On Friday morning last, in company with Mr. Bellot, we launched our raft craft, 10' x 12' x 14' on the Escanaba River, above the Smith Mine bridge, and proceeded to navigate that stream from that point to its mouth, about three miles above this village, a distance of about 60 miles.
