Published by the Organization of North American Students of Northern Michigan University in Marquette, the paper goes to thousands of Indians throughout the United States and Canada, especially in the Great Lakes region.

Donations from readers help sustain the paper, but no fixed charge is made. To cut mounting printing costs, the students need some composing equipment so they can set up the paper themselves.

Particularly useful would be a used Headliner and discs, and a set of Friden composing machines--and some supplies.

With the recent technological changes in the printing industry, these machines are no longer in great demand, but they would be of great help to us.
