KANSAS I. W. W. TRIAL BEGINS

Government Will Show How "Wobblies" Worked With Bolsheviks.

Wichita, March 12.—The trial of 32 Industrial Workers of the World, charged with violation of the espionage act began in federal court here today, is expected to establish that close relations existed between the Reds of Russia and radicals of America.

Most of the time was consumed today in selecting a jury. Tonight six veniremen had been selected. It is not likely testimony can be started before Friday.

When the trial opened 100 witnesses were ready to be heard and thousands

of pages of documentary evidence was ready to be placed before the jury. Ten days at least will be required to complete the case, according to court attaches.

Part of Great Plot.
In presenting the indictment, Fred Robertson, federal prosecutor, said the government would show a gigantic plot was fomented to overthrow the government of the United States and this was but a link in a chain for a revolution.

"Collusion between the Soviets of Russia and radicals of the United States would be shown, he said.

"The plot, the government will show, was designed to topple the world," he said, "and its trail of intended destruction was to lead from Seattle to the Atlantic. Strikes and sabotage were the twin cudgels the I. W. W. was to wield in the war against organized society."

The Defense's Case.
The government will be able to show that 10,000 radicals went from America to Russia during Kerensky's year to aid Lenin and Trotsky and set up Bolshevik reign of terror, he said.

What Is Status of Famous Kiel Canal?

Paris, March 12.—What will be the future status of the Kiel canal which constituted the keyhole to the German naval base?

On Monday the "Council of Ten," which is the new name for the five great powers having two delegates in the session, referred the matter to the waterways committee, which yesterday reported its decision.

Its recommendations are secret but Le Temps which is usually well informed say the American commissioners objected to the appropriation of the canal as too drastic.

The paper admits Heligoland should revert to the British. It is regarded as unfeasible to extend the Danish frontier as far south as the Kiel canal as was previously proposed.

Moreover, the Danes do not want the German population in Danish territory but ask only that the Danish population be returned to them.

On the other hand if Russia retains the shores of the canal, she will be in a position to close every access to the Baltic as she did in 1914, it is pointed out.

Women Street Car Pilots Get Hearing

Washington, March 12.—The long deferred hearing on the right of women street car conductors of Cleveland to retain their jobs in spite of the street car men's opposition, will take place before the War Labor board tomorrow afternoon.

Mrs. Laura Prince and Miss Rose Morrissey of Cleveland, representatives of the woman conductors' association arrived here tonight.

Frank E. Walsh will appear as attorney for the women and Dr. Anna Howard Shaw, honorary president of the American Equal Suffrage association will be one of the witnesses.

In a similar case of woman conductors, at Detroit, Chairman Taft of the National War Labor board a few weeks ago handed down a decision that the company had a right to retain the women it had employed.
