**W. FRANK KNOX
TO LEAVE SOO**

W. Knox, editor of the Soo News the past several years, one of the best known newspaper men in the upper peninsula and who has played a prominent part in politics in Michigan the past four years, having been until recently chairman of the Republican state central committee, is to leave the Soo. With Otto Muehling, who has been the business manager of the Soo company, he will go to Manchester, N. H., where they will undertake the publication of a newspaper which will be the organ of the Progressive party in New Hampshire. The newspaper will have the support of Governor Bass, who recently declared himself a Progressive, and of Winston Churchill, the novelist, who will be the Progressive candidate for governor in New Hampshire in the coming election.

The interests that Messrs. Knox and Muehling have held in the Soo News have been purchased by Governor Osborn, who has also been a part owner of the paper, and the management of the business, as well as the direction of the editorial policy of the paper, will be in the hands of George A. Osborn, the governor's son. Mr. Osborn is well known in the upper peninsula particularly in Marquette and Houghton counties. He is a young man of ability and attractive personality, who has had considerable newspaper experience, he having conducted the News during the extended absence of Mr. Knox of late months.

Has Had Lively Career.

Mr. Knox, whose departure will be regretted by many loyal friends throughout the state as well as chortled over by a circle of very enthusiastic enemies, has led a lively existence the past few years, his political activities having been so strenuous that they would have daunted a man of less resolution and less physical capacity to endure hard work and fatigue.

Beginning with Governor Warner's third term candidacy and culminating with what the Progressives are wont to call "The Crime of the Century," at Chicago in June, Knox's political gait became faster and still faster. In the Osborn campaign he beat over Michigan mile by mile; in the Roosevelt campaign he covered the country state by state. Knox hates to think of the tens of thousands of miles he has traveled on political missions, or of the tens of thousands of political conferences he has held.

He participated in the Warner campaign as a publicity agent. He was head of a "primary reform league" and his indefatigable work did much to pull Warner through by his narrow margin. Warner was no more than encoined in office than Knox began to look ahead to the campaign of 1910, and he devoted much of his effort to giving form to the rising sentiment for Osborn. When the time was ripe he assumed active charge of the Osborn campaign, and developed great skill as an organizer. The campaign for Osborn is generally credited with having been one of the best set up that has been seen in the state in many years, and for this Knox was largely to be thanked.

That letter to Shields, Knox will probably be longer remembered in Michigan for that letter-to-Shields than for any other one thing, and it is probable that the importance of the letter-to-Shields incident has never been correctly estimated.
