IF INCLINED TO STOUTNESS

Some Matters That the Not-Too-Slender Woman Will Do Well to Keep in Mind.

In the fashion department of the Woman's Home Companion appears the following "dress don't" for women:

"Don't be inveigled into wearing the too-short skirt; three inches from the floor is a good conservative length.

"Don't adhere too strictly to fashion's latest whims--pass the choker collar, for instance.

"Don't let the smart deep-yoked skirt tempt you if it's the slender hip you want.

"Don't set your heart on having one of your summer dresses of the rough-surface tussah silks that come in the fascinating sand and ecru shades. These fabrics and these shades are not for you.

"Don't adopt the long tight sleeve, even if it is the mode of the moment. The tight transparent sleeve brings out too prominently the shape of a big fat arm. The sausage effect should be avoided.

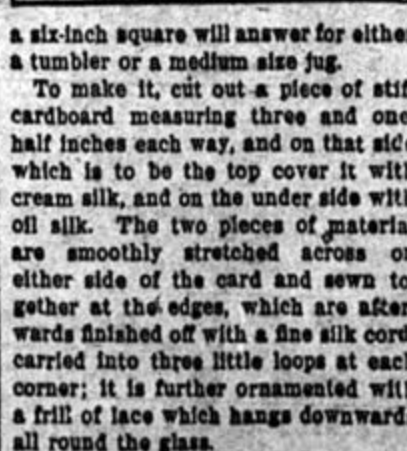
"Don't allow yourself to take kindly to the "bobbed" hair dressing; the forehead band; the too tight coiffure, and the too small hat. It will be a sorry day for you if you allow yourself to be tempted."

PROTECTION FROM THE FLIES

Covers for Glasses May Be Said to Be Almost Indispensable During the Hot Weather.

During the summer, or at any time when there are flies about, glasses or jugs containing milk, barley water, lemonade, etc., should always be protected by some light cover, preferably one that is washable. In the sick room especially are these needed.

The one shown in the illustration is just a square of soft muslin edged with a fringe of crochet cotton on which beads are threaded to weight it, or narrow all-bead fringe may be used;



a six-inch square will answer for either a tumbler or a medium size jug. To make it, cut out a piece of stiff cardboard measuring three and one-half inches each way, and on that side which is to be the top cover it with cream silk, and on the under side with oil silk. The two pieces of material are smoothly stretched across on either side of the card and sewn together at the edges, which are afterwards finished off with a fine silk cord carried into three little loops at each corner; it is further ornamented with a fringe of lace which hangs downwards all round the glass.

For lifting the cover, an ornamental button is sewn in the center at the top. The object of the oil silk on the under side is that it can be easily wiped if it is used on a tumbler containing a warm liquid, and also it will help to keep the heat from escaping.

Beaming Collars. The wide collar of organdie is most becoming; it can be worn with almost any plain dress and adds distinction.

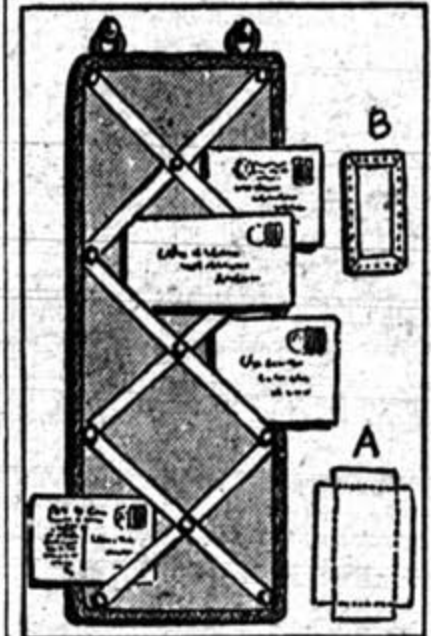

MOST USEFUL LETTER BOARD

Simple Contrivance of Especial Service Where There Are Many Members of the Household.

Our sketch shows a useful article to prepare for hanging upon the wall at some convenient spot in the hall of a boarding house, or where there are many members in a family.

It is quite easy to make. For its construction, in the first place a piece of thin board measuring 18 inches in length and 8 inches in width will be



required. This board is covered with pale green casement cloth, the material being turned over at the edges and fastened on at the back with tacks.

Diagram A shows the shape in which the casement cloth should be cut out, the space enclosed by the dotted lines corresponding in size with the surface of the board. Diagram B shows the back with the four flaps folded over and tacked down. Across the front of the board bands of broad white elastic are fastened on with small brass-headed nails, the nails being inserted at each end of each band and also at the points where the bands cross each other.

The rack is finished off at the edges with a dark green cord, and for suspending it from nails in the wall two ordinary picture rings are screwed in to the upper edge.
