-based and need-based awards to its student body of about 1,300.






