At home with Sarah

Happy Thanksgiving

Does your family enjoy chicken or turkey pot pie? This is a very good dish to serve after Thanksgiving that kids especially like. This recipe is different because you do not bake them as pies (just the crust) and they remind me of the pot pies that I have eaten in some very nice restaurants. Often when we think of pot pies it just isn't worth the extra work, but this recipe is easy and the meal is ready quickly. It is also a great way to use up some of that left over turkey.

CHICKEN OR TURKEY POT PIE

Pastry for 2-crust pie

1/2 cup chopped onion
6 tbl. butter or margarine
1/2 cup flour
3 cups chicken broth (you can use up some of your gravy, also)
3 cups cubed cooked chicken or turkey
1 (10 oz) pkg. frozen peas and carrots, cooked and drained
1/4 cup chopped canned pimiento

Prepare pastry according to directions. Roll out on lightly floured surface, 1/4 inch thick. Cut to fit tops of six individual casseroles. Bake on ungreased cookie sheet at 450 degrees for 10 minutes. Careful - not too brown. Meanwhile, cook onion in butter till tender, but not brown. Blend in flour and 1 teas. salt. Add broth all at once. Cook and stir till thick and bubbly. Add remaining ingredients. Heat till bubbling. Pour into 6 heated individual casseroles. Place pastry on top filling just before serving. Serves 6.

Sarah says . . . Christmas is coming and most people have lots of candles in their homes during this season. Use them - enjoy them. Now fancy candles get "shop worn" when used as a center piece so won't stay new looking, anyway. Candles act as a deodorizer in a room full of people, especially if there is smoking. Put your candle in the freezer for one hour before lighting it and it will not drip.

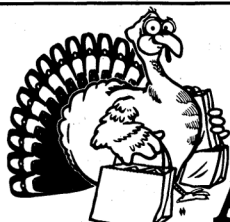

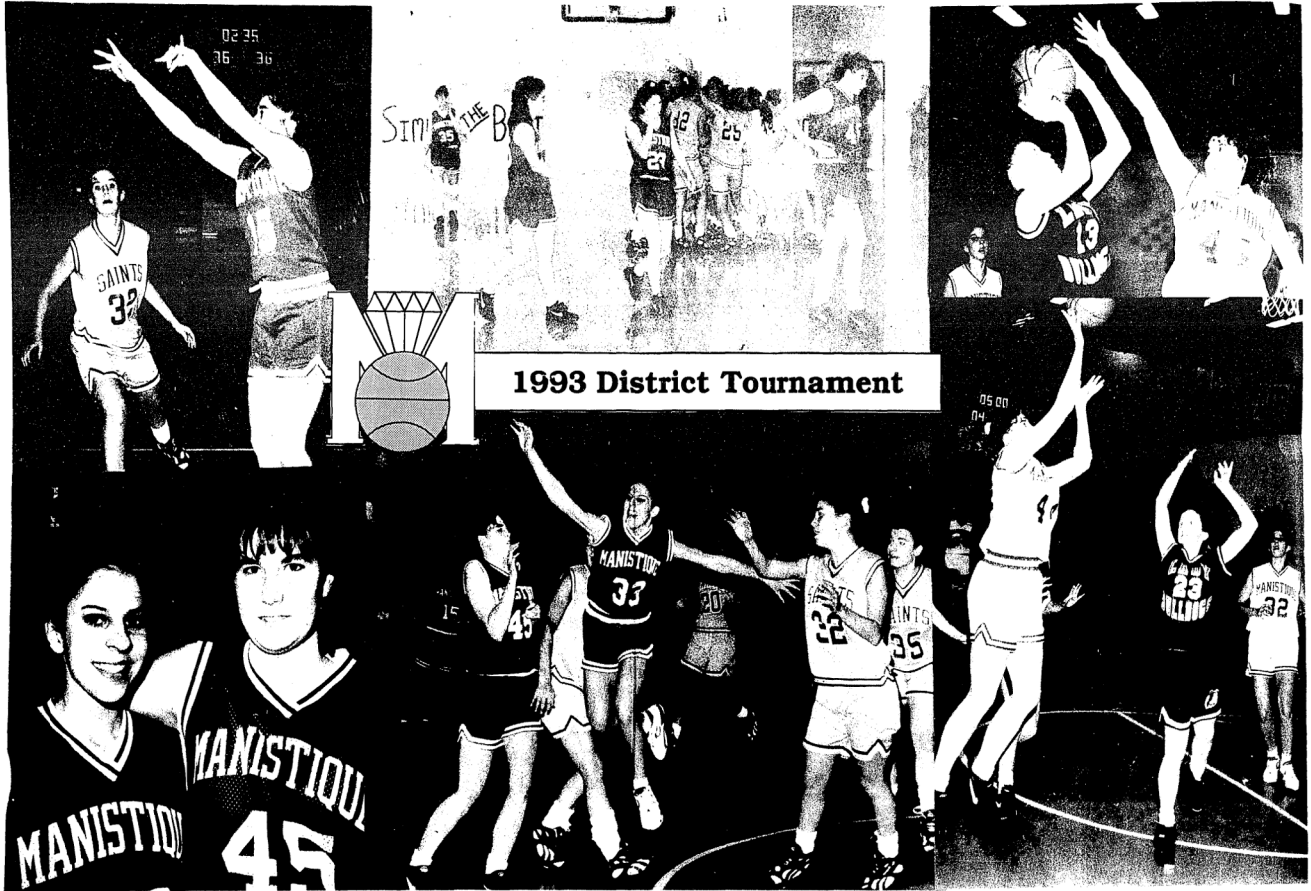

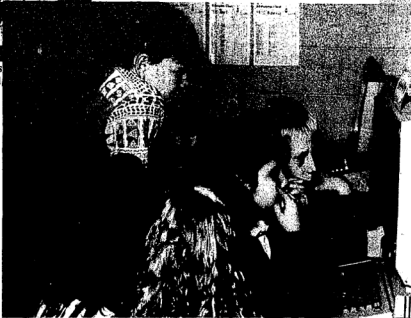
