Not having the space to devote to the subject that we would like, we will briefly pass over the scenes on the coast, speaking only of D. Langley, Jr. & Co.'s Mill at Flat Rock, which on account of low water, is not work 'up to its full capacity.

this is a new country, and that this farm only a few years ago, was a dense forest, it seems almost impossible that it could have been so effectually cleared of stumps, stones and other debris in so short a time.

Mr. Oliver has taken great pains to procure the best of seeds, and does all work possible with machinery. Owen Jones a first-class practical farmer has charge of all the minor details of the place, and to him we are indebted for many courtesies, which will not soon be forgotten.

By our visit we were convinced of the fact, that farming will pay in this, as well as in any other country. As fine wheat has been raised here, as in the State of Minnesota, which is a noted wheat growing country, and the only obstacle that now prevents farmers of this region from cultivating that cereal, is the lack of mills to grind it, the freight being so high in all points where flouring mills are established, that it makes it an unprofitable venture to cultivate in comparison with oats and grass which find a ready market at a high price in a home market.

The product is only one third as costly as ordinary leather, which it resembles so nearly that they can be distinguished only by close inspection; and the vegetable leather has the additional advantage of being made in entire pieces fifty yards in length if desired, one and a half yards wide, of any thickness demanded, of uniform quality and simple strength. It has but little odor, that of the naptha being subdued in the process of manufacture. It is proof against the effect of moisture, and a nail will not scratch the surface. Far from being covering for writing desks and tables, etc. it is especially adapted and largely used.
