Psychologists Urge Way to Reduce Accidents.

When the roads become clogged with traffic and there is no more joy in driving an automobile, motorists may prepare for the weeding out process.

Thought of applying psychology tests to motorists has arisen from the realization that automobile accidents have been mounting without precedent.

"Applied psychology," says Dr. William A. McKeever of Chicago, "would do more in a minute to prevent accidents than legislation and criminal prosecution will do in an hour."
